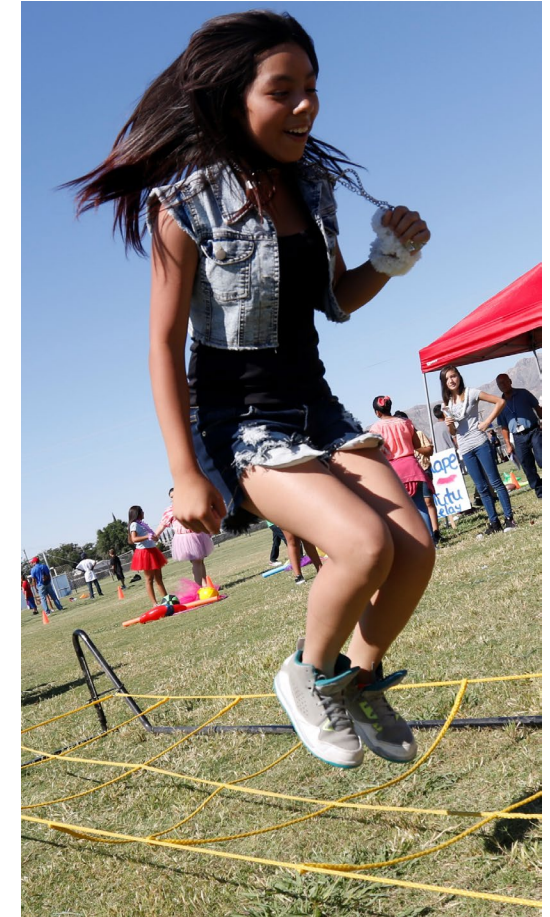
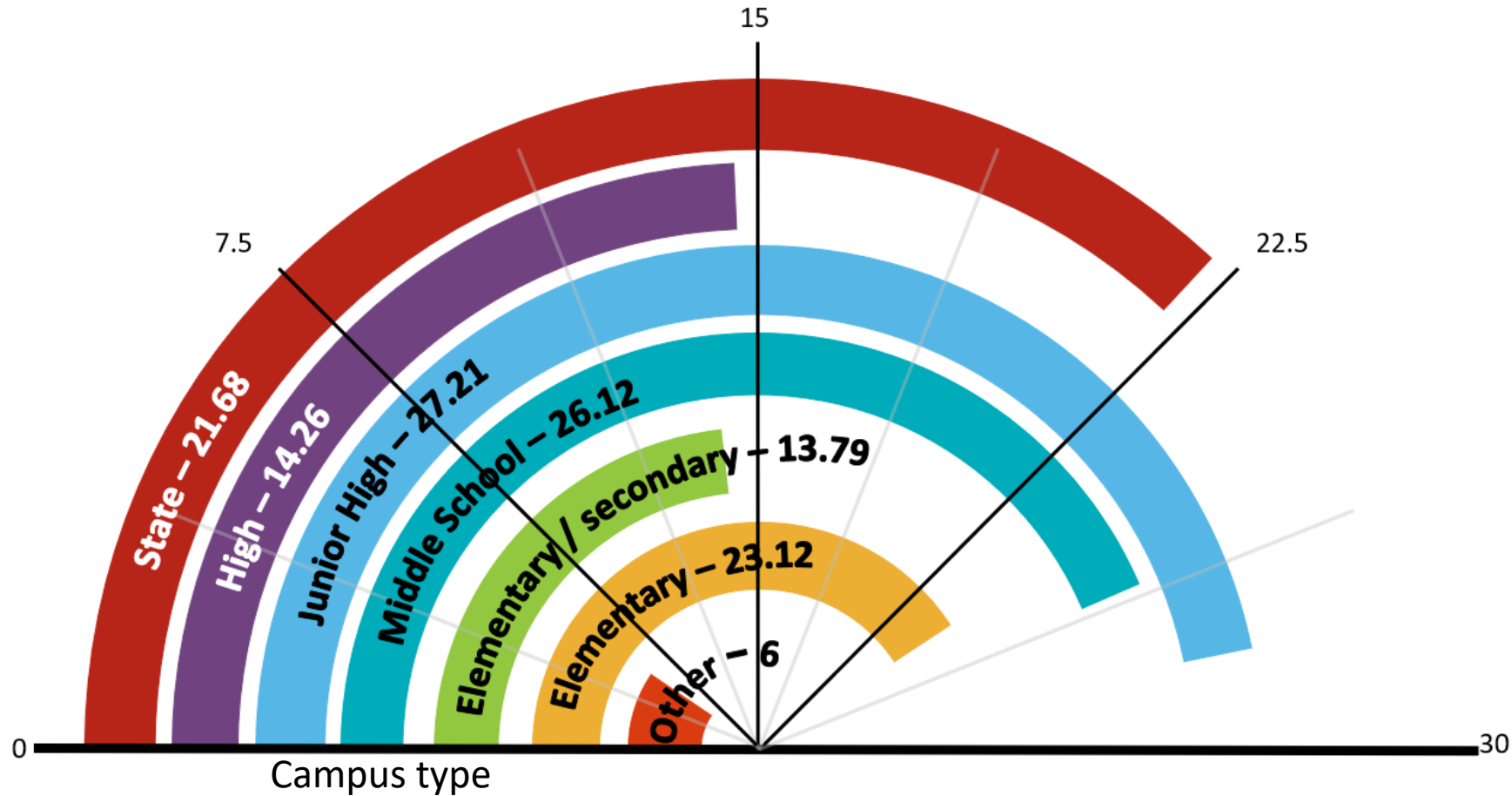
2018 – 2021 Physical Education Report Summary

Texas Education Code (TEC) §38.0141 requires the commissioner of education to complete a report on physical education provided by each school district and publish the report on the TEA website. The report must include the following:

- (1) The number of physical education classes offered at each campus in the district and the number of days, classes, and minutes offered each week by each campus;
- (2) The ratio of students enrolled in physical education classes compared to overall district enrollment;
- (3) The average physical education class size at each campus in the district;
- (4) The number of physical education teachers in the district who are licensed, certified, or endorsed by an accredited teacher preparation program to teach physical education;
- (5) Whether each campus in the district has the appropriate equipment and adequate facilities for students to engage in the amount and intensity of physical activity required by state law;
- (6) Whether the district allows modifications or accommodations to meet the needs of students with disabilities; and
- (7) Whether the district has a policy that allows teachers or administrators in the district to withhold physical activity from a student as punishment.

The number of the question appears in the upper right corner of the slide that answers this requirement.

Average number of P.E. classes offered in a week



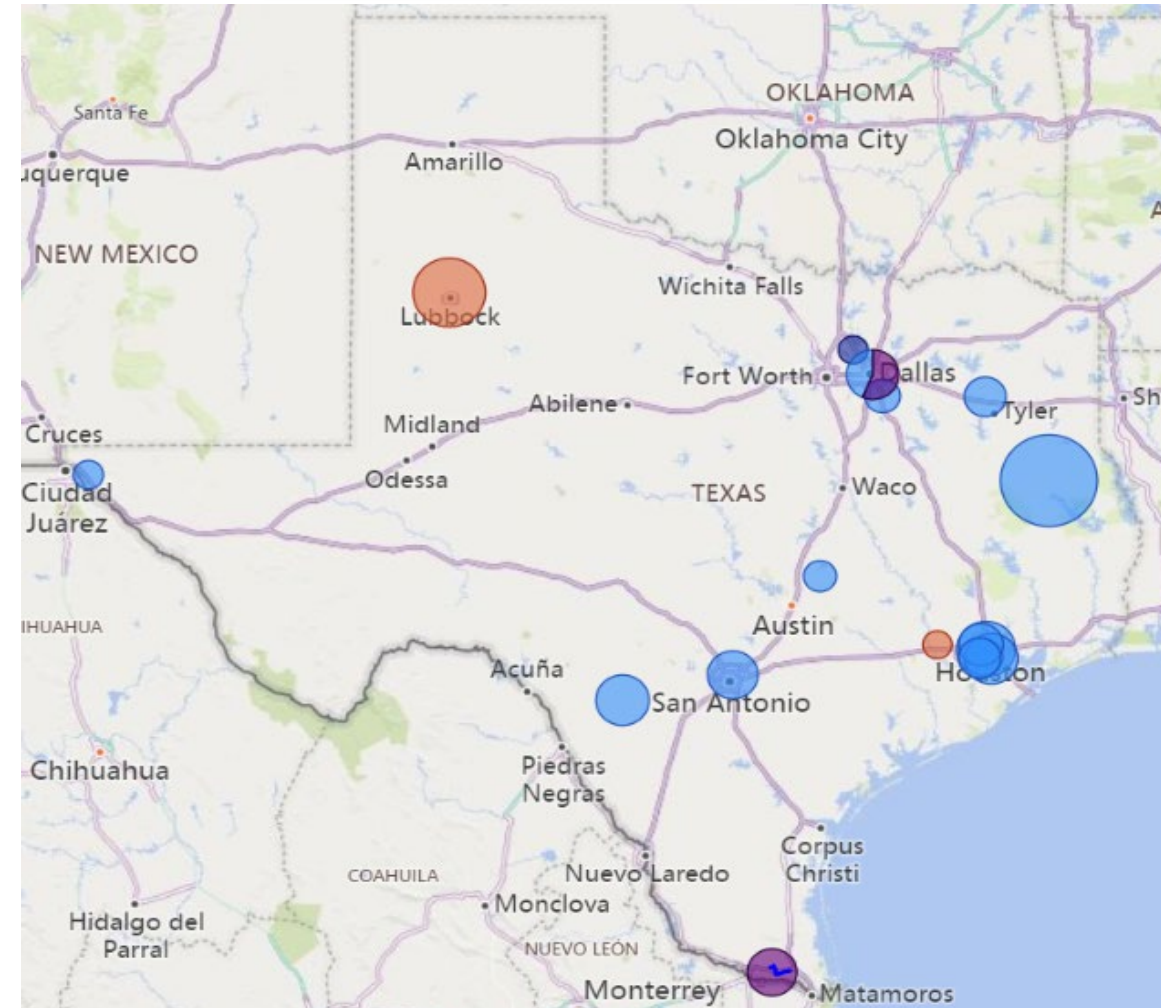

The average number of class days per week is indicated by the size of the circle.

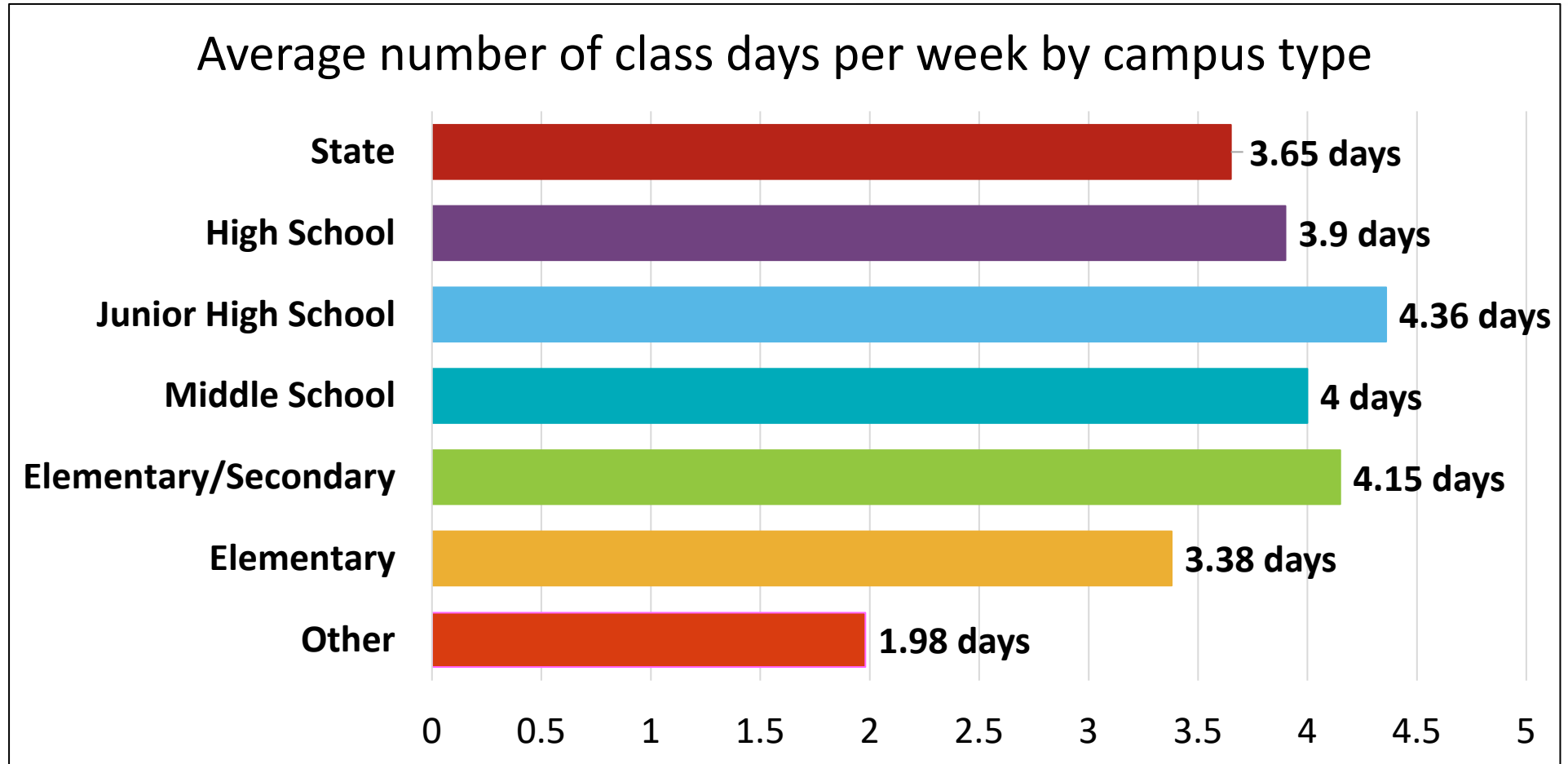

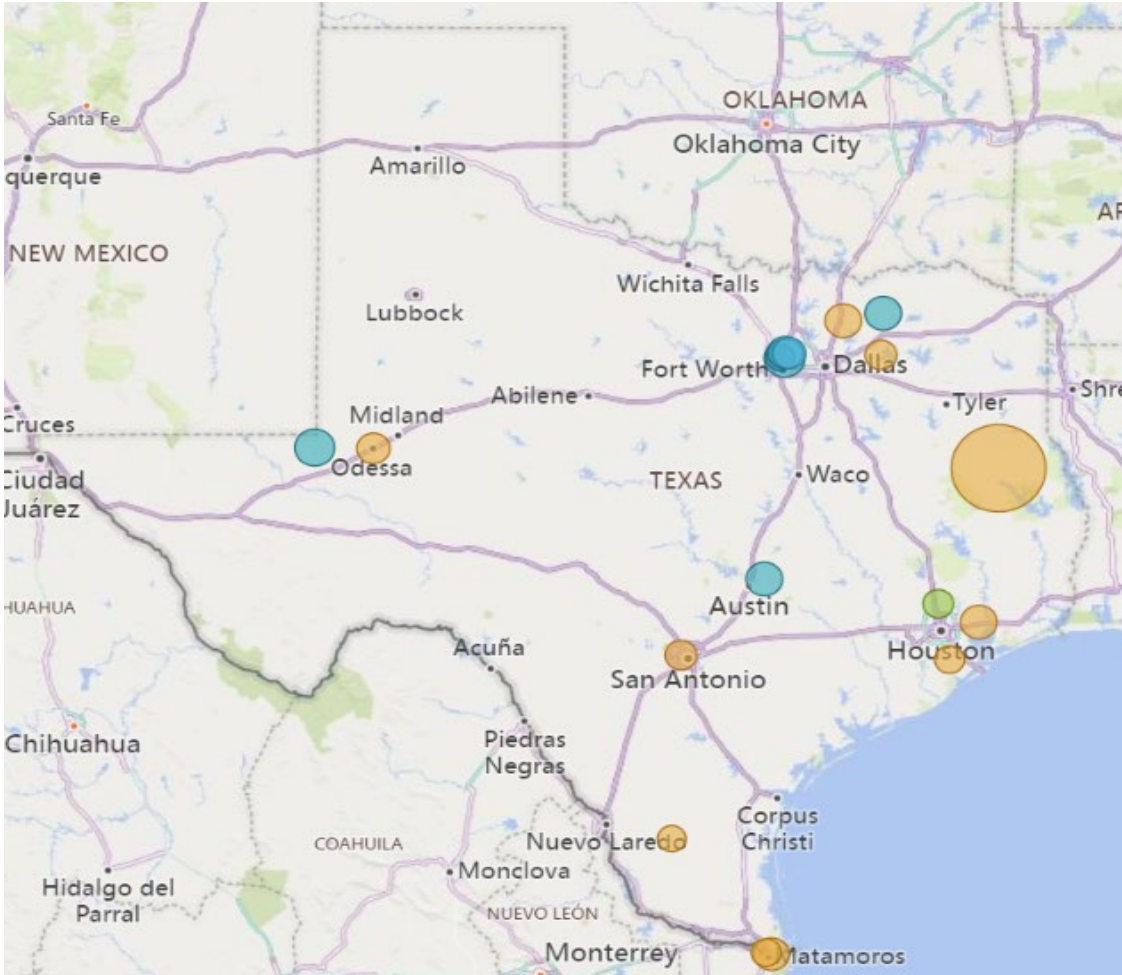

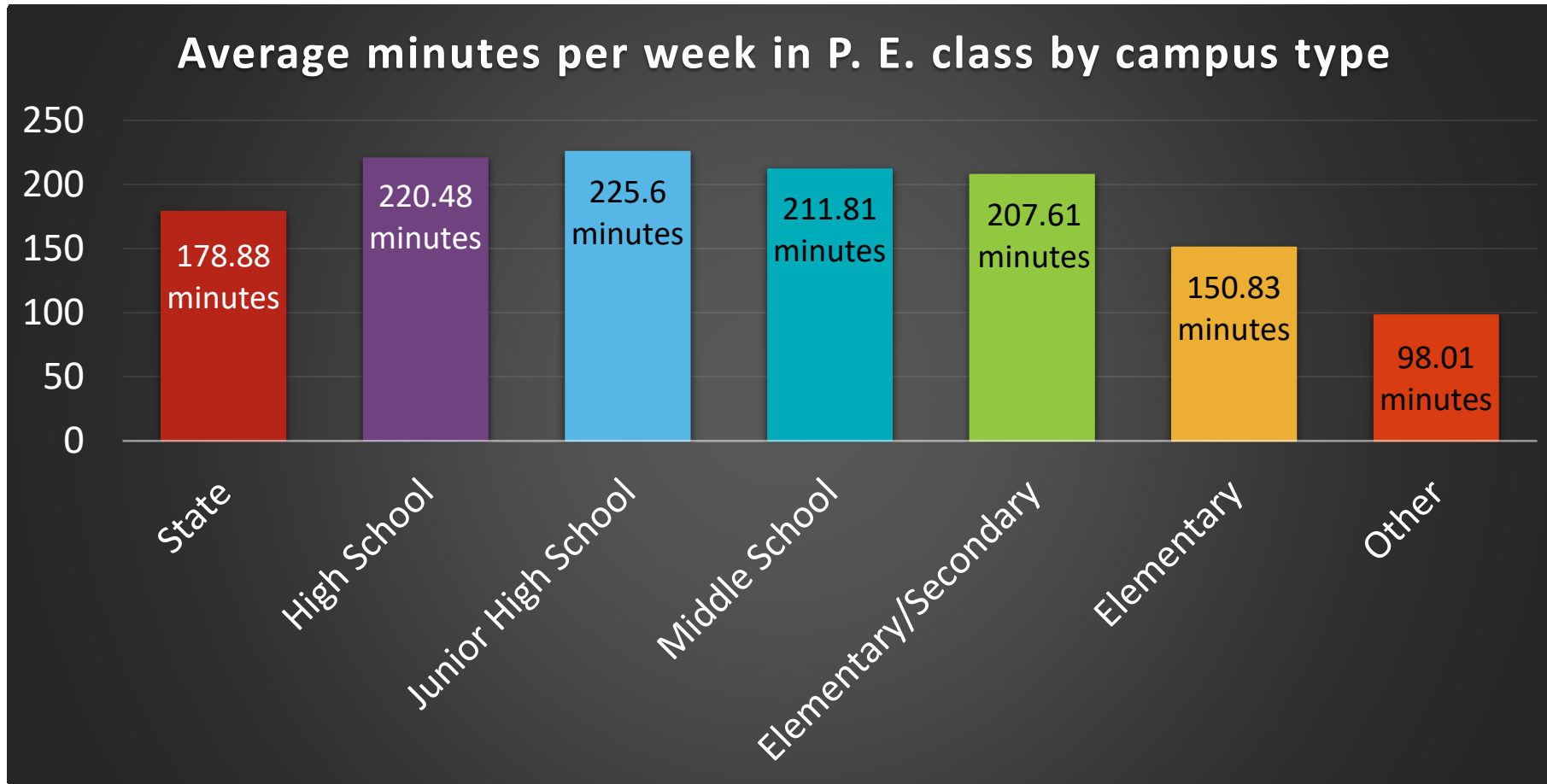
The average number of class days per week is indicated by the size of the circle.

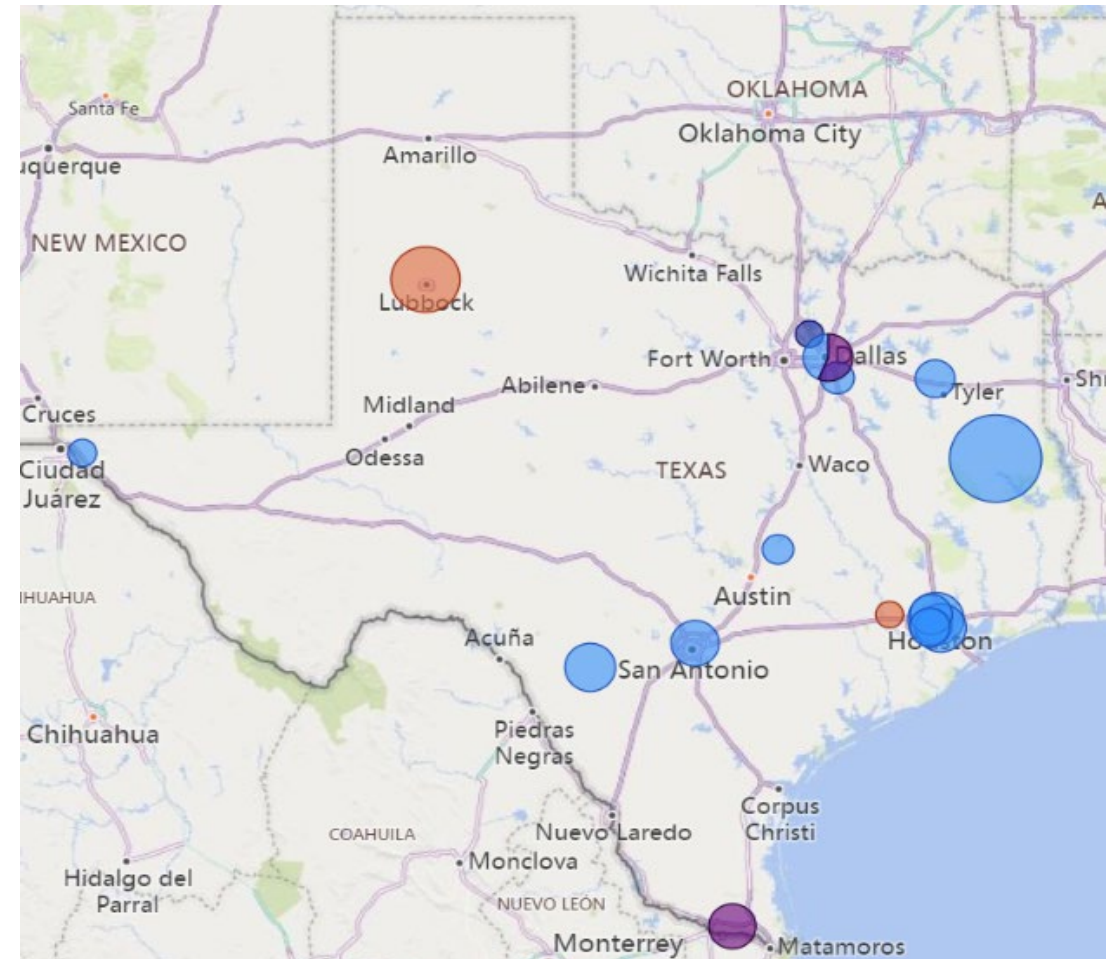

The average weekly number of minutes is indicated by the size of the circle.

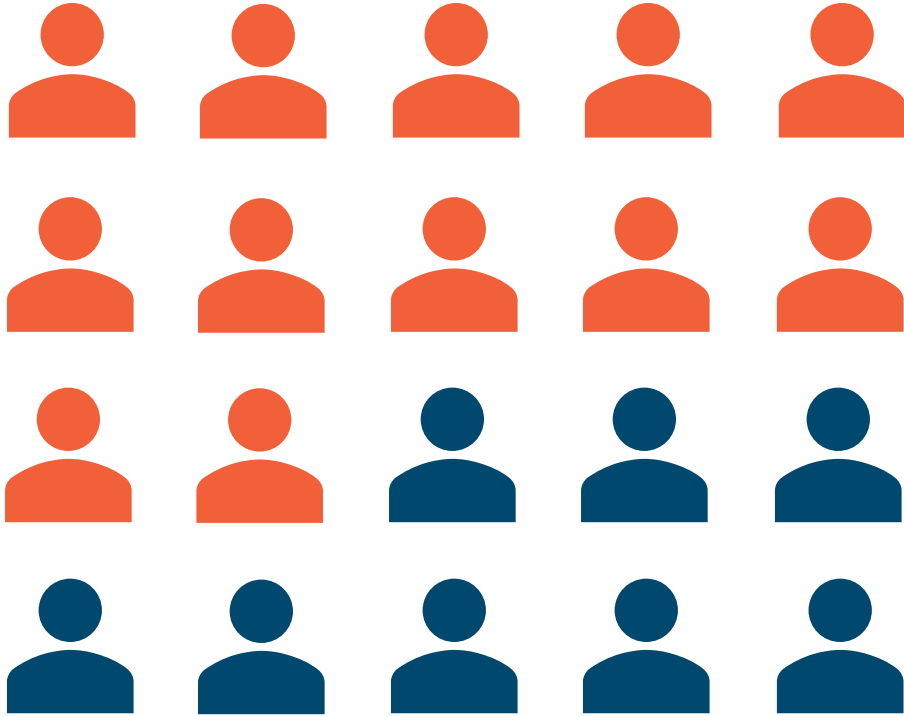
The color indicates school type:

The statewide ratio of students enrolled in district P. E. classes compared to overall district enrollment is **13** to 20



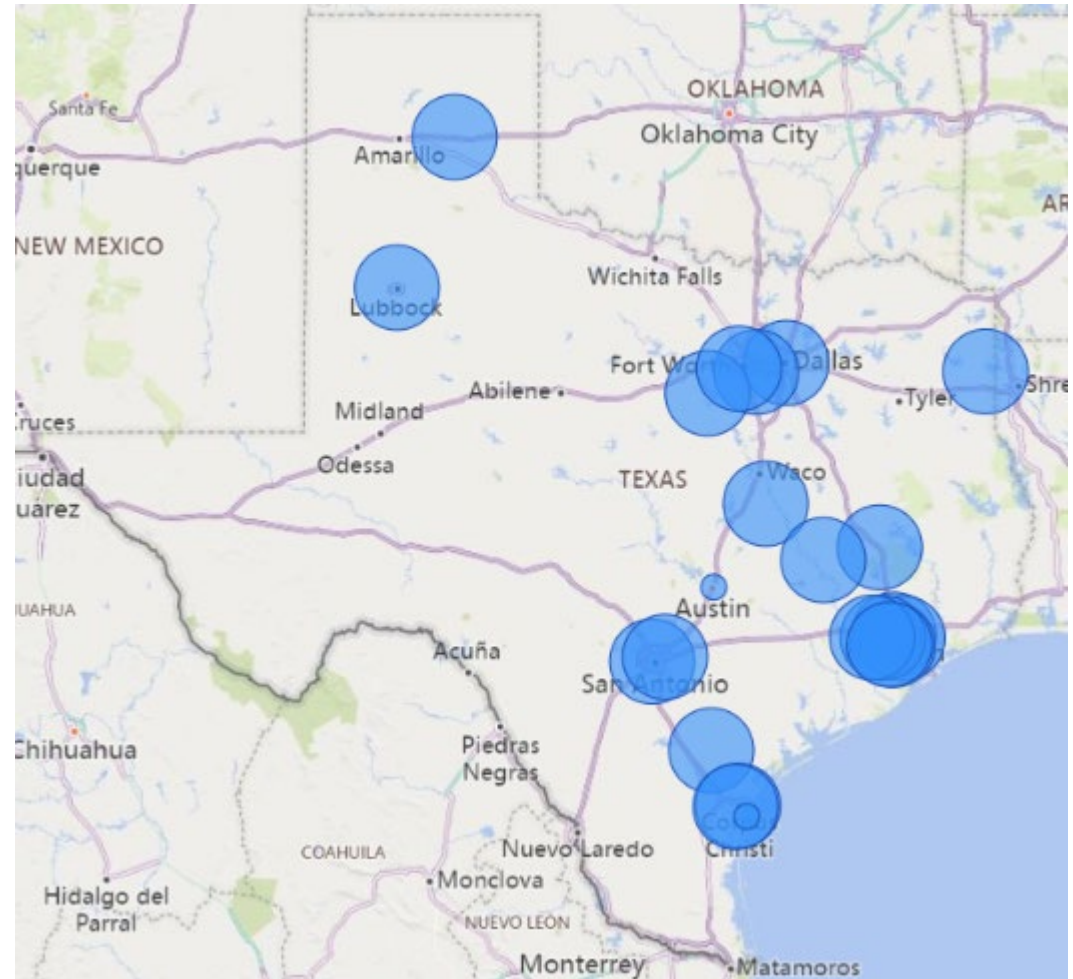

The larger the circle the larger the percentage of students in that district who are enrolled in physical education classes.

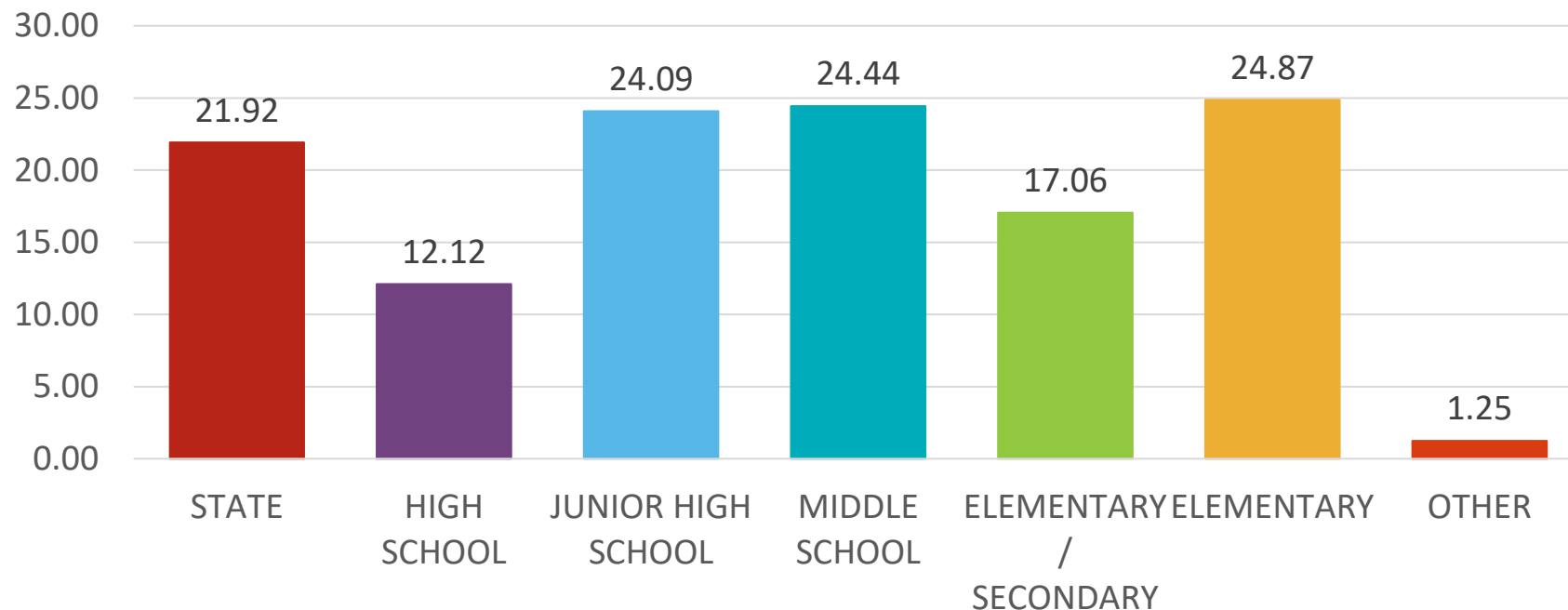

Notes: High school class sizes are often small because many high school students enroll in athletics or other P.E. substitutions to meet requirements.



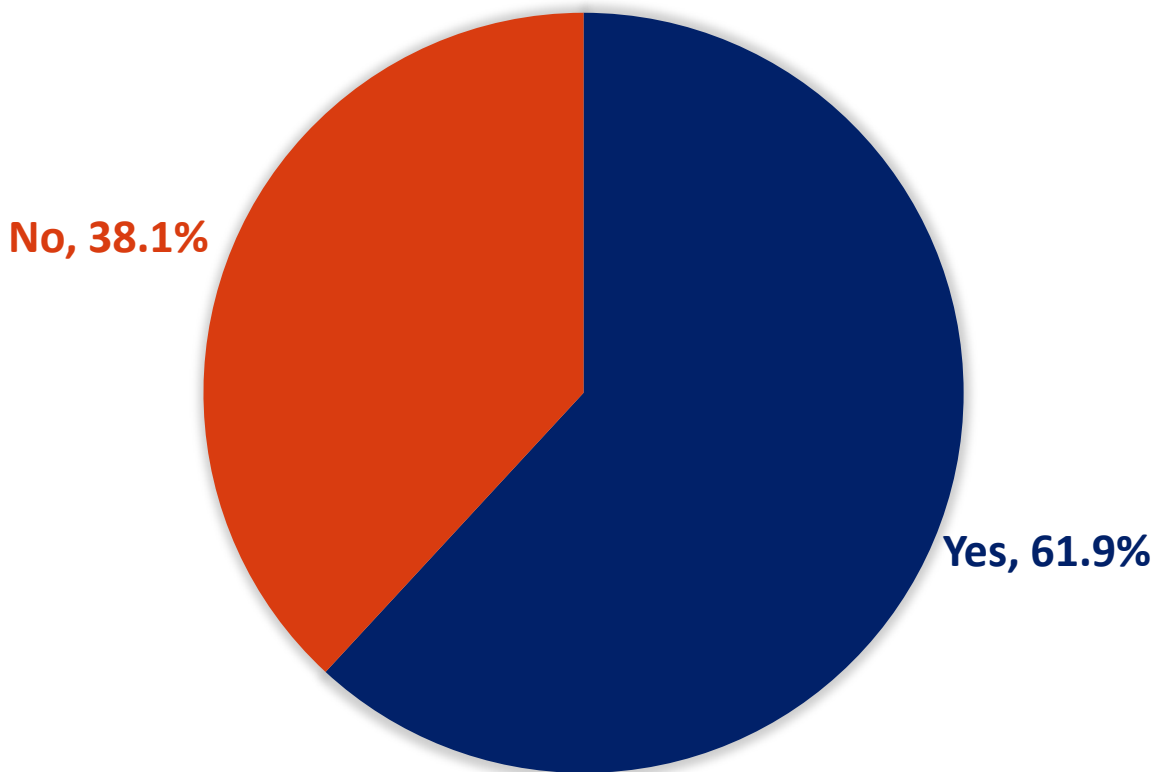
16,662 of 26,929 P. E. teachers, or 61.9%, have standard certifications.

A *standard certificate* is issued to an individual who has met all requirements for this class of certification.

P. E. TEACHER WITH STANDARD HEALTH/PE CERTIFICATE

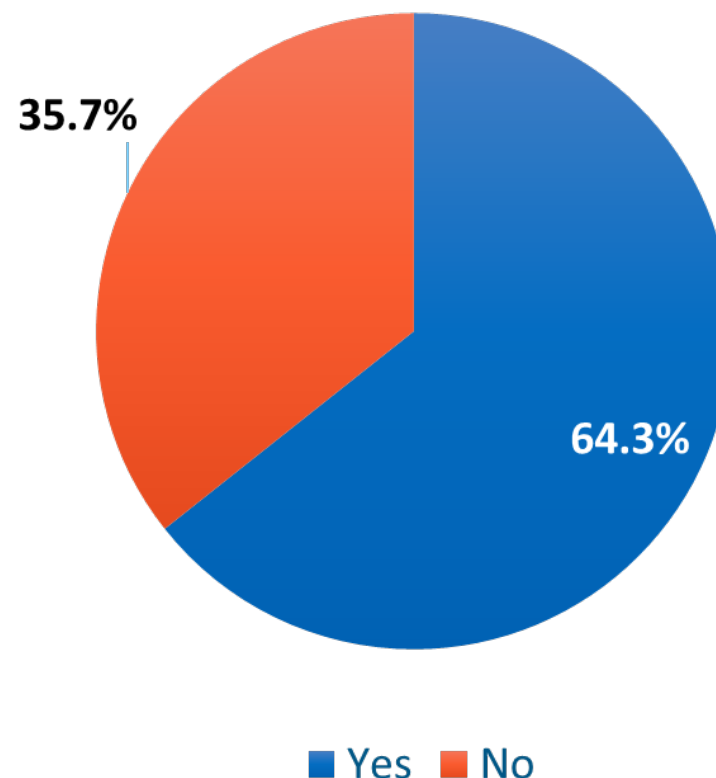


17,325 of 26,929 P. E. teachers, or 64.3%, have standard certifications.

This percentage does not include teachers with generalist certifications who would also be certified to teach P. E. However, it does include teachers with standard, provisional, probationary, probationary extension, one-year, emergency, internship, non-renewable, and professional certificates.

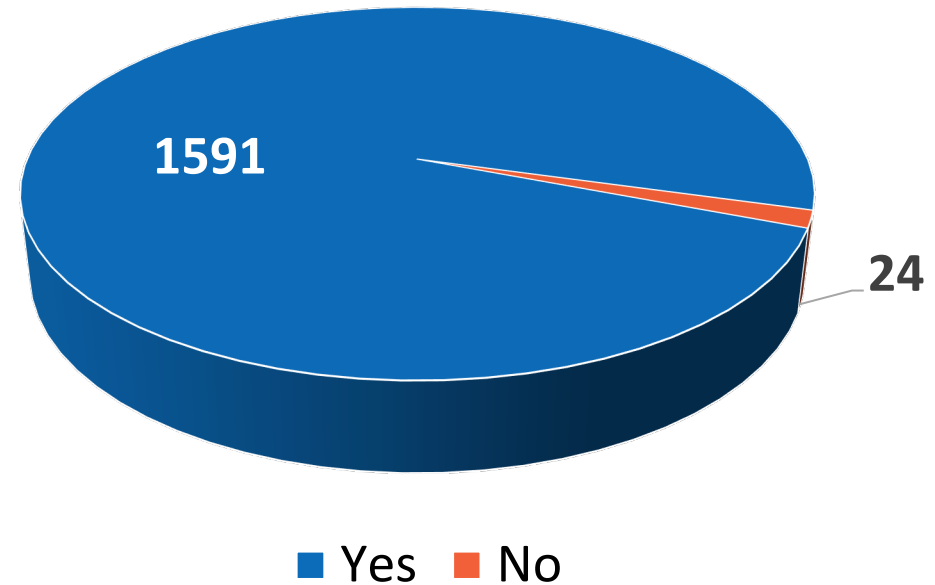
P. E. Teacher with any Health or Physical Education Certificate



98.5% of respondents indicate campuses **have appropriate equipment and adequate facilities** for students to engage in the required amount and intensity of physical activity.

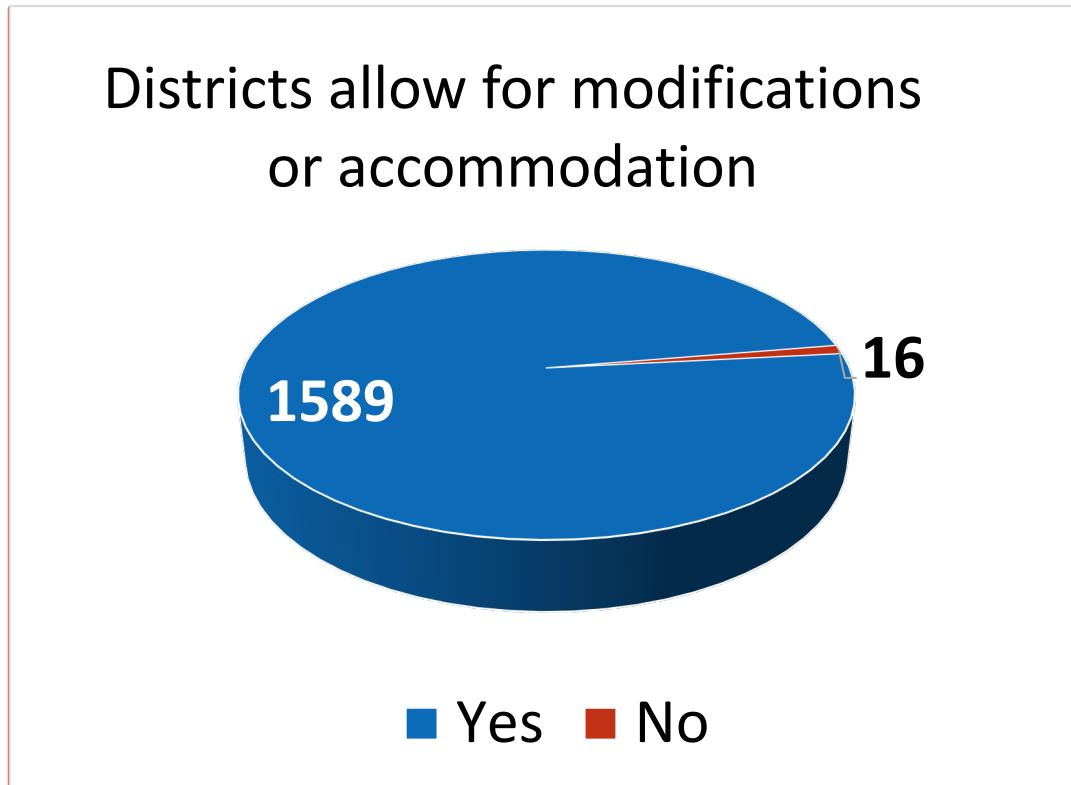


Campuses have appropriate equipment and adequate facilities 2018 - 2021

99.0% of respondents indicate districts **allow** for modifications or accommodations to meet the needs of students with disabilities.

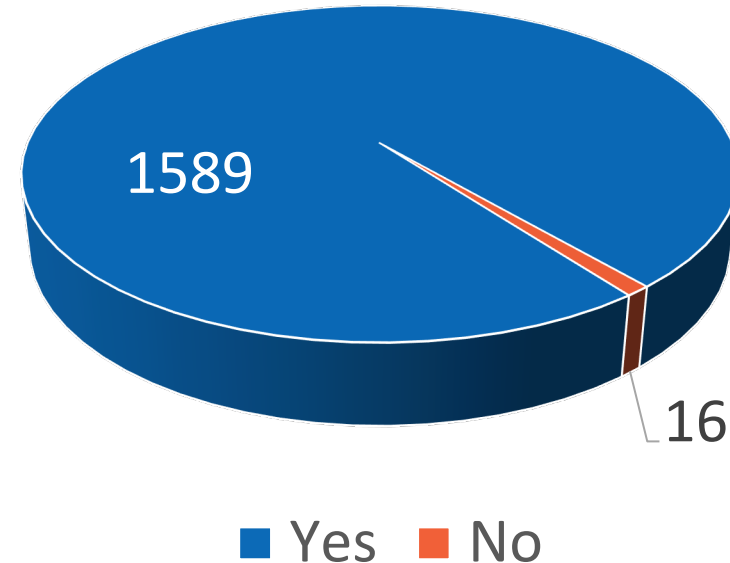


99.0% of respondents indicate districts **do not** have a policy to **withhold physical activity as punishment**.
