<sup>e</sup>The No Child Left Behind Act requires the assessment of reading, mathematics, and science in at least one high school grade.

<sup>f</sup>Linguistically Accommodated Testing is required by No Child Left Behind for recent immigrant students who are LEP-exempt under state law. LAT administrations are available for TAKS, TAKS (Accommodated), and TAKS–M.

<sup>g</sup>TAKS–Modified is an alternate assessment based on modified academic achievement standards. Modified assessment requirements are outlined in the No Child Left Behind Act.

<sup>h</sup>TAKS–Alternate is an alternate assessment based on alternate achievement standards. TAKS–Alt is required by the federal No Child Left Behind Act.
