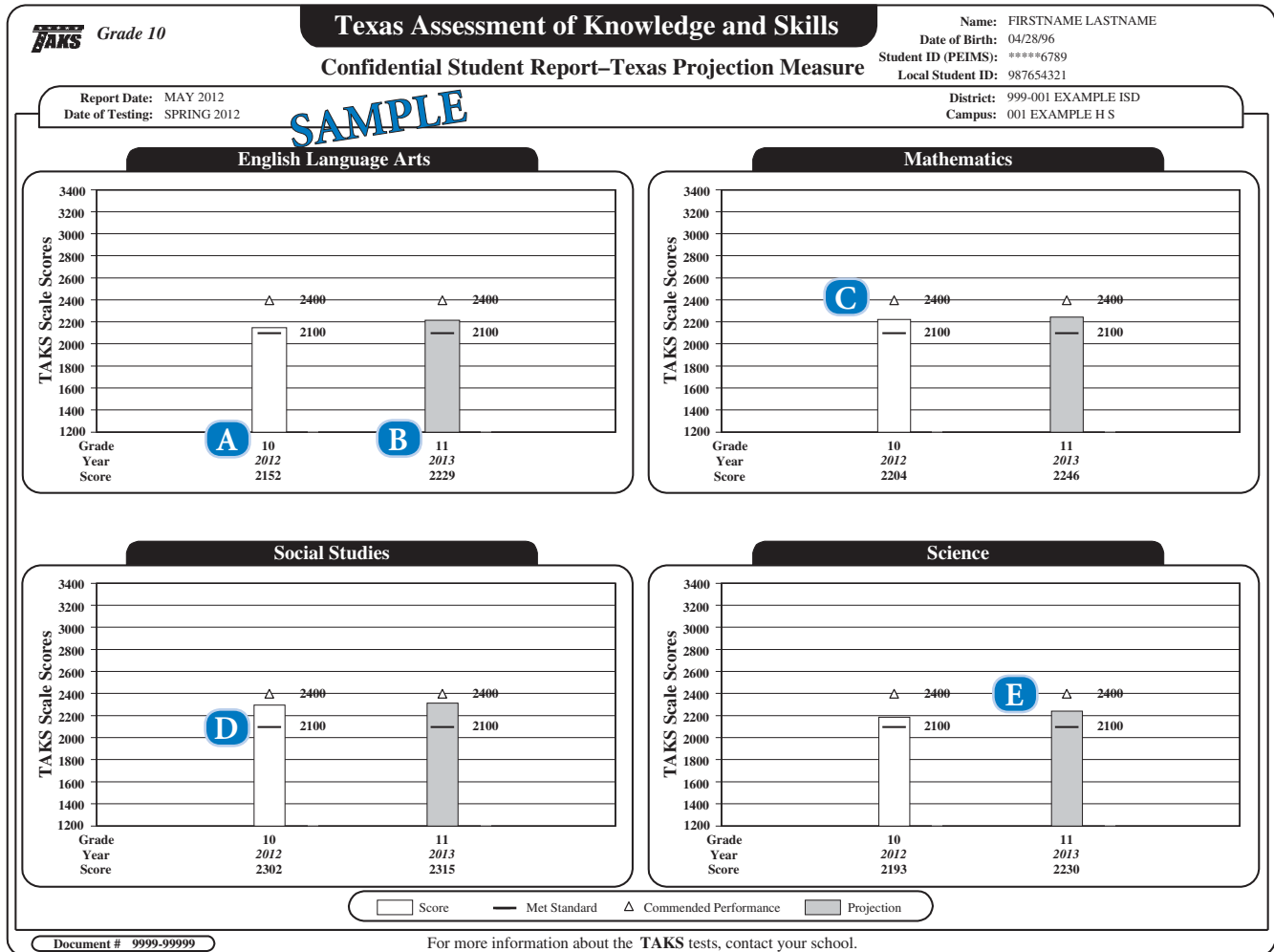




Understanding the Confidential Student Report—Texas Projection Measure

What is the Texas Projection Measure?

The Texas Projection Measure (TPM) is an estimate of whether a student is likely to pass the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) tests at a future grade. This measure is based on (1) a student’s performance on TAKS and (2) the TAKS scores from all students in the campus that a student attends. Your child’s grade 10 English language arts, mathematics, social studies, and science scores are projected to grade 11.



Explanation of Results

- A** This is your child’s current grade, year, and scale score.
- B** This is the grade, year, and projected scale score based on the TPM for your child. This provides an estimate of whether your child is likely to pass and/or achieve commended performance on the grade 11 (exit level) TAKS tests after receiving instruction each year. This score will also help you and your child’s school better understand the progress your child needs to make to be academically successful.
- C** A bar graph shows scale scores for subjects that cannot be compared across grades.
- D** The lines on the graph are the Met Standard scale scores for grade 10. These tell you what score your child needs to pass the test in each subject area.
- E** The triangles on the graph are the Commended Performance scale scores for grade 10. These tell you what score your child needs to achieve the highest performance level in each subject area.

In what situations will students not have a projection reported?

Students will **not** receive a projection if they

- do not take all tests that are needed for a projection; or
- take TAKS or TAKS (Accommodated) for one subject and TAKS–M for another subject.
