This table shows the number and percentage of candidates who received their first standard Superintendent certificate through each preparation route, broken down by gender and by race or ethnicity.

Definition. A standard certificate is a certificate offered since 1998-99 that is renewed every five years.

Results

- The overall majority of Superintendents were male except in academic year 2014-15, when a small majority were female.
- Superintendents were largely white, with Hispanics/Latinos and blacks/African Americans making up the second largest groups.
- Few Superintendents were Asian and American Indian/Alaska Native; none were Native Hawaiian or identified as Other.
- The university post-baccalaureate route produced a large majority of certified Superintendents in each academic year shown.
- The overall number of certified Superintendents has declined each academic year since 2012-13.

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Summary of methodology. Five tables were extracted containing identification numbers, preparation route codes, genders, and races or ethnicities of individuals obtaining their first standard Superintendent certificate for academic years 2010-11 through 2014-15. For each academic year and preparation route, a total of all Superintendents was obtained, together with counts by gender and race or ethnicity. Each count was then taken as a percentage of the corresponding total. The process was repeated to obtain overall results for all routes. Finally, the two sets of results were combined into one table.
