> Commissioner of Education Mike Morath spoke to the board members for nearly two hours on topics that included recent problems with online versions of the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR), the process for creating STAAR test questions, efforts to rewrite curriculum standards and a planned organizational study of the Texas Education Agency. He did say that 14,220 students were impacted by computer problems during the March testing period. Overall, about 2.5 million students took STAAR tests during that period.

The State Board of Education directed the English and Spanish language arts and reading TEKS review committee members to do the following:

- After vertical alignment is complete, order student expectations within a strand in a way that makes most sense for the grade level, especially in the early grade levels
- Revisit the decision to combine encoding and decoding in the student expectations and provide a rationale for the final decision
- Add more content to provide stepping stones, especially for high school courses, in the developing and sustaining foundational language skills, response, multiple genres, and composition strands
- Add examples of kinds of literature including American and British literature or explain the rationale for not including examples
- Review and consider the TCTELA forum feedback that has not yet been addressed

4. Update on Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) Review (Board agenda page I-63)

Ms. Martinez explained the steps for nominating committee members for the science TEKS streamlining committees and stated that the deadline for board members to make nominations is May 6, 2016. She also reviewed the upcoming dates related to the review and revision of the English and Spanish language arts and reading TEKS.
