What is Foster Care?



Foster care, or out-of-home care, is the system that a child enters when a child cannot live safely at home and a court of law grants legal custody to the State of Texas.

 A child may also be placed with a noncustodial parent or returned home (in what is known as a "return and monitor") and still be temporarily in DFPS (Department of Family and Protective Services) conservatorship. Other terms that may be used when a student is in DFPS custody:



LEA Mandatory Reporting Child Abuse & Neglect



- New employee trainings
- School Board & Superintendent trainings
- Awareness poster posted DFPS Child abuse hotline on every campus in English & Spanish (No, Go, Tell)
- School board policy in any informational handbook
- Must provide research-based, age appropriate, child abuse antivictimization programs for elementary & secondary schools
- Develop & clearly articulate policy, protocol and procedures





Reporting Information

REPORTING CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

If you suspect child abuse or neglect, make a report by calling 1-800-252-5400 or visiting the Texas Abuse Hotline Website at www.txabusehotline.org.

Call 911 if it is an emergency.

(An emergency is a situation where a child faces an immediate risk of abuse or neglect that could result in death or serious harm.)

**If human trafficking is suspected, also contact local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS).



Key People for a Student in Foster Care









Working with Key People

 School personnel may be subpoenaed or requested to attend a court hearing regarding the DFPS case.

• Attorneys and guardians ad litem should be able to show a court order appointing them to represent the student in the DFPS case.

• Check with the DFPS or Community-Based Care caseworker to find out who is responsible for education decisions and what access parents may have to the student or the student's records.

Foster Care Liaisons are strongly encouraged to work in coordination with the Title I director, transportation director, McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison, dropout prevention/at-risk coordinator, special education staff, and other federal program staff to coordinate ESSA and other requirements for students in foster care within their LEAs.






