#### Summary:

This item is allows the TEA staff to provide an update and report to the board on recent SBECrelated legislation as a result of the 84<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislation. There were several pieces of legislation that are required to be implemented into the Texas Administrative Code (TAC). This item clarifies the implementation plan and date for each piece of legislation, along with the purpose of the legislation and the existing or new TAC rule that will be effected. TEA staff anticipates full implementation by September 2016.

### Update and Report of Legislation Related to the State Board for Educator Certification: Implementation Plan for the 84<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislative Session

#### **DISCUSSION ONLY**

**SUMMARY:** This item provides an update and report to the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) concerning the implementation plan for all SBEC-related legislation as a result of the 84<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislative Session.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND SIGNIFICANT ISSUES:** As a result of the 84<sup>th</sup> Regular Session of the Texas Legislature, there were several SBEC-related pieces of legislation that are required to be implemented into the Texas Administrative Code (TAC). Attachment I is a summary of each piece of enabling legislation, the subject and purpose, either the existing or new TAC rule, along with the current status/plan for implementation. Attachment II clarifies which SBEC meeting the enabling legislation along with the relevant TAC rules will either be discussed, proposed or adopted, with the implementation date if applicable. According to the current schedule, all SBEC-related legislation should be adopted by August 2016 and fully implemented by September 2016, which will be prior to the beginning of the 85<sup>th</sup> Regular Session of the Texas Legislature.

The Texas Education Agency (TEA) staff have received legislative interim charges and have been participating in committee hearings, as well as, preparing and submitting data requests and hearing materials for legislative committee meetings.
