STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Summary of Actions July 2, 2020

The State Board of Education met virtually on July 2, 2020 and took the actions described below. Additional information about each agenda item can be found at www.tea.texas.gov/sboe/agenda/.

1. Approval of Consent Agenda

(1) Ratification of *Proclamation 2021* Deadline Extension for Publishers Affected by COVID-19

The board ratified a *Proclamation 2021* deadline extension for publishers to provide pre-adoption samples, final correlations to the Texas Prekindergarten Guidelines, *Certification of Editorial Review, Affidavit of Authorship or Contribution*, and *Report on Interoperability and Ease of Use*.

(2) Review and Adoption of the Long-Term Strategic Asset Allocation Plan of the Permanent School Fund of the State Board of Education and the Permanent School Fund Liquid Account

The board adopted the recommendation of NEPC and PSF staff to approve the long-term strategic asset allocation of the Permanent School Fund, shown as Mix B on page 14 of the NEPC presentation titled, "2020 Asset Allocation Update, Texas Permanent School Fund"; adopted the recommendation of NEPC and PSF staff to approve the long-term strategic asset allocation of the Permanent School Fund Liquid Account, shown as the Moderate Risk option on page 17 of the same NEPC presentation; authorized PSF staff to begin implementation of the liquid asset classes in the Fund and the Liquid Account as adopted; and, authorized PSF staff and BNY during the implementation of the asset allocation for the Fund and Liquid Account adopted July 2020 to compare Fund and asset class performance to the appropriate benchmarks based on actual allocations as the assets are invested until the implementation is complete, at which time the appropriate new benchmark will become static at the strategic target.

8. Review of Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 232, General Certification Provisions

The board took no action on the proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 232, General Certification Provisions, which would implement the statutory requirements of House Bills (HBs) 18 and 403 and Senate Bills (SBs) 11 and 37, 86th Texas Legislature, 2019. The proposed revisions would provide continuing professional education (CPE) instruction regarding mental health and substance abuse training; training requirements for superintendents regarding sexual abuse and human trafficking; and the removal of student loan default as grounds to deny the renewal of a certificate. Technical changes would also clarify processes and reorganize current provisions to improve readability and align citations.
