## 7. Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 74, <u>Curriculum Requirements</u>, Subchapter C, <u>Other Provisions</u>, §74.27, <u>Innovative Courses and Programs</u> (Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board approved for second reading and final adoption an amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 74, <u>Curriculum Requirements</u>, Subchapter C, <u>Other Provisions</u>, §74.27, <u>Innovative Courses and Programs</u>. The amendment updates the rule to modify the requirements for approval of innovative courses, specifies that innovative courses cannot be approved if they substantially duplicate the content of TEKS-based courses, and adds requirements for review of ethnic studies innovative courses approved by the commissioner. The revised rule will be effective 20 days after it is filed with the *Texas Register*.

The proposed amendment would update the rule to clarify that a district may award credit proportionately for successful completion of half of a course regardless of the time duration of the course.

## 12. Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 129, <u>Student Attendance</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Student Attendance Accounting</u>, §129.21, <u>Requirements for Student Attendance</u> <u>Accounting for State Funding Purposes</u> (Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board approved for second reading and final adoption an amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 129, <u>Student Attendance</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Student Attendance</u> <u>Accounting</u>, §129.21, <u>Requirements for Student Attendance Accounting for State</u> <u>Funding Purposes</u>. The amendment updates the rule to allow districts and charter schools flexibility for selecting an official attendance-taking time during the campus's instructional day. The amendment will be effective 20 days after the rule is filed with the *Texas Register*.

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 33, <u>Statement of Investment Objectives</u>, <u>Policies</u>, and <u>Guidelines of the Texas Permanent School Fund</u>, Subchapter A, <u>State Board of Education Rules</u>, as amended. The proposed amendments would reorganize references to the Permanent School Fund (PSF) distribution policy, include references to new authority and duties assigned by the 86th Texas Legislature, 2019, and address permissible investments.

#### 15. Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 61, <u>School Districts</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Board of Trustees Relationship</u> (First Reading and Filing Authorization)

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 61, <u>School Districts</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Board of Trustees Relationship</u>, as amended. The proposed amendment to §61.1 reflect changes made by House Bill (HB) 3 and HB 403, 86th Texas Legislature, 2019, to the State Board of Education's (SBOE's) duty to provide training courses for independent school district trustees. The proposed amendment to §61.2 reduces the number of required nominees for trustee candidates for military reservation school districts from three to one per board position. This item was moved to the consent agenda.

#### 16. Review of Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 234, <u>Military Service Members</u>, <u>Military Spouses</u>, and <u>Military Veterans</u>

The SBOE took no action on the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rule actions that revises 19 TAC Chapter 234, <u>Military Service Members, Military Spouses</u>, <u>and Military Veterans</u>. The revisions implement Senate Bill (SB) 1200, 86th Texas Legislature, 2019, which allows military spouses licensed in other states, and in good standing, to teach in Texas with the credential issued by another state. Additional revisions streamline the credentials review and certificate issuance process for all members of the military community (military service members, military spouses, and military veterans). Under Texas law, the SBOE may only reject or take no action on a proposed SBEC rule.

# 17. Review of Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 227, <u>Provisions for Educator</u> <u>Preparation Candidates</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Admission to Educator Preparation</u> <u>Programs</u>

The SBOE took no action on the SBEC rule actions that amend 19 TAC Chapter 227, <u>Provisions for Educator Preparation Candidates</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Admission to Educator Preparation Programs</u>. The amendments implement the statutory requirements of SB 1839 and HBs 2039 and 3349, 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2017. The amendments clarify select definitions, add language for admission requirements for the Early Childhood–Grade 3 (EC–3) and Trade and Industrial Workforce Training: Grades

6–12 certificates, and clarify the implementation date in Subchapter A. The amendments implement subject-matter-only assessments to be used for the Pre-Admission Content Test (PACT) in lieu of the current examination that tests an applicant's knowledge of both content and pedagogy prior to admission to an educator preparation program (EPP). The amendments also implement changes based on stakeholder input and TEA staff recommendations. Under Texas law, the SBOE may only reject or take no action on a proposed SBEC rule.

## 18. Review of Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 229, <u>Accountability System</u> <u>for Educator Preparation Programs</u>

The SBOE took no action on the SBEC rule actions that amend 19 TAC Chapter 229, <u>Accountability System for Educator Preparation Programs</u>. The amendments provide for commendations for high-performing EPPs; adopt the accountability manual into rule; adjust the performance standard for the accountability indicator for the pedagogy and professional responsibility (PPR) examinations; clarify performance standards; clarify the determination of EPP, certification class, or category accreditation status; allow for the SBEC to require EPP action plans; and allow for a contested case hearing of a certification class or category. Technical changes also remove outdated provisions, clarify processes, and update language to align with other chapters. Under Texas law, the SBOE may only reject or take no action on a proposed SBEC rule.

## 19. Review of Proposed Repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 239, <u>Student Services Certificates</u>, Subchapter E, <u>Master Teacher Certificate</u>

The SBOE took no action on the SBEC rule actions that repeals 19 TAC Chapter 239, <u>Student Services Certificates</u>, Subchapter E, <u>Master Teacher Certificate</u>. The repeal implements the requirements of HB 3, 86th Texas Legislature, 2019. HB 3 requires that effective September 1, 2019, the SBEC can no longer issue or renew master teacher certificates. HB 3 also specifies that master teacher certificates will be designated as "legacy" certificates and recognized for assignment purposes until they expire. Under Texas law, the SBOE may only reject or take no action on a proposed SBEC rule.
