STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Summary of Action Items

June 23, 2017

1. Resolutions and Presentations

The board approved a resolution honoring Sharon Pierce, who retired recently as the state advisor of the Texas Association of Family Career and Community Leaders of America.

(1) Selection of Board Members to Serve on the Long-Range Plan Steering Committee (Committee of the Full Board)

The board selected members Marty Rowley, Tom Maynard and Georgina Pérez, along with SBOE Chair Donna Bahorich and Barbara Cargill, the Committee on School Initiatives chair, to serve on the Long-Range Plan Steering Committee. A representative from the Texas Education Agency, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and the Texas Workforce Commission will also serve on the committee. The remaining 10 board members will nominate three Texans each to serve on the steering committee, and the five board members serving on the steering committee will select from those nominees to complete the steering committee. The committee will suggest topics to include in the plan.

(2) Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 105, <u>Foundation School Program</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Definitions</u>, §105.1, <u>Rules for the Definition of Tax Levy and Tax</u> Collection

(First Reading and Filing Authorization) (Committee on School Finance/Permanent School Fund)

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization a proposed amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 105, Foundation School Program, Subchapter A, Definitions, §105.1, Rules for the Definition of Tax Levy and Tax Collection. The proposed amendment would ensure that the definition of tax collections for purposes of the Texas Education Code (TEC), §42.004, and as used in issuing additional state aid for ad valorem tax credits under the TEC, §42.2515, complies with Texas Tax Code, Chapter 313.

The board agreed to execute agreements with:

- Trumbull Property Fund G.P., LLC, to effect a 100 percent redemption of interests in the UBS (US) Trumbull Property Fund LP, and delegated authorization for contract execution to the commissioner of education;
- Morgan Stanley Real Estate Advisor Inc., as manager, necessary to make an
 investment commitment of up to \$225 million in Prime Property Fund, LLC,
 subject to continued due diligence and negotiation of fund terms, and delegated
 authorization for contract execution to the commissioner of education;
- IRI Cove I, L.P., as general partner, necessary to make an investment commitment of up to \$75 million in Invesco Core Real Estate U.S.A., L.P.,

- subject to continued due diligence and negotiation of fund terms, and delegated authorization for contract execution to the commissioner of education;
- Prologis, L.P, as general partner, necessary to make an investment commitment of up to \$100 million in Prologis Targeted U.S. Logistics Holdings II, L.P., a U.S. dollar-denominated fund, subject to continued due diligence and negotiation of fund terms, and delegated authorization to contract to the commissioner of education.

The board approved a *Proclamation 2019* document that contains answers to 95 questions from publishers. *Proclamation 2019* calls for instructional materials in English language arts and reading, grades K-8; Spanish language arts and reading, grades K-6; English Learners Language Arts, grades 7 and 8; handwriting (English and Spanish), grades K-5; spelling (English and Spanish), grades 1-6; and Personal Financial Literacy.

Proposed New 19 TAC Chapter 110, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for English Language Arts and Reading</u>, Subchapter C, <u>High School</u>, and 19 TAC Chapter 128, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Spanish Language Arts and Reading and English as a Second Language</u>, Subchapter C, <u>High School</u>

(Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board approved for second reading and final adoption revisions to the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for high school English Language Arts and Reading and English for Speakers of Other Languages, as amended. The implementation date for the updated high school TEKS will be the 2020-2021 school year.

6. Proposed Repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 114, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Languages Other Than English</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §114.1 and §114.2, Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §114.11 and §114.12, and Subchapter C, <u>High School</u>, §\$114.21-114.29

(Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board gave final approval to the repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 114, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Languages Other than English</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §114.1 and §114.2, Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §114.11 and §114.12, and Subchapter C, <u>High School</u>, §\$114.21-114.29. This repeal will remove the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) adopted to be effective in 1998 for elementary, middle, and high school languages other than English (LOTE), and related implementation language. The repealed TEKS will be replaced with revised TEKS that will be implemented beginning with the 2017-2018 school year.
