<p>Section 3 General Attendance Requirements</p>	<p>Revision</p>	<p><b>3.9 Data Submission</b> Your district . . .</p> <p>If your district operates a year-round program, your district should submit attendance records for all students by June 25, 2009, regardless of which track students are attending. On completion of all tracks, your district must resubmit all records for each student. In no case may any resubmission occur after August 27, 2009.</p> <p>Regardless of the basis . . .</p>	<p><b>3.9 Data Submission</b> Your district . . .</p> <p>If your district <b>is registered with the TEA to operate</b> a year-round program, your district <b>must</b> submit <b>initial</b> attendance records for all students by <b>June 24, 2010</b>, regardless of which track students are attending. On completion of all tracks, your district must resubmit all records for each student. <b>If your district's year-round tracks end later than June 24, your district may delay resubmission until 2 weeks after the completion of the latest year-round track or August 26, 2010, whichever comes first.</b> In no case may any resubmission occur after <b>August 26, 2010. Corrections made after August 26, 2010, will be handled by the State Funding Division.</b></p> <p>Regardless of the basis . . .</p>

A school district cannot develop or create a JJAEP.<sup>2</sup></p> <p>JJAEPs are provided in preadjudication secure detention and postadjudication secure correctional facilities. A preadjudication secure detention facility is a secure facility administered by a governing board that is designed to physically restrict the movements and activities of persons held in lawful custody in the facility and is used for the temporary placement of an individual who is accused of having committed an offense and is awaiting court action, an administrative hearing, or other transfer action. A postadjudication secure correctional facility is a secure facility administered by a governing board or the TYC that is designed to physically restrict the movements and activities of residents and is intended for the treatment and rehabilitation</p>	<p><b>10.11 Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Programs (JJAEPs)<sup>4</sup></b> Academically, . . .</p> <p>If a school district . . . The school district that maintains a student's enrollment is responsible for ensuring that appropriate education services are provided to each of its students while in the facility.</p> <p><i>Postadjudication Secure Correctional Facility:</i> The school district providing educational services in a postadjudication secure correctional facility must ensure that a student is enrolled in its school district or, by local agreement, in the student's locally assigned school district on the student's first school day in the facility as a court-committed juvenile.</p> <p><i>Transfer of Records:</i> The school district providing educational services in either type of facility must coordinate with a student's previous locally assigned campus to ensure that appropriate academic records are received within 10 school days of the student's enrollment.</p>	<p><b>10.11.1 JJAEPs and School Districts in Counties With Populations Greater Than 125,000</b> If your school district . . .</p> <p><b>10.11.2 Establishment of a Separate JJAEP Campus</b> For purposes of accountability . . .</p> <p><b>10.11.3 JJAEP Eligibility and ADA Eligibility Coding for JJAEP Students</b> For a student to be placed . . .</p>
