

Certified Principal Demographics by Preparation Route 2006-2010

This table shows numbers and percentages of candidates who received their first standard Principal certificate through each preparation route, broken down by gender and by race or ethnicity.

Results

- More than two-thirds of Principals were female, and most Principals were white.
- The out-of-state route produced relatively small percentages of female and Hispanic/Latino Principals.
- Similarly, the university post-baccalaureate route produced small percentages of black/African American Principals.
- The alternative route showed a substantial decline of white Principals and a large increase of Hispanic/Latino Principals.

* Results for individual routes may not sum to the total for All Routes, because the total is a count rather than a sum. A sum of routes may contain duplication as educators can be prepared through more than one route.

Note. In 2010, 1 (0.3%) Principal certified through the alternative route and 2 (0.1%) certified through the university post-baccalaureate route reported Two or More Ethnicities, for a total of 3(0.1%).

Summary of methodology. Five tables were extracted containing identification numbers, preparation route codes, genders, and races or ethnicities of individuals obtaining their first standard Principal certificate for fiscal years 2006 through 2010. For each year and preparation route, a total of all Principals was obtained, together with counts by gender and race or ethnicity. Each count was then taken as a percentage of the corresponding total. The process was repeated to obtain overall results for all routes. Finally, the two sets of results were combined into one table.
