SS. Such sources of contractor performance may include any governmental entity, whether an agency or political subdivision of the State of Texas, another state, or the Federal government. Further, TEA may initiate such examinations of contractor performance based upon media reports. Any such investigations shall be at the sole discretion of TEA, and any negative findings, as determined by TEA, may result in a non-award to **VPTS** Respondent.
