This table shows the number and percentage of candidates who received a standard Principal certificate through an Educator Preparation Program or through the out-of-state preparation route, broken down by route, gender, and race or ethnicity. All certificates received in response to a certification request are included.

**Definition.** A standard certificate is a certificate offered since 1998-99 that is renewed every five years.

## Results

- In academic year 2017-18, about three-fourths of Principals were female, and most were white.
- Black/African American Principals were the second largest racial or ethnic group for the out-of-state route, and Hispanic/Latino Principals, for the remaining routes.
- The alternative route had the largest percentage of female principals, approaching three-fourths by academic year 2017-18.
- The percentage of white Principals declined in recent academic years for the alternative route, falling below 50% in academic year 2016-17.
- For the out-of-state route, total numbers increased each academic year until 2016-17, when they declined.

## **Certified Principal Demographics by Preparation Route 2014-2018**

Summary of methodology. Five tables were extracted containing identification numbers, preparation route codes, genders, and races or ethnicities of individuals obtaining a standard Principal certificate through an EPP or the out-of-state route for academic years 2013-14 through 2017-18. For each year and preparation route, a total of all Principals was obtained, together with counts by gender and race or ethnicity. Each count was then taken as a percentage of the corresponding total. The process was repeated to obtain overall results for all routes. Finally, the two sets of results were combined into one table.
