(Second Reading and Final Adoption) (Board agenda page I-1)

<u>MOTION</u>: It was moved by Mr. Ratliff that the State Board of Education, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the board, approve for second reading and final adoption proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 74, <u>Curriculum Requirements</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Graduation Requirements</u>, with an effective date of 20 days after filing as adopted with the <u>Texas Register</u>, as recommended by the Committee of the Full Board.

MOTION AND VOTE: It was moved by Mr. Ratliff, seconded by Mr. Cortez, and carried to amend $\S74.13(e)(2)(U)$, as follows:

- (U) Mathematical Models with Applications, if credit is earned prior to September 1, 2015, or September 1 of a subsequent year in which either of the courses listed in subparagraph (F) or (G) of this paragraph has been developed and approved by the State Board of Education, whichever is later.
- [(U) Mathematical Models with Applications, if credit is earned prior to September 1, 2015. A student may not meet the requirement of the course by completing it on or after September 1, 2015. This subparagraph expires September 1, 2016, or until such time as the course listed in subparagraph (F) or (G) of this paragraph has been developed and approved by the State Board of Education.]

MOTION AND VOTE: It was moved by Mr. Maynard, seconded by Mr. Cortez, and carried to amend §74.14(e) by creating new paragraphs (3) and (4), as follows:

- (3) Nationally or internationally recognized business or industry certification shall be defined as an industry validated credential that complies with knowledge and skills standards promulgated by a nationally or internationally recognized business, industry, professional or government entity representing a particular profession or occupation that is issued or endorsed by:
 - (A) a national or international business, industry or professional organization;
 - (B) a state agency or other government entity; or
 - (C) a state-based industry association.
- (4) Certifications or licensures for performance acknowledgements shall:
 - (A) be age appropriate for high school students;
 - (B) represent a student's substantial course of study and/or end-of-program knowledge and skills;
 - (C) include an industry recognized exam or series of exams, an industry validated skill test, or demonstrated proficiency through documented, supervised field experience; and
 - (D) represent substantial knowledge and multiple skills needed for successful entry into a high-skill profession or occupation.

There was no objection by the board in allowing staff to make technical edits or adjustments as necessary.

MOTION AND VOTE: It was moved by Ms. Hardy, seconded by Mrs. Bahorich, and carried to amend §74.13(f)(4)(A), as follows:

(A) <u>five</u> [four] social studies courses by selecting courses from Chapter 113 of this title or Chapter 118 of this title (relating to Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Economics with Emphasis on the Free Enterprise System and Its Benefits); or

<u>MOTION AND VOTE</u>: It was moved by Ms. Hardy, seconded by Mrs. Bahorich, and carried to amend $\S74.13(f)(4)$ by adding a new subparagraph (F), as follows:

(F) four English elective credits by selecting from the following:

- (i) English IV; or
- (ii) Independent Study in English; or
- (iii) Literary Genre; or
- (iv) Creative Writing; or
- (v) Research and Technical Writing; or
- (vi) Humanities; or
- (vii) AP English Literature and Composition; or
- (viii) IB Language Studies A1 Higher Level; or
- (ix) Communication Applications.

MOTION: It was moved by Mrs. Knight and seconded by Ms. Hardy to amend §74.13(e)(6), by inserting Integrated Physics and Chemistry as a new subparagraph (A).

Mrs. Knight withdrew her amendment, without objection from the board.

<u>VOTE</u>: A vote was taken on the motion that the State Board of Education, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the board, approve for second reading and final adoption proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 74, <u>Curriculum Requirements</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Graduation Requirements</u>, with an effective date of 20 days after filing as adopted with the <u>Texas Register</u>, as amended. (a) State review panel members shall observe a no-contact period that shall begin with the initial communication regarding possible appointment to a state review panel and end after recommendations have been made to the commissioner of education that each submission assigned to be evaluated by the state review panel be placed on the adopted list or rejected. During this period, state review panel members shall not have direct or indirect communication with any person having an interest in the adoption process regarding content of instructional materials under evaluation by the panel. This restriction is not intended to prohibit members of the state review panels from seeking advice regarding materials under consideration from educators, experts, parents, or students [the State Board of Education].
