## 6. Proposed Repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 89, <u>Adaptations for Special Populations</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Adult Basic and Secondary Education</u> (Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board approved for second reading and final adoption the proposed repeal of rules concerning Adult Basic and Secondary Education in 19 TAC Chapter 89, Adaptations for Special Populations, Subchapter B. The proposed repeal would eliminate rules that are no longer necessary as a result of statutory changes passed by the 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2013. Authority to administer this program has been transferred to the Texas Workforce Commission, and the proposed repeal updates the Texas Administrative Code to reflect the transfer of authority to administer the program.

## 7. Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 89, <u>Adaptations for Special Populations</u>, Subchapter C, Texas Certificate of High School Equivalency (Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board approved for second reading and final adoption proposed revisions to rules providing for the administration of high school equivalency testing and certification in 19 TAC Chapter 89, Adaptations for Special Populations, Subchapter C. The proposed revisions include an amendment to the retesting section and a new accommodations section to update rules for alignment with current practices for retesting and accommodations. The proposed revisions also include the repeal of the examinees with disabilities section, since provisions relating to accommodations for applicants with documented disabilities would be addressed in the new accommodations section.

#### 8. Proposed Approval of Innovative Courses

#### 10. Per Capita Apportionment Rate for the 2013-2014 School Year

## 11. Review of Proposed New 19 TAC Chapter 229, <u>Accountability System</u> for Educator Preparation Programs, §229.21, <u>Transitional Provisions</u>

The board took no action on the review of the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rule action that would establish a new 19 TAC Chapter 229, Accountability System for Educator Preparation Programs, §229.21, Transitional Provisions. The proposed new rule clarifies the academic years for which the current passing standard on certification examinations applies and defines when individual certification fields are subject to revocation. The new rule would also provide a backstop for ongoing discussion of a rewrite of 19 TAC Chapter 229, Accountability System for Educator Preparation Programs, being conducted in conjunction with the review of 19 TAC Chapter 227 and Chapter 228 required by House Bill 2012, 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2013.

The board adopted for second reading and final adoption an amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 61, <u>School Districts</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Board of Trustees</u> <u>Relationship</u>, §61.1, <u>Continuing Education for School Board Members</u>. The

amendment, presented at the request of a board member, requires coverage of specific topics during local school district orientation and continuing education and clarifies the requirements of certain trainings. There were no additional changes recommended since approved for first reading in April.

## 13. Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 100, <u>Charters</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Open-Enrollment Charter Schools</u> (First Reading and Filing Authorization)

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 100, Charters, Subchapter A, Open-Enrollment Charter Schools. The proposed revisions would add new 19 TAC §100.1, Selection Process, and repeal 19 TAC §100.1, Application and Selection Procedures and Criteria; 19 TAC §100.101, Annual Report on Open-Enrollment Charter Governance; 19 TAC §100.103, Optional Open-Enrollment Charter Provisions for Contracting and Purchasing; and 19 TAC §100.105, Application to Public Senior College or University Charters and Public Junior College Charters. The proposed revisions would align SBOE rules with the Texas Education Code (TEC), Chapter 12, Subchapters D and E, as amended by Senate Bill (SB) 2, 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2013.
