What's New in Performance Reporting

A–F Development

The Notice of Interest forms for districts interested in participating in the local accountability system pilot are due by 5:00 p.m. on October 31, 2017. TEA will review the Notice of Interest forms and announce which districts will participate in the pilot by December 1, 2017. Preliminary Texas Academic Performance Reports

The preliminary Texas Academic Performance Reports (TAPR) were released on TEASE and the public web on Tuesday, October 17th. The final TAPR—with final ratings following the resolution of district appeals of preliminary academic accountability ratings—is scheduled for release on November 16, 2017.

The TAPR provides a wide range of performance information for every public school and district in the state. The campus-level, district-level, regional, and statewide reports combine details of academic performance with information about staff, programs, and demographics. This Week's FAQ

Will districts and campuses still receive distinction designations under the new A-F accountability system?

Yes. In 2018, districts must receive an overall rating of at least a C to be eligible for a distinction designation in postsecondary readiness. Campuses must receive a Met Standard rating to be eligible for distinction designations.
