Early Childhood Education Support Networks



General Description:

To improve the quality of early childhood education across the state, in 2018, TEA launched early childhood education support networks with school districts, charters, and regional education service centers focused on increasing programmatic alignment, resource sharing, and technical assistance. The purpose of the technical assistance is to expand public-private partnerships (general partnerships, Harvey partnership, and SB 1882 indistrict charters), increase enrollment of three- and four-year-olds, and to sustain continuous quality improvement. TEA Early Childhood Division Staff oversees and implements the project, so there is no additional funding necessary. There are two tiers of engagement within this initiative:

- Tier 1 is available to all districts and charters and includes ongoing webinars, resource development, and on-demand phone and email support. It also includes regular, web-based train-the-trainer sessions with Education Service Center staff.
- Tier 2 includes targeted technical assistance to four groups of Local Education Agencies (LEAs) with each group focusing on an aspect of Early Childhood Education (Quality, Access, or Partnerships). Technical assistance for Tier 2 LEAs takes place in the form of monthly calls with TEA staff, webinars, virtual PLC meetings, resource development and sharing, activities, and assignments.

Outcomes:

90% of LEAs participating in the Tier 2 groups focused on *Enrollment* will demonstrate improvement as measured by enrollment plan status at the beginning of the Spring 2019 semester, mid-Spring 2019 semester, and late Summer 2019 90% of LEAs in Tier 2 group focused on *Quality* will complete the High-Quality Prekindergarten and Kindergarten Self-Assessment and show growth in at least two domains by the end of 2019.

Enrollment: 80% of LEAs participating in the Tier 2 groups focused on *Enrollment* will demonstrate usage two or more new strategies resulting in more families enrolling in prekindergarten.
