## SB 7 – Changed Reporting Requirements

- Principal required to report to the superintendent
- Created administrative penalty for failure to report to SBEC (superintendent & principal)
- Created a criminal penalty for intentionally failing to report
- Changed evidence standard from "based on" to "there is"




#### Senate Bill 7 – Changed Reporting Requirements

# SB 7 has resulted in increased reports of inappropriate relationships.

- SB 7 has reduced the risks faced by school districts and students by closing loopholes and enhancing penalties for conduct relating to inappropriate relationships between educators and students
- SB 7 has encouraged reporting of inappropriate relationships between educator and students by clarifying and expanding reporting requirements

## Rider 72 – GAA 85th Legislative Session

**Rider 72** appropriated \$136,094 annually to **protect students from inappropriate educator relationships**. These funds support two additional investigators to address the increased case volume and help ensure all allegations are thoroughly investigated and prosecuted to help keep students safe.

 Additionally, and as a result of these increased funds, TEA has reduced the average number of days it takes to complete an investigation from 120 to 107.



### **Policy Considerations**

Consider language to clarify the duty to report when a district has completed an investigation and determined that an educator did not engage in misconduct.

Consider addressing the growing number of non-certified employees employed in the public schools who engage in misconduct with Texas school children and are beyond the scope of existing reporting requirements.
