The Texas E-rate State Matching Program was made possible by the 85th Texas Legislature and approved by Governor Greg Abbott by signing SB 1, the General Appropriations Act (GAA). The GAA includes Rider 69, which outlines the Texas E-rate State Matching program.

Due to limited remaining funding and in following the Commissioner of Education's priorities, the Texas Education Agency (TEA) is unable to fully fund your application for state matching funds. We are pleased to inform the Consortium Independent School District that TEA has approved an initial state award from the E-rate State Matching Program to fund a total of 90.32% of your original requested state match of \$8,000.00. The estimated state match award is \$7,225.00. The final award will be based on the amount ultimately approved by USAC following the issuance of a Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL) by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) and is dependent on funding availability. The Texas state match is a dollar-for-dollar match to the approved federal state match. If the federal match percentage is reduced, the Texas state match percentage and resulting dollars is also reduced.

Please note that the award can be used *only* for the project(s) and purpose(s) specified in the Form 471 and is subject to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) matching grant and final approval by TEA, based upon project specifics.

The TEA will be awarding these funds on a grant basis. Details of the grant application process will be sent soon. All projects are subject to TEA reporting requirements.
