Discussion of Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231,
Requirements for Public School Personnel Assignments,
Subchapter B, Prekindergarten-Grade 6 Assignments,
Subchapter C, Grades 6-8 Assignments, Subchapter E,
Grades 9-12 Assignments, and Subchapter F, Special
Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments

DISCUSSION

SUMMARY: This item provides the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) an opportunity to discuss proposed revisions to 19 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 231, Requirements for Public School Personnel Assignments. The rules being discussed provide requirements relating to the criteria for school districts to make personnel assignments based on the correlating certification requirements. The proposed amendments are necessary to expand certificate offerings appropriate for assignments requiring demonstration of proficiency in the science of teaching reading and other course assignments. The proposed amendments would also expand the list of certificates appropriate for personnel serving in special education-related assignments.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The statutory authority for 19 TAC Chapter 231 is the Texas Education Code (TEC), §21.003(a), §21.031(a) and §21.041(b)(1)–(2), and (TEC), 21.064.

TEC, §21.003(a), states that a person may not be employed as a teacher, teacher intern or teacher trainee, librarian, educational aide, administrator, educational diagnostician, or school counselor by a school district unless the person holds an appropriate certificate or permit issued as provided by the TEC, Chapter 21, Subchapter B.

TEC, §21.031(a), states that the SBEC shall regulate and oversee all aspects of the certification, continuing education, and standards of conduct of public school educators.

TEC, §21.041(b)(1), requires the SBEC to propose rules that provide for the regulation of educators and the general administration of the TEC, Chapter 21, Subchapter B, in a manner consistent with the TEC, Chapter 21, Subchapter B.

TEC, §21.041(b)(2), requires the SBEC to propose rules that specify the classes of educator certificates to be issued, including emergency certificates.

TEC, §21.064, requires the SBEC to stop the issuance and renewal of master teacher certificates effective September 1, 2019, to add a designation of "legacy" to each master teacher certificate issued, and to recognize these certificates until they expire.

FUTURE ACTION EXPECTED: Texas Education Agency (TEA) staff anticipates presenting proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231, to the SBEC at a future meeting in 2024 meeting for approval to be published in the *Texas Register*.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND JUSTIFICATION: The SBEC rules in 19 TAC Chapter 231 establishes the personnel assignments that correlate with appropriate certifications and are organized as follows:

- Subchapter A, Criteria for Assignment of Public School Personnel;
- Subchapter B, <u>Prekindergarten–Grade 6 Assignments</u>;
- Subchapter C, Grades 6-8 Assignments;
- Subchapter D, <u>Electives</u>, <u>Disciplinary Courses</u>, <u>Local Credit Courses</u>, <u>and Innovative</u> <u>Courses</u>, <u>Grades 6–12 Assignments</u>;
- Subchapter E, Grades 9–12 Assignments,
- Subchapter F, Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments, and
- Subchapter G, <u>Paraprofessional Personnel</u>, <u>Administrators</u>, and <u>Other Instructional and</u> Professional Support Assignments.

These subchapters offer guidance to school districts and educators by providing the list of courses by grade level and subject area and identifying the corresponding certificates and other requirements for placement of individuals into classroom and/or campus assignments. This information assists districts with hiring and personnel assignment decisions.

The proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231, Subchapters B, C, E, and F, shown in Attachment I, are described below and identify the appropriate certificates for placement in particular Prekindergarten-Grade 6, Grades 6-8, and Grades 9-12 classroom assignments. In addition, the proposed revisions to Special Education-Related Personnel Assignments would facilitate initial conversations and future considerations around requirements for placement into special education-related personnel assignments. These proposed revisions are part of the teacher certification redesign plan that has been discussed with the SBEC since 2018 to improve the quality and consistency of newly certified teachers.

Subchapter B, Prekindergarten-Grade 6 Assignments

Proposed revisions to the following sections would expand the list of certificates deemed appropriate for placement into various course assignments and reflect the statutory requirement that educators demonstrate proficiency in the science of teaching reading to teach certain courses:

- 19 TAC §§231.3, 231.9, 231.15, and 231.17 would add these certificates:
 - "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Special Education with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Bilingual Education Spanish with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Core with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
- 19 TAC §231.7 would add these certificates:
 - "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12"

- 19 TAC §231.13 would add this certificate:
 - "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
- 19 TAC §§231.21, 231.23, 231.25, 231.27, and 231.31 would add this certificate:
 - "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"

Subchapter C, Grades 6-8 Assignments

Proposed revisions to the following sections would expand the list of certificates deemed appropriate for placement into various course assignments and reflect the statutory requirement that educators demonstrate proficiency in the science of teaching reading to teach certain courses:

- 19 TAC §§231.41, 231.43, 231.45, 231.49, 231.51, 231.57, 231.61, and 231.63 would add these certificates:
 - "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Special Education with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Bilingual Education Spanish with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Core with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
- 19 TAC §231.47 would add the following certificate:
 - "Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12"
- 19 TAC §§231.67, 231.69, 231.71, and 231.73 would add this certificate:
 - "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"

Subchapter E. Grades 9-12 Assignments

Proposed revisions to the following section would expand the list of certificates deemed appropriate for placement into various course assignments:

Division 1. English Language Arts and Reading, Grades 9-12 Assignments

- 19 TAC §§231.123(b) and 231.125 would add this certificate:
 - "Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12"

Subchapter F, Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments

Current Special Education Certification Requirements:

Special education has been a high-needs, critical shortage area assignment in Texas for many years. Every year, we have the privilege to serve special education students across the state. In 2022-23, there were a total of 702,785 students in the special education population. The special education teacher serves an invaluable role in the provision of support and services to students.

The SBEC currently issues the following four special education certificates:

- Special Education: Early Childhood-Grade 12
- Special Education Supplemental
- Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood-Grade 12
- Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12

Individuals can complete requirements for issuance of a special education certificate through one of the following pathways:

- Completion of an educator preparation program.
- Completion of the out-of-state/out-of-country credentials review process based on already being licensed to teach special education in another state or country; and
- Successful completion of tests via additional certification by examination based on already having a standard or lifetime classroom teacher certificate.

Background on Current State Certification Requirements and Stakeholder Engagement

Current 19 TAC Chapter 231, Subchapter F, §231.701 Special Education Teacher, subsection (a) states, "Subject to the requirements in subsection (c) of this section, an assignment for Special Education Teacher is allowed with one of the following certificates. If an individual is providing content instruction in a special education classroom setting, a valid certificate that matches the subject and grade level of the assignment is also required, or the individual must demonstrate competency through the state's 2010 and 2011 high objective uniform State standard of evaluation for elementary and secondary special education teachers."

As such, teachers must be certified for the courses, subjects, and grade levels, in accordance with SBEC rules. When a local education agency (LEA) has a special education teacher serving as the teacher of record for these courses/subjects/grade levels, then under current rule, the teacher would also need to meet the full certification requirements or demonstrate competency through the high objective uniform State standard of evaluation of elementary and secondary special education teachers (HOUSSE) provisions.

During the December 2023 SBEC meeting, TEA staff will provide an overview of current federal requirements and historical considerations, feedback from stakeholders on challenges related to the current special education personnel assignment provisions, and the proposed approach to address personnel assignments given the proposed new special education certificates.

Proposed Approach to Special Education Personnel Assignment and Questions for Discussion:

The proposed approach to special education personnel assignments would include:

The following questions are ones that stakeholders have engaged with in discussions regarding special education personnel assignments and will inform TEA staff's discussion with the SBEC on this topic during their December 2023 meeting.

- 1. What should be required for high school special education teachers who are teachers of record?
- 2. What should be required for high school special education teachers providing instruction in more than one core content area?
- 3. What should be required for high school special education teachers teaching students who are receiving modified curriculum or modified content at the students' enrolled grade level, which is typically defined as a reduction in the amount and complexity of the required essential knowledge and skills for a course, or teaching students who are accessing enrolled grade level curriculum through prerequisite skills?
- 4. Is the Board comfortable with TEA staff's recommendation to utilize college credit hours in the core area being taught or demonstration of proficiency on a pre-admission content test (PACT) in the subject area of instruction in instances in which the teacher is providing instruction on pre-requisite skills?
- 5. What is the best way to transition from the HOUSSE provisions?
- 6. Is there an equitable and legal option to replace HOUSSE and/or grandfather individuals into assignments and provide districts with the continued flexibility and support that they need?
- 7. What should we take into consideration when updating special education assignment rules to ensure that we do not significantly disrupt the field and negatively impact students and teachers?

Proposed Update to Subchapter F, <u>Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments</u>:

TEA staff proposes a repeal and replace of 19 TAC §231.701. Special Education Teacher to more clearly distinguish and articulate requirements for placement into special education assignments at the elementary, middle, and high school levels.

Proposed new 19 TAC §237.701(a) would specify requirements for the assignment of special education teacher at the elementary and middle school levels and would identify the list of SBEC-issued certificates appropriate to serve in that role.

Proposed new 19 TAC §237.701(b) would specify requirements for the assignment of special education teacher, teaching the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), at the high school level and would identify the list of SBEC-issued certificates appropriate to serve in that role.

Proposed new 19 TAC §237.701 (c) would specify requirements for the assignment of special education teacher at the high school level, responsible for providing core content instruction to students accessing enrolled grade and subject level TEKS through prerequisite skills. The proposed new subsection would identify the list of SBEC-issued certificates appropriate to serve in that role and would also require either a certain amount of college credit hours in the core area that he or she is teaching or would require demonstration of content proficiency on a Pre-Admission Content Test (PACT) in the subject area that he or she is teaching.

The employing school district is responsible for ensuring educators are trained in meeting student needs as identified in students' individualized education programs (IEPs).

TEA staff proposes an update to 19 TAC §231.707. Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments that would add the Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12 certificate to the list of credentials appropriate for placement into this teaching assignment.

TEA staff also proposes changes to 19 TAC §231.709. Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments, to change the section reference to Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and would also add the Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12 certificate to the list of credentials appropriate for placement into this teaching assignment.

NEXT STEPS: Following a robust conversation with the Board at the SBEC December meeting, TEA staff anticipates continued conversations with stakeholders to obtain helpful input prior to presenting proposed rules for approval.

PUBLIC AND STUDENT BENEFIT: The public and student benefit anticipated as a result of the proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231 would be updated requirements relating to the assignment of educators in Texas public schools.

 - (A) Teachers assigned prior to the 1991-1992 school year are required to complete a minimum of 90 clock-hours of in-service training (may be advanced academic training)

or six semester credit hours in early childhood education, inclusive of but not limited to child development or language acquisition, by September 1, 1993, to be eligible for assignment.

(B) Initial assignments beginning with the 1991-1992 school year require the early childhood education delivery system or endorsement.

(15) [(10)] Elementary Early Childhood Education (Prekindergarten-Grade 6).

(16) [(11)] Elementary Self-Contained (Grades 1-8).

- (A) Teachers assigned prior to the 1991-1992 school year are required to complete a minimum of 90 clock-hours of in-service training (may be advanced academic training) or six semester credit hours in early childhood education, inclusive of but not limited to child development or language acquisition, by September 1, 1993, to be eligible for assignment.

 - (A) Bilingual Education Supplemental.
 - (B) Bilingual Education Supplemental (Early Childhood-Grade 4).
 - (C) Bilingual Education Supplemental (Grades 4-8).
 - (D) Bilingual Endorsement.
 - (E) Bilingual/English as a Second Language Endorsement.
 - (F) Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.

(G) [(F)] English as a Second Language Endorsement.

(H) [(G)] English as a Second Language Supplemental.

(5) [(4)] Early Childhood Education (Prekindergarten and Kindergarten). Initial assignments beginning with the 1991-1992 school year require the English as a Second Language endorsement or the bilingual education delivery system or endorsement.

(6) [(5)] Elementary--General.

- (A) Teachers assigned prior to the 1991-1992 school year are required to complete a minimum of 90 clock-hours of in-service training (may be advanced academic training) or six semester credit hours in early childhood education, inclusive of but not limited to child development or language acquisition, by September 1, 1993, to be eligible for assignment.

[§231.701. Special Education Teacher.

- (a) Subject to the requirements in subsection (c) of this section, an assignment for Special Education Teacher is allowed with one of the following certificates. If an individual is providing content instruction in a special education classroom setting, a valid certificate that matches the subject and grade level of the assignment is also required, or the individual must demonstrate competency through the state's 2010 and 2011 high objective uniform State standard of evaluation for elementary and secondary special education teachers.

If a staff member does not have the skills and knowledge needed for the assignment, the school district is responsible for making provisions for the person to acquire the necessary skills and knowledge.]

§231.707. Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments.

- (a) An assignment for Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments is allowed with one of the following certificates.

§231.709. Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. [Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments.]

- (a) An assignment for <u>Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing</u> [<u>Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments</u>] is allowed with one of the following certificates.
 - (1) Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
 - (2) [(1)] Deaf and Severely Hard of Hearing.
 - (3) [(2)] Hearing Impaired.
 - (4) [(3)] Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (b) A teacher in an assignment for <u>Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing [Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments</u>] must be available to students with auditory impairments.
- (c) A teacher in an assignment for <u>Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing [Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments]</u> is not required to pass the Texas Assessment of Sign Communication (TASC) or the Texas Assessment of Sign Communication-American Sign Language (TASC-ASL) in order to be assigned to a classroom in which another communication method is used predominately. If this teacher completes certification requirements through a State Board for Educator Certification-approved educator preparation program in Texas, the program must have assessed proficiency in the communication method and verified it to be at an appropriate level.
