Discussion of Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231, Requirements for Public School Personnel Assignments, Subchapter B, Prekindergarten-Grade 6 Assignments, Subchapter C, Grades 6-8 Assignments, Subchapter E, Grades 9-12 Assignments, and Subchapter F, Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments

DISCUSSION

SUMMARY: This item provides the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) an opportunity to discuss proposed revisions to 19 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 231, Requirements for Public School Personnel Assignments. The proposed revisions would provide requirements relating to the criteria for school districts to make personnel assignments based on the correlating certification requirements. The proposed revisions are necessary to expand certificate offerings appropriate for assignments requiring demonstration of proficiency in the science of teaching reading and other course assignments. The proposed revisions would expand the list of certificates appropriate for personnel serving in special education-related assignments and would update the requirements for special education assignments ensuring that all students have access to the general curriculum at their enrolled grade level.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The statutory authority for 19 TAC Chapter 231 is the Texas Education Code (TEC), §21.003(a), §21.031(a) and §21.041(b)(1)–(2), and (TEC), 21.064.

TEC, §21.003(a), states that a person may not be employed as a teacher, teacher intern or teacher trainee, librarian, educational aide, administrator, educational diagnostician, or school counselor by a school district unless the person holds an appropriate certificate or permit issued as provided by the TEC, Chapter 21, Subchapter B.

TEC, §21.031(a), states that the SBEC shall regulate and oversee all aspects of the certification, continuing education, and standards of conduct of public school educators.

TEC, §21.041(b)(1), requires the SBEC to propose rules that provide for the regulation of educators and the general administration of the TEC, Chapter 21, Subchapter B, in a manner consistent with the TEC, Chapter 21, Subchapter B.

TEC, §21.041(b)(2), requires the SBEC to propose rules that specify the classes of educator certificates to be issued, including emergency certificates.

TEC, §21.064, requires the SBEC to stop the issuance and renewal of master teacher certificates effective September 1, 2019, to add a designation of "legacy" to each master teacher certificate issued, and to recognize these certificates until they expire.

FUTURE ACTION EXPECTED: Texas Education Agency (TEA) staff anticipates presenting proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231, to the SBEC at a future meeting for approval to be published in the *Texas Register*.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND JUSTIFICATION: The SBEC rules in 19 TAC Chapter 231 establishes the personnel assignments that correlate with appropriate certifications and are organized as follows:

- Subchapter A, Criteria for Assignment of Public School Personnel;
- Subchapter B, <u>Prekindergarten–Grade 6 Assignments</u>;
- Subchapter C, Grades 6–8 Assignments;
- Subchapter D, <u>Electives, Disciplinary Courses, Local Credit Courses, and</u> Innovative Courses, Grades 6–12 Assignments;
- Subchapter E, <u>Grades 9–12 Assignments</u>,
- Subchapter F, <u>Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments</u>, and
- Subchapter G, <u>Paraprofessional Personnel</u>, <u>Administrators</u>, <u>and Other Instructional and Professional Support Assignments</u>.

These subchapters offer guidance to school districts and educators by providing the list of courses by grade level and subject area and identifying the corresponding certificates and other requirements for placement of individuals into classroom and/or campus assignments. This information assists districts with hiring and personnel assignment decisions.

The proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231, Subchapters B, C, E, and F, shown in Attachment I, are described below and identify the appropriate certificates for placement in particular Prekindergarten-Grade 6, Grades 6-8, and Grades 9-12 classroom assignments. In addition, the proposed revisions to Special Education-Related Personnel Assignments would facilitate initial conversations and future considerations around requirements for placement into special education-related personnel assignments. These proposed revisions are part of the teacher certification redesign plan that has been discussed with the SBEC since 2018 to improve the quality and consistency of newly certified teachers.

Subchapter B, Prekindergarten-Grade 6 Assignments

The proposed revisions to the following sections would expand the list of certificates deemed appropriate for placement into various course assignments and reflect the statutory requirement that educators demonstrate proficiency in the science of teaching reading to teach certain courses:

- 19 TAC §§231.3, 231.9, 231.15, and 231.17 would add these certificates:
 - "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Special Education with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Bilingual Education Spanish with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Core with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"

- 19 TAC §231.7 would add these certificates:
 - "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12"
- 19 TAC §231.13 would add this certificate:
 - "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
- 19 TAC §§231.21, 231.23, 231.25, 231.27, and 231.31 would add this certificate:
 - o "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"

Subchapter C, Grades 6-8 Assignments

The proposed revisions to the following sections would expand the list of certificates deemed appropriate for placement into various course assignments and reflect the statutory requirement that educators demonstrate proficiency in the science of teaching reading to teach certain courses:

- 19 TAC §§231.41, 231.43, 231.45, 231.49, 231.51, 231.57, 231.61, and 231.63 would add these certificates:
 - o "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Special Education with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - "Core/Bilingual Education Spanish with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Core/English as a Second Language Supplemental with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
 - o "Core with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"
- 19 TAC §231.47 would add the following certificate:
 - o "Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12"
- 19 TAC §§231.67, 231.69, 231.71, and 231.73 would add this certificate:
 - "Core/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Health with the Science of Teaching Reading: Early Childhood-Grade 6"

Subchapter E, Grades 9-12 Assignments

The proposed revisions to the following section would expand the list of certificates deemed appropriate for placement into various course assignments:

Division 1. English Language Arts and Reading, Grades 9-12 Assignments

- 19 TAC §§231.123(b) and 231.125 would add this certificate:
 - o "Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12"

TEA staff anticipate bringing additional proposed revisions to Subchapter E, <u>Grades 9-12 Assignments</u>, to align with additional career and technical education (CTE) courses approved by the State Board of Education (SBOE). While the list of CTE courses was not available at the time the February SBEC meeting agenda was going to print, TEA staff will continue close collaboration with agency colleagues who support the work of the SBOE to ensure that accurate course information and the corresponding SBEC certificates deemed appropriate to serve in those assignments are reflected in proposed rules for future consideration by the SBEC.

Subchapter F, Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments

Current Special Education Certification Requirements:

Special education continues to be a high-needs, critical shortage area assignment in Texas. In 2022-23, there were a total of 702,785 students in the special education population.

The SBEC currently issues the following four special education certificates:

- Special Education: Early Childhood-Grade 12
- Special Education Supplemental
- Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood-Grade 12
- Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12

Individuals can complete requirements for issuance of a special education certificate through one of the following pathways:

- Completion of an educator preparation program.
- Completion of the out-of-state/out-of-country credentials review process based on already being licensed to teach special education in another state or country; and
- Successful completion of tests via additional certification by examination based on already having a standard or lifetime classroom teacher certificate.

Background on Current State Certification Requirements and Stakeholder Engagement

During the December 2023 SBEC meeting, TEA staff provided an overview of current federal requirements and historical considerations, as well as feedback from stakeholders on challenges related to the current special education personnel assignment provisions. TEA staff presented a proposed approach to address personnel assignments given the proposed new special education certificates.

Teachers must be certified for the courses, subjects, and grade levels, in accordance with SBEC rules. When a local education agency (LEA) has a special education teacher serving as the teacher of record for these courses/subjects/grade levels, then under current rule, the teacher would need to meet the full certification requirements or demonstrate competency through the high objective uniform State standard of evaluation of elementary and secondary special education teachers (HOUSSE) provisions. The current HOUSSE requirements are based on expired definitions of highly qualified. Updating the special education personnel assignments provides the opportunity to ensure that all students have access to the general curriculum at their enrolled grade level.

Following the December 2023 SBEC meeting, TEA staff met with the Educator Preparation Stakeholder Special Populations Working Group and the Special Education State Leadership

team to discuss potential approaches to allow special education teachers to demonstrate competency in their assigned grade level and content area(s). Stakeholders provided the following feedback:

- When developing requirements, maintaining flexibility so as not to further constrict the special education teacher pipeline.
- Providing a single, streamlined worksheet to outline options for demonstrating content proficiency is preferable to multiple, content-specific worksheets.
- Including options on the worksheet that focus on demonstration of content knowledge, not pedagogy.
- Allowing more points for professional development, which would provide a lowcost flexibility for teachers to demonstrate proficiency.
- Considering how requirements might be differentiated for teachers at different stages of their careers.

TEA staff will continue to work with stakeholder groups to develop a Texas-specific worksheet to outline options for how special education teachers may demonstrate competency in grade-level content.

Proposed Update to Subchapter F, <u>Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments</u>:

TEA staff proposes a repeal and replace of 19 TAC §231.701, Special Education Teacher to more clearly distinguish and articulate requirements for placement into special education assignments at the elementary, middle, and high school levels.

Proposed new 19 TAC §237.701(a) would specify requirements for the assignment of special education teacher at the elementary and middle school levels and would identify the list of SBEC-issued certificates appropriate to serve in that role.

Proposed new 19 TAC §237.701(b) would specify requirements for the assignment of special education teacher, teaching the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), at the high school level and would identify the list of SBEC-issued certificates appropriate to serve in that role.

Proposed new 19 TAC §237.701(c) would specify requirements for the assignment of special education teacher at the high school level, responsible for providing core content instruction to students accessing enrolled grade and subject level TEKS through prerequisite skills. The proposed new subsection would identify the list of SBEC-issued certificates appropriate to serve in that role and would also require either a certain amount of college credit hours in the core area that he or she is teaching or would require demonstration of content proficiency by meeting the criteria specified in the Core Content Competency Worksheet Figure: 19 TAC §227.10(a)(4)(C) as verified by the employing district in the subject area that he or she is teaching. TEA staff will present a draft version of the Core Content Competency Worksheet, informed by stakeholder feedback, to the SBEC at the February SBEC meeting for their review and feedback.

The employing school district is responsible for ensuring educators are trained in meeting student needs as identified in students' individualized education programs (IEPs).

TEA staff proposes the addition of 19 TAC §231.710. Teachers of Students who are Deafblind to identify the Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12 certificate as the appropriate credential for placement into this teaching assignment. This update also adds the Teacher of Students who are Visually Impaired and/or Teacher of Students who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing as required credentials for placement in this teaching assignment.

TEA staff also proposes changes to 19 TAC §231.709. Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments, to change the section reference to Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and would also add the Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12 certificate to the list of credentials appropriate for placement into this teaching assignment.

NEXT STEPS: Following a conversation with the Board at the SBEC February meeting, TEA staff anticipates continued conversations with stakeholders to obtain input and an updated version of the Texas-specific core content competency worksheet for high school teachers for approval prior to presenting proposed rules for approval.

PUBLIC AND STUDENT BENEFIT: The public and student benefit anticipated as a result of the proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 231 would be updated requirements relating to the assignment of educators in Texas public schools.

- (5) [(4)] Early Childhood Education (Prekindergarten and Kindergarten). Initial assignments beginning with the 1991-1992 school year require the English as a Second Language endorsement or the bilingual education delivery system or endorsement.

§231.123. English I and II for Speakers of Other Languages, Grades 9-12.

- (a) An assignment for English I and II for Speakers of Other Languages, Grades 9-12, and English Language Development and Acquisition (ELDA), Grades 9-12, is allowed with one of the following certificates plus a valid English as a Second Language or bilingual education certificate, supplemental certificate, or endorsement listed in subsection (b) of this section.
 - (1) English Language Arts and Reading: Grades 7-12.
 - (2) English Language Arts and Reading: Grades 8-12.
 - (3) Grades 6-12 or Grades 9-12--English.
 - (4) Grades 6-12 or Grades 9-12--English Language Arts, Composite.
 - (5) Junior High School (Grades 9-10 only) or High School--English.
 - (6) Junior High School (Grades 9-10 only) or High School--English Language Arts, Composite.
 - (7) Secondary English (Grades 6-12).
 - (8) Secondary English Language Arts, Composite (Grades 6-12).
- (b) An assignment for English I and II for Speakers of Other Languages, Grades 9-12, and English Language Development and Acquisition (ELDA), Grades 9-12, is allowed with one of the following English as a Second Language or bilingual education certificate, supplemental certificate, or endorsement plus a valid certificate listed in subsection (a) of this section.
 - (1) Bilingual Education Supplemental.
 - (2) Bilingual Education Supplemental (Early Childhood-Grade 4).
 - (3) Bilingual Education Supplemental (Grades 4-8).

- (4) Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (5) [(4)] Bilingual Endorsement.
- (6) [(5)] Bilingual/English as a Second Language Endorsement.
- (7) [(6)] English as a Second Language Endorsement.
- (8) [(7)] English as a Second Language Supplemental.
- (9) [(8)] Junior High School (Grades 9-10 only) or High School--Bilingual/English as a Second Language.
- (10) [(9)] Prekindergarten-Grade 12--Bilingual/English as a Second Language.
- (11) [(10)] Prekindergarten-Grade 12--English as a Second Language.
- (12) [(11)] Secondary Bilingual/English as a Second Language (Grades 6-12).
- (c) At the discretion of the employing school district, persons assigned to teach English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) I or ESOL II prior to June 21, 2009, may continue in the assignment without holding an English, English Language Arts Composite, or English Language Arts and Reading certificate. If a person is reassigned and later returns to teach in an ESOL I or ESOL II assignment, current rules will apply.

§231.125. English as a Second Language, Grades 9-12.

An assignment for English as a Second Language, Grades 9-12, is allowed with a valid classroom teaching certificate appropriate for the grade level and subject areas taught plus one of the following certificates.

- (2) Bilingual Education Supplemental (Early Childhood-Grade 4).
- (3) Bilingual Education Supplemental (Grades 4-8).
- (4) Bilingual Endorsement.

- (6) Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (7) [(6)] English as a Second Language Endorsement.
- (8) [(7)] English as a Second Language Supplemental.
- (9) [(8)] Junior High School (Grades 9-10 only) or High School--Bilingual/English as a Second Language.
- (10) [(9)] Prekindergarten-Grade 12--Bilingual/English as a Second Language.
- (11) [(10)] Prekindergarten-Grade 12--English as a Second Language.
- (12) [(11)] Secondary Bilingual/English as a Second Language (Grades 6-12).

Subchapter F. Special Education-Related Services Personnel Assignments

§231.701. Special Education Teacher.

(a) An assignment for Special Education Teacher at the elementary and middle school levels is allowed with one of the following certificates and a valid content area certificate that matches the subject and grade level of the assignment.

- (1) Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (2) Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12
- (3) Special Education Specialist: Early Childhood-Grade 12
- (4) Special Education Supplemental (Valid at grade level and subject area of the base certificate).
- (5) Special Education: Early Childhood Grade 12
- (6) Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments Supplemental: Early Childhood Grade 12
- (7) Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood Grade 12
- (8) Any special education certificate issued before September 1, 2003, and deemed appropriate by the employing district for placement into the assignment.
- (b) An assignment for Special Education Teacher at the high school level, responsible for teaching the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), is allowed with one of the following certificates and a valid content area certificate that matches the subject and grade level of the assignment.
 - (1) Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
 - (2) Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12
 - (3) Special Education Specialist: Early Childhood-Grade 12
 - (4) Special Education Supplemental (Valid at grade level and subject area of the base certificate).
 - (5) Special Education: Early Childhood Grade 12
 - (6) Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments Supplemental: Early Childhood Grade 12
 - (7) Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood Grade 12
 - (8) Any special education certificate issued before September 1, 2003, and deemed appropriate by the employing district for placement into the assignment.
- (c) An assignment for Special Education Teacher at the high school level responsible for core content area instruction and whose assigned students are accessing enrolled grade and subject level Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills through prerequisite skills is allowed by meeting the following requirements:
- (A) Holds one of the following SBEC-issued certificates:

- (1) Bilingual Special Education Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (2) Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (3) Special Education Specialist: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (4) Special Education Supplemental (Valid at grade level and subject area of the base certificate).
- (5) Special Education: Early Childhood Grade 12.
- (6) Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments Supplemental: Early Childhood Grade 12.
- (7) Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood Grade 12.
- (8) Any special education certificate issued before September 1, 2003, and deemed appropriate by the employing district for placement into the assignment.; and
- (B) Has a minimum of 12 semester credit hours in the subject-specific content area for the certification sought, unless certification sought is for mathematics or science at or above Grade 7; or
- (C) Has 15 semester credit hours in the subject-specific content area for the certification sought if the certification sought is for mathematics or science at or above Grade 7; or
- (D) Meets the required point totals, as specified in the Core Content Competency Worksheet Figure: 19 TAC §227.10(a)(4)(C) as verified by the employing district.

[§231.701. Special Education Teacher.

- (a) Subject to the requirements in subsection (e) of this section, an assignment for Special Education Teacher is allowed with one of the following certificates. If an individual is providing content instruction in a special education classroom setting, a valid certificate that matches the subject and grade level of the assignment is also required, or the individual must demonstrate competency through the state's 2010 and 2011 high objective uniform State standard of evaluation for elementary and secondary special education teachers.
 - (1) Blind School (Texas State School for the Blind and Visually Impaired only).
 - (2) Deaf and Severely Hard of Hearing.
 - (3) Deaf School (Texas State School for the Deaf only).
 - (4) Deaf Blind.
 - (5) Deficient Vision.
 - (6) Early Childhood Education for Handicapped Children (Infants Grade 6 only).
 - (7) Elementary Generic Special Education.
 - (8) Emotionally Disturbed.
 - (9) Generic Special Education.
 - (10) Hearing Impaired.
 - (11) High School--Generic Special Education.
 - (12) Language and/or Learning Disabilities.
 - (13) Mentally Retarded.
 - (14) Physically Handicapped.
 - (15) School Speech-Language Pathologist.

- (16) Secondary Generic Special Education (Grades 6-12) (Grades 6-12 only).
- (17) Severely and Profoundly Handicapped.
- (18) Severely Emotionally Disturbed and Autistic.
- (19) Special Education Supplemental (Valid at grade level and subject area of the base certificate).
- (20) Special Education: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (21) Speech and Hearing Therapy.
- (22) Speech and Language Therapy.
- (23) Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (24) Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood Grade 12.
- (25) Visually Handicapped.
- (b) The certificates specified in subsection (a) of this section are appropriate for a special education assignment in Prekindergarten Grade 12 except where otherwise noted.
- (c) The employing school district should make every effort to secure educators trained in the specialized skills and knowledge needed to serve the special needs of the children. If a staff member does not have the skills and knowledge needed for the assignment, the school district is responsible for making provisions for the person to acquire the necessary skills and knowledge.]

§231.703. Teacher of Adaptive Physical Education.

- (a) An assignment for Teacher of Adaptive Physical Education is allowed with one of the following certificates.
 - (1) All-Level Health and Physical Education.
 - (2) All-Level Physical Education.
 - (3) Elementary Physical Education (Grades 1-8) (Grades 1-8 only).
 - (4) Grades 6-8--Physical Education (Grades 6-8 only).
 - (5) Physical Education: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
 - (6) Secondary Physical Education (Grades 6-12) (Grades 6-12 only).
 - (7) Special education certificate as specified in §231.701 of this title (relating to Special Education Teacher). This assignment requires necessary skills and knowledge in adaptive physical education. Evidence of necessary skills and knowledge in adaptive physical education must be documented through in-service records, seminar attendance records, or transcripts of college courses.
- (b) Other licensed professionals may be eligible to provide adaptive physical education services to students with disabilities under the scope of practice of the specific license held.

§231.705. Full-Time Teacher of Orthopedically Impaired or Other Health Impaired in a Hospital Class or Home-Based Instruction.

An assignment for Full-Time Teacher of Orthopedically Impaired or Other Health Impaired in a Hospital Class or Home-Based Instruction is allowed with one of the following certificates.

- (1) Special education certificate as specified in §231.701 of this title (relating to Special Education Teacher).
- (2) Teacher certificate. This assignment requires a three semester credit hour survey course in special education and three semester credit hour course related to teaching students who are physically impaired or health impaired.

§231.707. Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments.

- (a) An assignment for Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments is allowed with one of the following certificates.
 - (1) Deficient Vision.
 - (2) Visually Handicapped.
 - (3) Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments Supplemental: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (b) A teacher in an assignment for Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments must be available to students with visual impairments.

§231.709. Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. [Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments.]

- (a) An assignment for <u>Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing</u> [<u>Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments</u>] is allowed with one of the following certificates.
 - (1) Deaf and Severely Hard of Hearing.
 - (2) Hearing Impaired.
 - (3) Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Early Childhood-Grade 12.
- (b) A teacher in an assignment for <u>Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing [Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments] must be available to students with auditory impairments.</u>
- (c) A teacher in an assignment for <u>Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing [Teacher of Students with Auditory Impairments]</u> is not required to pass the Texas Assessment of Sign Communication (TASC) or the Texas Assessment of Sign Communication-American Sign Language (TASC-ASL) in order to be assigned to a classroom in which another communication method is used predominately. If this teacher completes certification requirements through a State Board for Educator Certification-approved educator preparation program in Texas, the program must have assessed proficiency in the communication method and verified it to be at an appropriate level.

§231.710. Teacher of Students who are Deafblind

- (a) An assignment for Teacher of Students who are Deafblind is allowed with one of the following certificates.
 - (1) Deafblind Supplemental: Early Childhood–Grade 12
 - (2) Teacher of Students who are Visually Impaired
- (b) This provider will also hold certification in one or more of the following:
 - (1) Teacher of Students who are Visually Impaired
 - (2) Teacher of Students who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing

§231.711. Teacher of Gifted and Talented Students.

- (a) An assignment for Teacher of Gifted and Talented Students is allowed with one of the following.
 - (1) A teacher certificate that matches the subject and grade level of the assignment.
 - (2) Gifted and Talented Endorsement (Not required for assignment).
 - (3) Gifted and Talented Supplemental (Not required for assignment).
- (b) In addition to the requirements specified in this subchapter, individuals assigned to a gifted and talented program must comply with the provisions of Chapter 89, Subchapter A, of this title (relating to Gifted/Talented Education).

§231.713. Special Education Counseling Services; Educational Diagnostician; Speech Therapy Services; and Vocational Adjustment Coordinator.

- (a) Special Education Counseling Services.
 - (1) An assignment for Special Education Counseling Services is allowed with one of the following certificates.
 - (A) Counselor.
 - (B) School Counselor (Early Childhood-Grade 12).
 - (C) Special Education Counselor.
 - (D) Special Education Visiting Teacher.
 - (E) Vocational Counselor.
 - (2) Individuals certified or licensed to practice in other professions may be eligible to provide counseling services for students with disabilities under the scope of practice of the specific license held.
- (b) Educational Diagnostician.
 - (1) An assignment for Educational Diagnostician is allowed with an Educational Diagnostician certificate.
 - (2) Individuals certified or licensed to practice in other professions may be eligible to provide evaluative services for students with disabilities under the scope of practice of the specific license held.
- (c) Speech Therapy Services.
 - (1) An assignment for Speech Therapy Services is allowed with one of the following certificates.
 - (A) School Speech-Language Pathologist.
 - (B) Speech and Hearing Therapy.
 - (C) Speech and Language Therapy.
 - (2) Individuals licensed by the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology also may provide speech therapy services to eligible students under the scope of practice of the specific license held.
- (d) Vocational Adjustment Coordinator.
 - (1) An assignment for Vocational Adjustment Coordinator is allowed with a Special Education certificate. This assignment requires 60 clock-hours of training appropriate for the assignment.
 - (2) A teacher in an assignment for Vocational Adjustment Coordinator will have three years from the date of assignment to complete the required training.
