

Human Services Career Cluster

The Human Services career cluster focuses on preparing individuals for employment in career pathways that relate to families and human needs such as counseling and mental health services, family and community services, personal care services, and consumer services. This career cluster includes occupations ranging from community health workers to cosmetologists and nutritionists.

Statewide Program of Study: Health and Wellness

The Health and Wellness program of study focuses on occupational and educational opportunities associated with promoting physical, emotional, and mental health and wellness. This program of study incudes assisting patients in planning for their health and wellness, responding to crises, providing education or counseling, making referrals, and addressing barriers to accessing health and wellness services.
