## **HQPK Family Engagement Plan Rubric**

The Family Engagement Plan Rubric evaluates the thoroughness, intentionality, and level of completion of LEAs' HQPK Family Engagement Plans. The HQPK Family Engagement Rubric is broken into two sections:

- Required components the six areas of family engagement efforts, contact person, and contact information that a HQPK Family Engagement Plan *must* include, per statute (TAC §102.1003 & TEC §29.168)
- **TEA recommended components** additional strategies and resources that will support LEA efforts to meaningfully engage families, support their needs, and build partnerships between school, home, and community early on in a child's education

## **HQPK Family Engagement Plan Stages**

Using the above rubric, an LEA's total numerical score will determine the plan's stage of completion.

<b>Total Points</b>	Stage	Description
12-14	Exemplar	The family engagement plan contains all required components as well as most or all of the TEA recommended components
8-11	Accomplished	The family engagement plan contains all required components as well as some of the TEA recommended components
5-7	Developing	The family engagement plan does not contain all of the required components and has some of the TEA recommended components <u>or</u> the family engagement plan contains all of the required components and none of the TEA recommended components
1-4	Beginning	The family engagement plan contains 4 or fewer required components

All HQPK Family Engagement Plans should reach or exceed "accomplished" status to ensure that each LEA has developed a comprehensive and effective plan. An accomplished or exemplary plan should include specific and individualized strategies and activities to support parent and caregiver capacity to be active participants in their child's education. The TEA Early Childhood Division is available for face-to-face support or LEAs who do not have all required components in their plans, or who would like additional support to improve their family engagement plan.
