

District Responsibilities Under the Waiver

To maintain compliance and instructional quality, districts approved for the waiver must:

- Provide transportation to and from the on-campus CEHI setting, as needed.
- Serve students at home if medically indicated by a licensed practitioner.
- Preserve the intent of individualized instruction, ensuring face-to-face, eye-to-eye engagement.
- . Limit group size to a maximum 4:1 student-to-teacher ratio for on-campus CEHI.
- Ensure the four (4) hours of CEHI are met through direct, teacher-facilitated instruction rather than
 relying on self-paced computer-based programs.
- A certified teacher providing PRS for students in Special Education programs must have a certification in Special Education.
- The school system must have procedures in place to evaluate the effectiveness of the waiver toward

Latest Dropout Data

The Texas Education Agency's Division of Research and Analysis released its most recent report, *Secondary School Completion and Dropouts in Texas Public Schools*, 2022–23 (PDF), in August 2024. This comprehensive report provides key insights into student outcomes across the state.

Key Findings:

- Longitudinal Dropout Rate: For the cohort of 403,301 students in the Class of 2023, the longitudinal
 dropout rate was 6.3%. This rate reflects students who dropped out over a four-year period, from Grade 9
 through their expected graduation year.
- Annual Dropout Rate: Among the 2,579,329 students enrolled in Grades 7–12 during the 2022–33 school
 year, the annual dropout rate was 1.6%. This figure represents the percentage of students who dropped
 out during that single academic year.

Introduction

AskTED is an online directory of Texas school information, including charter schools. The directory is primarily used by people seeking contact information for schools, districts, and education service centers. AskTED is a real-time database that is updated regularly by Texas LEAs.



To that end, Texas School Districts and Open-Enrollment Charter Schools are required to have both Homeless and Foster Care Liaisons as individual designated roles for all LEAs. The information must be maintained and stored in AskTED. It is important for LEAs to keep this information regularly updated, so that McKinney-Vento and Foster Care Liaison information is publicly available, and these points of contacts are available to support students and remove barriers related to school transitions and mobility.

Submitting or Updating Liaison Information

Each LEA needs to ensure the contact information for their designated liaison is current and up to date throughout the school year. When information needs to be updated (e.g., change of designated staff, phone number, or email address), these changes need to be submitted to the AskTED database.

- For school districts, changes and/or submissions will be completed to TEA through each school district's AskTED administrator.
- · For charter schools, AskTED updates are to be emailed directly to the Charter School Division at TEA at CharterSchools@tea.state.tx.us. More information can be found here for Charter Schools.

Steps to Search for Liaison Information

There are two (2) ways to access AskTED.

1. Go to TEA Webpage → Select AskTED from Popular Applications in the dark blue menu at the



2. Navigate directly to AskTED Webpage.

When on AskTED homepage, users can use the drop-down menus at the top of the page to access the Texas Education Directory Customized Reports and Data Files. Under the 'Search by' menu, you will find searches for School, District, County, Region, and Texas.

- 5. To download the list (or desired information), click on the "Select All" purple button (or portion of information that you would like), then select "View Details".



6. Choose "Download File" to export the information into Excel (.csv file)



LEAs are required to keep Homeless and Foster Care Liaisons' information regularly updated in AskTED. Please review and update this information regularly.





AskTED (Texas Education Directory)

All School Systems must designate a Homeless and Foster Care Liaison to carry out the duties listed in the federal McKinney-Vento Act, Texas Education Code, and ESSA.

School systems must ensure their designated Liaison's contact information in AskTED is up to date throughout the school year.

Districts submit their liaison information to TEA through the district's AskTED administrator.

Charter schools submit their liaison information using the All-In-One Update Form



SB 991 – Expanded At-Risk Definition

- What Changed: Expands the definition of "at-risk students" to include those who are chronically absent and truant.
- Impact: By expanding definition of "at-risk" to include those chronically absent and truant, it provides school systems an opportunity to enhance intervention strategies and improve early identification of students.



SB 569 – Virtual Education Access

- What Changed: Replaces the Texas Virtual School Network (TXVSN) with a new framework under TEC Chapter 30B.
- Impact: The expanded access to flexible learning (virtual and hybrid learning options) can help maintain continuity for students experiencing housing instability, foster care transitions, or frequent relocations due to military service.





HB 1211 – Tuition Exemption for Former Foster Youth

- What Changed: Removes the previous age cap of 25 for tuition and fee exemptions at public institutions.
- Impact: Eligible students formerly in DFPS conservatorship can now enroll before their 27th birthday to receive free tuition and fees.



SB 226 – Residency for Child Safety Placements

- What Changed: Clarifies how residency is established for children under Parental Child Safety Placement Agreements.
- Impact: A DFPS-issued letter confirming the child's placement address serves as proof of residency for school enrollment.





➤ SB 571 – Child Abuse Reporting

- What Changed: Shortens the mandatory reporting window from 48 hours to 24 hours for professionals (educators, counselors, etc.).
- Impact: Reports of suspected abuse or neglect must be made within 24 hours to DFPS or law enforcement.

Amachi Texas Program

- Funding: Allocates \$7 million per fiscal year to support mentoring for children of incarcerated parents and other at-risk youth.
- <u>Impact</u>: Expand access to high-quality mentoring programs, enabling more at-risk youth and children of incarcerated parents to build supportive relationships that foster resilience, academic success, and emotional wellbeing.

PRS (Pregnancy Related Services) Program Information

2. What certification is needed to teach PRS courses?

Compensatory Education Home Instruction (CEHI) must be given by a certified teacher of the district. A teacher may provide CEHI instruction if they are a certified teacher. Please review Section 9 of the <u>Stud</u> Attendance Accounting Handbook.

PRS and Attendance Requirements

If an LEA serves the student vocational (VOC) services during CEHI, can the LEA report those V contact hours in PEIMS?

In order to claim VOC contact hours in PEIMS, the LEA must provide the student daily VOC instruction i comparable to the instruction on campus by a certified VOC instructor in addition to the student's regulinstruction.

2. What does the term "medical practitioner" include?

In this context, the term "medical practitioner" includes a physician, an advanced nurse practitioner, ar midwife licensed under the Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 203.

3. If a student delivered her child during the summer before school started, do we still serve her

The LEA should serve the student for the six-week period after delivery. The "six-week period" includes summer months and times outside of the traditional school year calendar.

4. If a student miscarries, can they still receive CEHI?

CEHI is allowed for students who are pregnant no matter how the pregnancy ends. Please see SAAH 9.3

5. What happens if a student comes back to campus before their six weeks of CEHI is over?

Once the student returns, any remaining CEHI is forfeited (except in unique scenarios noted below). Please communicate to all your PRS students as soon as they enter PRS that they do not have the ability to change their mind and go back to home instruction once they have returned to school during the six-week CEHI period. This is very important.

Exceptions to this rule:

- If your district has an "on campus waiver" for CEHI;
- If the student returns for testing (provided all requirements are met); or
- If the "break-in-service" option is used.

Welcome to Pregnancy Related Services (PRS)

The Texas Education Agency's Pregnancy Related Services (PRS) program is dedicated to supporting the academic success and well-being of pregnant and parenting students across Texas public schools. Housed within the Highly Mobile and At-Risk (HMAR) Student Programs Unit under the Office of Special Populations and Student Support (OSPSS), PRS provides guidance, resources, and support services that help students remain enrolled, engaged, and on track to graduate.

PRS includes both **Compensatory Education Home Instruction (CEHI)**—a required academic support for eligible students during prenatal and postpartum periods—and a range of optional support services such as counseling, health services, transportation, and parenting education. These services are designed to address the unique challenges faced by pregnant and parenting students, ensuring they receive equitable access to education and the resources needed to thrive.

By empowering districts to implement comprehensive PRS programs, TEA aims to reduce dropout risks, promote student resilience, and foster long-term academic and personal success.


Beginning of the Year Reminders

- Update Foster Care Liaison contact info in AskTED

Designated Points of Contact for Students in Foster Care TEA





Designated Points of Contact for Students in Foster Care

ESSA requires designated points of contact for child welfare and education agencies to support school stability for students in foster care (i.e., education best-interest, transportation coordination).

Every year, the local child welfare agency must notify the local education agency (LEA) of their child welfare point of contact. After this notification is received, the LEA is required to inform the local child welfare agency of their designated point of contact in writing. The Texas Department of Family Protective Services (DFPS) Educational Specialist serves as the Child Welfare Point of Contact for ESSA purposes. Similarly, the LEA Point of Contact for ESSA, in most instances, is the LEA Foster Care Liaison. The chart below maps an annual communication process and timeline for when Points of Contact notifications occur.

Additional information about the Education and Child Welfare ESSA Points of Contact can be found in the Foster Care & Student Success Guide, Chapter 8.

DFPS Education Specialist Communication to LEAs

AUGUST:

DFPS Education Specialist sends email to the LEA Foster Care Liaison contact identified in AskTED (includes both districts and open-enrollment charter schools),

7-10 DAYS:

Upon receipt, the LEA responds to the DFPS Education Specialist with the name of the LEA Foster Care Point of Contact (who in most instances is the LEA Foster Care Liaison).

1 WEEK FOLLOW-UP:

If no response from the LEA after 10 days, DFPS resends the introduction email to the LEA Foster Care Liaison, If communication is not received back from the LEA, DFPS may contact the LEA Administration/Superintendent's Office, to receive the necessary contact information of the LEA Foster Care Point of Contact.

EXPECTATIONS:

DFPS Education Specialists will communicate via email to the LEA annually and identify themselves as the point of contact, provide their contact information to the Foster Care Liaison as a resource for any questions or concerns involving students in foster care. It is the expectations that the LEA will respond promptly with the corresponding LEA ESSA Foster Care Point of Contact information. DFPS Education Specialists should be the first point of contact to resolve any issues related to students in foster care.



LEA Foster Care Point of Contact Communication to DFPS Education Specialist

AUGUST:

Receives an email from DFPS Education Specialist identifying themselves as the point of contact for questions related to students in foster care.

7-10 DAYS:

Responds to the DFPS Education Specialist with the name of the ESSA Point of Contact for their LEA. (In instances, where the LEA has designated individual campus contacts for Foster Care, also include this information in the LEA's correspondence communication with DFPS).

1 WEEK FOLLOW-UP:

If DFPS does not hear back from the LEA Foster Care Liaison, they will re-send the information and follow-up within 10 days. If they still do not hear back, they may contact the LEA Administration/Superintendent's office to request this information.

EXPECTATIONS:

LEAs are required to ensure that the Foster Care Liaison in AskTED is up to date annually. This should occur prior to August for the upcoming school year. DFPS will utilize the Foster Care Liaison contact information in AskTED to notify the LEA of the ESSA Child Welfare Point of Contact (i.e. DFPS Education Specialist). LEAs are to respond promptly, in writing, to the DFPS Education Specialist with the LEA Foster Care Point of Contact and utilize the DFPS Education Specialist for any questions or concerns related to students in foster care throughout the school year.





HB 6 Updates for Out-of-School Suspension (OSS):

- Out-of-School Suspension (OSS) for Students experiencing homelessness and below Grade 3
- HB 6 permits **OSS** for **up to 3 days** but only under specific conditions outlined in TEC §37.005(c). Conditions include:
 - conduct involving weapons, drugs, or alcohol
 - threats to the immediate health and safety of others
 - documented repeated or significant classroom disruption.
 - selling, giving, or delivering to another person or possessing, using, or being under the influence of any amount of: marihuana or a controlled substance, a dangerous drug, or an alcoholic beverage.
- In extenuating circumstances, parents of students below grade 3 or experiencing homelessness may request a switch to in-school suspension (ISS) if they cannot supervise their child during OSS.





Legislative Updates



HB 2757 – Enrollment Flexibility for Foreign Military Families

- Allows school districts to admit children of active-duty foreign military personnel even if they don't meet the age requirement at the start of the school year, as long as they reach the required age during that year.
- This policy is **optional for districts** and aims to support military families stationed in Texas without imposing financial or administrative burdens.

HB 120 – Military Readiness & Accountability

- Recognizes JROTC as part of Career and Technology Education (CTE).
- Creates a Military Pathway Grant Program
- Expands post-graduation support



Beginning of the Year Reminders

- Identify Military Connected Students (MCS) via PEIMS coding
- Ensure MCS are enrolled in appropriate academic programming (e.g., GT, SPED, AP, etc.)
- Review the Interstate Compact (TEC §162) with all staff
- Ensure district & campus Military Family webpages are updated with fall enrollment/registration resources, calendars, and supports
- Schedule & provide district & campus PD on supporting MCS
- Host beginning of the year transition meetings with students to include: building tours, transcript review services, graduation plans, extracurriculars, clubs and activities, etc.
