Students who participate in services designed for gifted/talented students will <u>demonstrate skills in self-directed learning, thinking, research and</u> <u>communication as evidenced by the development of innovative</u> <u>products and performances</u> that reflect individuality and creativity and are advanced in relation to students of similar age, experience, or environment.

High school graduates who have participated in services for gifted/talented students will have produced products and performances of professional quality as part of their program services.



No Gifted/Talented Education Bills Passed

SB 2403

 Relating to required reporting regarding a school district's program for gifted and talented students.

HB 3759

 Relating to a universal screening process for a school district's program for gifted and talented students.

HCR 8/SCR 9

 Designating the first full week in April as Gifted and Talented Students Week for a 10-year period ending in 2033.

Senate Bill 2124

- Middle School Advanced Mathematics Program
 - Increase number of students completing advanced mathematics courses in high school
 - Each LEA shall develop an advanced mathematics program designed for eighth graders to enroll in Algebra I
 - Automatic enrollment in advanced mathematics course who performed in the top 40 percent on:
 - Fifth grade STAAR Math
 - A local measure that includes the student's fifth grade class ranking or a demonstrated proficiency in the fifth-grade course work
 - Parent may opt out of automatic enrollment

Access to G/T Services

- 1. Students in grades K–12 shall be assessed and, if identified, provided gifted/talented services (TEC §29.122 and 19 TAC §89.1(3)). (2.16)
- 2. Final determination of students' need for gifted/talented services is made by a committee of at least three (3) local district or campus educators who have received training in the nature and needs of gifted/talented students and who have met and reviewed the individual student data (19 TAC §89.1(4)). (2.26)
- 3. Identified gifted/talented students are assured an array of learning opportunities that are commensurate with their abilities and that emphasize content in the four (4) foundation curricular areas. Services are available during the school day as well as the entire school year. Parents are informed of these options (19 TAC §89.3(3)) (3.1).
- 4. Gifted/talented students are ensured opportunities to work together as a group, work with other students, and work independently during the school day as well as the entire school year as a direct result of gifted/talented service options (19 TAC §89.3(1)). (3.4)
- 5. An array of appropriately challenging learning experiences in each of the four (4) foundation curricular areas is provided for gifted/talented students in grades K–12, and parents are informed of the opportunities (19 TAC §89.3). (4.1)




Emerging Bilingual SPED STAAR – Did Not Meet Other??








There has been a consistent growth in both EB/EL and in ESL students that are also gifted and talented students.


