

# The number of students served through special education continues to increase year over year.






## Increase in special education identification



**Special education identification continues to increase**, while the student population in Texas does not show the same increases, and in some years, decreases.





Note: Graphs are not on the same scale this is to show the change in student populations year over year.

## Special Education and Section 504




Beginning this year, the population of students served through special education and the students served through Section 504 accommodation plans make up almost one-fourth of the student population in Texas. This is almost a 10% increase of the combined two (SPED and 504) since 2018-2019.





### Special Education Evaluations Serve as a Leading Indicator for Total Special **Education Representation**






### Students identified with dyslexia continues to increase.



In the past 5 years, there has been an almost 70% increase of students identified with dyslexia. Additionally, the percent of students with dyslexia and served through special education has more than doubled since the 2018-19 school year.




### Students identified with dyslexia continues to increase.



Beginning this year, more students with dyslexia are served through special education than Section 504. Since the 2018-2019 school year, there has been more than a 25% decrease for students with dyslexia being served in Section 504 to now almost a 30% increase in students with dyslexia being served through special education.


#### **2018-2019 School Year**

#### **2023-2024 School Year**


329,247 Total Students with Dyslexia

# Dyslexia Rule and Handbook Adopted by SBOE



- Dyslexia instruction is considered a special education service. In other words,
  if a student is identified with dyslexia and is determined to need specific
  dyslexia instruction/intervention, this is considered specially designed
  instruction that would lead to eligibility for special education services.
- SBOE did not alter TEA guidance that all students receiving dyslexia instruction under a Section 504 plan must be evaluated/re-evaluated as soon as possible but no later than by the end of the 2024-2025 school year if they continue to need direct dyslexia instruction.
- If a student does not need, or no longer needs, direct dyslexia instruction/intervention but does require the use of instructional accommodations because of dyslexia, a Section 504 accommodation plan could remain or be put in place by a Section 504 committee.

# Dyslexia Rule and Handbook Adopted by SBOE




Professional with specific knowledge regarding the reading process, dyslexia and related disorders, and dyslexia instruction must be a part of the evaluation team when dyslexia is a suspected disability. This person must also be a part of an admission, review, and dismissal (ARD) committee when determining eligibility for special education and related services. This person must be either:

- A licensed dyslexia therapist (LDT);
- Someone with the most advanced dyslexia related certification (this is defined in the handbook but is someone like a certified academic language therapist [CALT]); or
- If the first two are not available, someone who completes the training identified in the handbook (Texas Dyslexia Academy courses, training on the evaluation process for specific learning disabilities)
