

TEA Resource List of Evidence-Based Dyslexia Programs

When a student is identified with dyslexia and is determined to need dyslexia instruction, State Board of Education (SBOE) rule located at 19 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §74.28, which includes the Dyslexia Handbook (Handbook), requires the provision of evidence-based dyslexia instruction. The first consideration for this type of instruction is the use of an evidence-based dyslexia program that meets the required instruction and delivery components described in the Handbook.

In May 2024, in an effort to produce a resource list, the Office of Special Populations and Student Supports (OSPSS) at the Texas Education Agency (TEA) posted an opportunity for dyslexia program publishers to submit certain materials to OSPSS regarding their program to be scored by TEA by this rubric.

Local educational agencies (LEAs), which include school districts and open-enrollment charter schools, are not required to choose from this list, but each LEA nevertheless must ensure the evidence-based dyslexia program used in the LEA meets all requirements of law and SBOE rule, including the Handbook. LEAs must be able to discuss in admission, review, and dismissal (ARD) committee meetings and provide documentation through the review and monitoring process how programs used in the LEA comply with law and rule requirements.

The following programs scored the minimum requirements according to the rubric used by OSPSS. This list is not intended to imply, nor should it be considered an endorsement of these programs, nor does the list imply that these programs are superior to others that are available for purchase. The list should be considered solely a resource for LEAs who choose to use this as a starting place as they begin their process of procuring an evidence-based dyslexia program for use in their LEA.
