#### **Our Mission**

- At least one professional archeologist, one professional historian, and one professional architect with preservation expertise
- Governor-appointed Chair
- Commission-elected Vice Chair and Secretary


- National Historic Preservation Act of 1966

# National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 Reviews

 Determine if historic and archeological sites in local communities will be affected by federal actions, and avoid or mitigate those effects

 Archeology, History Programs & Architecture reviewers complete 13,000+ reviews per year







#### National Register of Historic Places (NRHP)

Texas has more than 3,000 NRHP listings, including more than 350 districts that include 30,000+ contributing resources.

To be eligible for the NRHP, properties must:

- Be at least 50 years old
- Meet established preservation criteria



## **Certified Local Government Program (CLG)**

A federal program administered by THC to provide guidance and support to city or county governments carrying out historic preservation activities

Participating communities qualify for pass-through funding from THC














#### **Federal Rehabilitation Tax Credit**

Provides a federal income tax credit equal to 20% of project costs



## **Texas State Antiquities Code reviews**

- Analyze proposed work at significant archeological sites and on designated buildings
- Provide permits for projects

# **Texas Historic Preservation Tax Credit**

Provides a state franchise or insurance premium tax credit equal to 25% of project costs




#### **Easements and Deed Covenants**

- THC holds easements and covenants to protect state investment in historic properties given grants
- Many covenants protect federal historic properties no longer owned by the federal government

#### Recent federal grant:

- Partially funded two-year project to document condition of over 220 sites
- Established a new monitoring program and web application, currently under development



#### **Texas Historic Courthouse Preservation Program**

- Since 1999, largest preservation grant program enacted by a state
- Up to \$6 Million Awarded Per Recipient with a Minimum Local Match of 15%
- Nearly \$350M Awarded Since 1999 for Planning, Emergency & Full Restoration
- Over \$300M in Local Matches Contributed
- 146+ Participating Counties & Municipalities
- 75 Full Restorations Funded &
   73 Participants Still Awaiting Funding





#### **Disaster Assistance Program**

Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Maria Emergency Supplemental Historic Preservation Fund



- HIM ESHPF
- Administered by the National Park Service
- Grant awarded in 2019
- Extends five years to 2024
- Property owners in 41
   FEMA designated
   counties were eligible
   to apply for subgrants







#### **Texas Historic Highways Program**

Created in 2009 to identify, designate, interpret, and market historic Texas highways across the state

- Encourages diverse topics for markers











## **The Texas Main Street Program**
