Focus Area 1: Hempstead ISD implemented a new pathway, Welding and Brazing, in the 2023-2024 school year. The program was created in response to community and student surveys, industry needs, and the data presented by the Texas Workforce Commission. Metalwork is predicted to have a 20.2-24.9% growth in the Gulf Coast region by 2030 and is designated as a high-growth, high-wage career field by the Texas Workforce Commission in their October 2023 report on the Gulf Region.

The mission of Hempstead High School is " In partnership with our families and community, HHS is committed to developing a welcoming and structured environment in which college and career-ready students create, collaborate, communicate and critically think."

To provide our students with career-ready focused programming with a community foundation. Hempstead ISD would like to expand on last year's highly successful Summer Bridge Program. Last year 14 students completed their Introduction to Welding coursework and 13 earned their NCCER Core certification. We would like to offer this opportunity again through our partnership with Blinn College and expand opportunities for students to take Welding 1 during the summer and take their AWS certification test. We would also like to engage community businesses and solicit proposals for other industry-based certification opportunities that are offered in Waller County.

Summary of Program (Focus Area 2)

Focus Area 2: Hempstead ISD recently completed a 5-year strategic plan. Goal 1 of that plan states: "Hempstead ISD will provide the tools and resources to support effective teaching and learning that fosters communication, engagement, and critical thinking."

The first strategy listed under Goal 1 is "Create engaging environments for students across all levels that lead to hands-on real-world application". The second strategy listed under Goal 1 is "Create a plan for ensuring each student is provided customized Jearning opportunities."

In support of this goal and utilizing both strategies, Hempstead ISD would like to grow its paid summer internship from work-based learning positions based solely in the district (Summer 2023) to work-based learning positions that are developed in partnership with local businesses and non-profit organizations. The summer program would be structured based on the Texas Work-Based Learning Framework. Students would complete an employability skills training then they would work in local businesses and non-profits where students can apply theoretical concepts learned in the classroom to real-world scenarios, reinforcing their understanding of academic subjects.

The CTE summer program bridges the gap between theory and practice, allowing students to see the relevance of their studies in a professional setting. It also exposes students to diverse tasks and challenges, enhancing both technical and soft skills, and contributing to a well-rounded skill set. Students will have the opportunity to establish connections with professionals and mentors in their chosen field. Networking can be a valuable resource for future job opportunities, advice, and guidance. Building a professional network early on can open doors to internships, scholarships, and other educational opportunities. Additionally, participation in a summer work-based learning program adds valuable experience to students' resumes. It sets them apart from their peers when applying for college or future employment.

Goal #1: 15 students will earn credit for Introduction to Welding by the end of July 2024.

Goal #2: 15 students will earn their NCCER Core Certification in the Introduction to Welding summer course.

Goal #3: 15 students will participate in an IBC preparatory course and IBC assessment provided by a community partner identified through an RFP process.

CTE Summer Bridge students will engage in a 4-week intensive course course focused on mastering TEKS and experiential learning.

The objectives of the program are:

-Foster a mindset of safety in students (NCCER)

-Build foundational knowledge of metallurgy concepts (TEKS and lab activities)

-Build community partnerships with the RFP process and secure new resources for IBC preparation for our students.

-Provide career and post-secondary advising to students (local IHE partnership)

Goals, Objectives, and Strategies (Focus Area 2)

Goal: By the end of summer 2024, 20 high school CTE students will have completed 80 hours of paid, work-based learning aligned with the primary program of study.

The objectives of this program are:

-Bolster employability through training and mentorship

-Facilitate stronger community connections through strategic student placements in local businesses and non-profit organizations.

-Encourage post-secondary exploration via trade school, college, and industry tours.

-Practice interview skills with mock interviews.

-Complete a resume, cover letter, and personal finance project.

-Pay students between \$12.00 and \$15.00 per hour based on whether their position requires them to already hold a certification.

Hempstead ISD is anticipating 20-25 students participating in the Summer Internship Program. HISD will utilize the local Chamber of Commerce and Workforce Solutions to find placements for our students with local businesses. The first week of the program students will attend a training on employability skills before reporting to their internship sites.

Summative assessments: NCCER Certification, Introduction to Welding final exam, Final Skills Check, and career research project.

- Percentage of participating students who earn credit for the course.
- -The percentage of participating students who earn an IBC in their CTE pathway.
- The number of students who sign up for Level 2 CTE courses following their participation in the Summer Bridge program.

Hempstead ISD will use the awarded grant funds to pay for the Summer Internship Program. There are no funds allocated for these programs locally, however, we are looking to partner with local businesses in a cost-sharing program via MOU. Students will be paid by the school district but there will be a 50/50 split between the district and the business with each entity paying \$6.00 per hour to each student. Non-profit organizations will not pay the students and they will be paid by the school district utilizing grant funds.

Need #1: Metal Workers in the Gulf Coast region

The summer bridge program is designed to accelerate students' progress toward an AWS certification and allow them to participate in a Work Based Learning program in their junior and senior years. Metalwork, as an industry, is projected to have a 20.2-24.9% growth in the Gulf Coast Region by 2030. Welders, structural steel workers, and braziers are all designated as high-growth, high-wage careers by the Texas Workforce Commission.

Need #2: Opportunities for students to earn CTE Credit outside of the traditional school day

Based on the data presented in the 2022 Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment our district is below the state average for the percentage of students who are CTE Completers. (Texas averages 37% and Hempstead averages 28%) The CLNA committee looked into this issue and found that many students have to choose between taking CTE courses and participating in activities such as band, theater, or athletics due to the limited number of class periods they have available for electives.

Need #1: Transportation

Based on Hempstead ISD's 2022 Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment Committee's SWOT analysis and parent/student survey results, students' access to transportation is the most limiting factor in their participation in work-based learning opportunities. Only 5% of students (16+) have a personal vehicle and only 28% of students (16+) have a family vehicle that they can access for consistent transportation to a work site.

Need #2: Limited spots on student schedules

The CLNA Committee review of student surveys found that many eligible students who have completed their CTE Pathways through Level 3 coursework do not participate in our work-based learning program due to remediation for EOC courses or participation in band, theater, and athletics limiting the number of available class periods they have on their schedules. The requirements of 2-3 class periods limit the participation in work-based learning aligned to their program of study.

We are hoping to place 20 students for 80 hours of work.

HISD will utilize the WBL framework. Students will complete a one-week employability skills training before beginning their internships.
