PROGRAM OVERVIEW: In the upcoming 2023-2024 summer, Zapata County Independent School District (ZCISD) aims to provide 15 students with valuable work-based opportunities. The primary goal is to equip these students with essential employability skills, facilitate a smooth transition from education to the workforce, and empower them to secure jobs with higher median annual earnings while also encouraging further education.

MISSION and SPECIFIC NEEDS: ZCISD's mission is clear: "We will provide learning experiences and leadership opportunities to ensure a culture of excellence for all." This mission holds utmost significance, especially considering the economic challenges faced by a significant portion of our community. With an economically disadvantaged rate of 87.1% and all 3,373 students labeled as Title 1, over half of our student population falls under the AT-RISK category. To break the cycle of poverty, our district is committed to addressing these challenges by offering a clear pathway for students to pursue meaningful careers with higher median annual earnings.

HOW WE ADDRESS THE MISSION AND NEEDS: To fulfill our mission and meet the specific needs of our students, ZCISD is introducing targeted work-based learning opportunities in two key career pathways:

1. Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) (1 priority point):

- Opportunity: Students will engage in a 4-week immersive paid internship and simulated work experience under the guidance of an HVAC certified technician.

- Activities: Participants will be involved in the regular inspection of HVAC systems, cleaning/replacing air filters, belts, and other components. They will also diagnose and repair malfunctions/breakdowns, working closely with other maintenance or facility management professionals.

2. Welding:

- Opportunity: Students will have the chance to participate in a 4-week paid internship to learn the fundamentals of welding through project-based learning.

- Activities: Participants will clean and prepare metal surfaces for joining, perform welding based on project blueprints, inspect completed welds to ensure they meet quality standards and specifications, and adhere to safety protocols while wearing appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

By providing these targeted opportunities, ZCISD is committed to breaking barriers, fostering skill development, and paving the way for a brighter future for our students.

FOCUS 2 - GOALS/OBJECTIVES: The primary OBJECTIVES of the Focus Area 2 Program for the 2023-2024 summer CTE grant revolve around equipping students with essential job skills for a smooth transition from education to the professional realm. Our GOAL is to involve 15 students in programs focused on HVAC, Agriculture, and Welding. Collaborating with district departments and our skilled teachers, students will gain hands-on experience in these fields, fostering the knowledge and expertise needed for rewarding careers with increased median annual earnings.

ACTIVITIES/STRATEGIES: To support the district's objectives, the work-based learning program will implement the following STRATEGIES: Collaborate with ZCISD Maintenance Department (endorsed by a Letter of Support attached) and ZCISD CTE Department (endorsed by a Letter of Support attached) to create a learning schedule beneficial for both students and partners. Provide financial compensation for students participating in the program and offer transportation to and from the business site, if necessary. (Earn 2 Priority points for 2 Letters of Support).

Throughout the work-based learning initiative, students will engage in practical ACTIVITIES such as inspecting and performing routine maintenance on HVAC systems and preparing and inspecting sheet metal for joining in Welding. In preparation for the 2023-2024 Summer Career and Technology Education (CTE) grant, Zapata County ISD undertook a thorough evaluation of the district's requirements, objectives, and key milestones to ensure its readiness to implement the Summer CTE program. The proposed budget for Focus Area 2 is detailed below:

1. PAYROLL (\$12,100): This allocation covers teacher stipends, compensation for professional staff overseeing the Focus 2 program, and employee benefits.

2. PROFESSIONAL AND CONTRACTED SERVICES (\$5,240): Funds are earmarked for supporting data collection and analysis related to work-based learning activities.

3. SUPPLIES AND MATERIALS (\$6,900): Allocated to procure necessary supplies and materials for hands-on training and projects for Focus 2 students.

4. OTHER OPERATING EXPENSES (\$25,000): This category includes funds for transportation to work sites, covering vehicle maintenance, gas mileage, and expenses associated with paid internships.

5. INDIRECT COSTS (\$760): This allocation is reserved for overhead expenses based on Zapata County ISD's approved indirect rate.

SNAPSHOT OF FUNDS: The district does not currently provide paid internship opportunities. However, existing funds cover facilities, buses, cafeteria personnel, computers/software, and classrooms. Local funds cover facilities and maintenance, state transportation funds cover transportation-related expenses, state funds are allocated for summer food, and the state allotment for technology covers the hardware/software products.

ADJUSTMENTS TO MEET FUTURE NEEDS: ZCISD is proactively pursuing additional grant funds, seeking donations, garnering board support for sustained services, and strategically aligning current funding streams. These efforts are aimed at ensuring that our financial resources effectively contribute to achieving the goals outlined in the grant, fostering a successful and impactful summer CTE program.

A significant 87.1% of our students face economic disadvantages, with all 3,373 students falling under Title 1, and more than half falling into the AT-RISK category. These economic challenges not only create difficulties for students in terms of transportation outside regular school hours but also emphasize the urgent need for immediate intervention and programs guiding them towards lucrative, high-demand career paths.

ADDRESSING THESE CHALLENGES: To effectively tackle these pressing issues, the district has formulated a comprehensive grant budget. This budget will secure essential funding to transport students to and from partnering businesses. Furthermore, funds will be allocated to compensate students for their involvement in summer work-based learning opportunities. This strategic approach aims to ensure that students graduate with the employment skills necessary for success in well-paying jobs, directly addressing the specific needs highlighted by these statistics.

This program places a strong emphasis on collaboration with both district and industry partners, recognizing their pivotal role in shaping students' career paths.

ZCISD, located in a remote town away from major businesses, aims to provide valuable opportunities for 15 students through work-based learning modules in HVAC and Sheet Metal Welding. Aligned with the goals of Focus Area 2, our district has garnered support from industry professionals, earning us 2 priority points in our grant application. Mr. Luis Mendoza, a certified HVAC technician with ZCISD Maintenance, and Mr. Daniel Garcia from ZCISD CTE Department have provided signed letters of support, showcasing the community's endorsement.

The Work-Based Learning Program at Zapata County ISD will focus on two key initiatives:

1. Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC): Students will actively engage in the inspection, cleaning, and repair of HVAC systems. This hands-on experience involves diagnosing malfunctions, collaborating with maintenance professionals, and gaining practical skills in HVAC maintenance.

2. Welding: Students will prepare metal surfaces, perform welding based on project blueprints, and ensure welds meet quality standards. Emphasizing safety protocols and the use of personal protective equipment, students will gain valuable experience in welding practices.

This immersive learning experience transcends traditional education, emphasizing practical skill acquisition.
