The budget consists of staffing for a CTE teacher to over see the summer program at \$30 per hour. The teacher will work a total of 68 hours during the summer for a total of \$2,040. The program will be offered to 30 students who will be paid \$7.25 per hour for a total of 152 hours during the summer for a total of \$33,060. Travel is a concern in our district, so Hardin ISD will offer transportation to one community-supported location on the north end of the district for those students who are employeed by the district for a total of \$1,000.

Adjustments may need to be made to attract businesses to ensure a wide-range of opportunties for students to engage in work-based learning experiences. The student minimum wage may need to be increased to attract additional interest by students and to serve as a competitive advantage to local businesses for hiring student workers.
