ESCR19 is dedicated to promoting educational equity and ensuring that all students have access to high-quality education. Our mission as it pertains to this Program Model Implementation grant is to empower Emergent Bilinguals (EBs) to achieve academic excellence, linguistic proficiency, and socio-cultural competence, fostering a sense of belonging and inclusion within the educational system though professional development and technical assistance for educators and community stakeholders. Our organization recognizes several specific needs related to EBs within our community: Limited English Proficiency: Many EBs face language barriers that hinder their academic progress and social integration. Cultural Sensitivity: Schools often struggle to create inclusive environments that respect and celebrate the diverse backgrounds of EBs. Access to Support Services: EBs need tailored support services, including language instruction and socio-emotional support, to excel in school. Parent and Community Engagement: Engaging EB families and the broader community is essential for fostering a supportive educational environment. Our grant-funded program aims to: Improve English language proficiency and academic performance among EB students. Promote cultural sensitivity and inclusion within school communities. Provide EBs with access to comprehensive support services. Facilitate parent and community engagement in EB education.

#### B. Qualifications and Experience for Key Personnel

ESCR19 is qualified as an organization to take on this strategic work. The ESC has been successfully working with the third cycle of the grant for Certification Prep: Serving Emergent Bilingual Students. We serve an area of the state where Emergent Bilingual students are successful in completing coursework, performance on standardized testing, high direct to college enrollment, persistence while in college, and ready to undertake careers in an evolving post-pandemic environment. The personnel and collaboration between departments at ESCR19 is strong. Academic, Instruction, & School Support (AISS) together with Technology Services have worked together to build capacity for instructional, grant management, media services, and accessibility staff. We consistently work on several grants simultaneously fulfilling and exceed grant deliverables producing materials and training that are being used statewide across Texas. Staff working to serve EBs has undertaken Bilingual Certification for themselves to ensure that the materials and training produced are effective and aimed at supporting and producing the most bilingual educators as possible. The ESC staff has a drive, passion, and experience for this work to train and build capacity in others, expanding efforts not only to fulfill grant deliverables, but to ignite other communities. EBs can thrive with the right supports, and ESCR19 is vested in working with educators to effectively serve these students.

#### C. Goals, Objectives and Strategies

1. Describe the major goals/objectives of the proposed program. What activities/strategies will be implemented to meet those goals/objectives?

Goal 1: Language Proficiency Development- Objective To help EBs achieve proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English. Activities/Strategies: English language immersion: Providing ample opportunities for students to use English in various contexts. Structured language instruction via the six state-approved program models. Language assessments: Regularly assessing students' language skills to track progress and adjust instruction accordingly. Goal 2: Academic Achievement- Objective: To ensure EBs succeed academically across all subject areas. Activities/Strategies: Modified curriculum: Adapting instructional materials and approaches to accommodate EBs language abilities. Small-group instruction: Offering targeted support for EB learners in core subjects. Tutoring and homework assistance: Providing additional academic support outside regular class hours. Goal: Cultural Integration and Awareness- Objective: To help EBs integrate into the school community and develop an understanding and appreciation of their host culture. Activities/Strategies: Cultural sensitivity training: Providing training to teachers and staff to better understand the cultural backgrounds of EBs. Cross-cultural activities: Organizing events that celebrate different cultures and encourage interaction among students. Peer mentoring: Pairing EBs with native speakers to facilitate cultural exchange. Program is to be done at the macro level as ToTs for ESCs, districts, and campuses.

Examples include: 1. Program Model Teacher Training: EB competency PD: Comprehensive training for teachers specifically focused on working with EBs. Endorsement courses: Additional coursework or certifications to equip mainstream teachers with Program Model strategies. 2. Cultural Competence Training: Cross-cultural awareness workshops: Training on understanding and respecting diverse cultural backgrounds to create an inclusive classroom environment. Anti-bias training: Addressing biases and stereotypes to ensure equitable treatment of all students. 3. Language Acquisition and Development Training: Language development workshops: Focusing on how EB students acquire language skills and strategies to support their progress. 4. Individualized Education Plan (IEP) Training: IEP implementation workshops: Training special education teachers and support staff to create and implement effective IEPs for EB students with special needs. 5. Parent Engagement Training: Parent-teacher conference workshops: Equipping educators with effective communication strategies to engage with parents of EB students. Family literacy programs: Supporting parents in helping their children with English language development at home. 6. Assessment and Data-Driven Instruction Training: EB assessment workshops: Training on conducting language assessments and using data to inform instruction. Differentiated instruction training: Teaching educators how to adapt lessons to meet the varied needs of EBs.

Other metrics that are planned to be implemented that are program specific include: teacher and parent evaluations, attendance and engagement metrics, graduation rates, post-secondary success such as direct to college enrollment, CCMR accountability metrics, satisfaction surveys, and longitudinal studies. Collecting feedback from EB students and their families about their satisfaction with the Program can provide insights into program effectiveness and areas for improvement. These performance measures are intended to be used in combination to provide a holistic picture of EB students' progress and the effectiveness of EB education programs. It's important for ECR19 staff working with this program to regularly review and analyze these measures to make informed decisions and continually improve the support provided to EBs.

The budget has been carefully designed to ensure that we have qualified personnel to effectively implement and deliver the program. This includes salaries and benefits for key roles in professional and support positions. We leverage existing resources and hire additional staff as needed. These individuals will be responsible for delivering high-quality professional development, technical assistance, providing socio-emotional support, conducting cultural competency training, and engaging with parents and the community. To meet the program's instructional needs, a significant portion of the budget is allocated to supplies and materials. This includes textbooks, software licenses, classroom supplies, cultural competency training materials, and resources for community engagement events. These materials are essential for creating a conducive learning environment and promoting cultural sensitivity. The travel budget is set aside to build statewide capacity with other ESCs, districts, and campuses, while facilitating community outreach and engagement efforts. Funds have been allocated for program evaluation and reporting. This will ensure that we have the necessary resources to measure the program's effectiveness, collect data on student outcomes, and assess the impact of grant funds will be primarily allocated as follows: Instruction and support services: 40%; Outreach, media, and marketing: 40%; Material refinement and development: 10%; Program evaluation and reporting: 10%.

ESCR19 philosophy of offering robust statewide professional development opportunities for educators working with EB program implementation is grounded in the belief that equitable access to high-quality education is a fundamental right for all students, regardless of their linguistic background. Below are the key principles and values that underpin this philosophy: Equity and Inclusion: We firmly believe that every student deserves an equitable and inclusive education. To achieve this, educators must have the knowledge and skills to effectively support EB students, coach, and foster a sense of belonging and pride in students' heritage. Professional Growth: We believe that educators are lifelong learners. Providing robust professional development opportunities is essential to empower educators with the tools and strategies they need to meet the unique needs of emergent bilingual students. Culturally Responsive Pedagogy: Educators should be trained in culturally responsive teaching practices that consider the cultural context of emergent bilingual students. This approach helps create a more inclusive and relevant learning environment.

Formalizing systems of collaboration at ESCR19 to drive the intended deliverables of this grant involves establishing structured processes, protocols, and frameworks to enhance teamwork, communication, and coordination within an organization or among multiple entities. This will take place via the following steps: Identify the purpose and goals- clearly define the purpose and objectives of the collaboration. Having a shared vision is essential. Selection of the right key personnel: Identify the individuals, teams, or organizations that will participate in the collaboration. Ensure that they have the expertise and resources necessary to contribute effectively. Establish leadership and roles: Leadership roles and responsibilities will be assigned within the collaboration. We will clearly define who will lead, facilitate, and manage various aspects of the collaboration. Create a collaborative governance structure: Develop a formal governance structure that outlines decision-making processes, authority, and accountability within the collaboration such as a steering committee. WE will leverage multiple channels by using a mix of marketing channels, including social media, email marketing, website promotion, direct mail, and conferences, to reach our target audiences. ESCR19 will partner with educational organizations to amplify your reach and credibility. Influencer Engagement: We will identify educational influencers or experts who can endorse and promote the resource tools within the education community. Content Marketing: ESCR19 will develop and share informative content related to the resource tools through blogs, articles, videos, and webinars to establish ESCR19 and this Program as a thought leader. Our goal is to also eventually gather testimonials and case studies. Support for our stakeholders, evaluation, and continuous improvement are integral parts of the success of an effective plan to market these PD tools.

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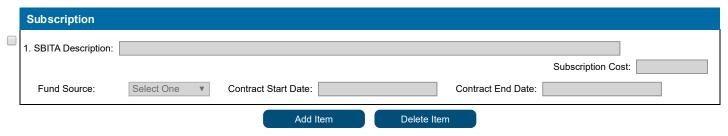

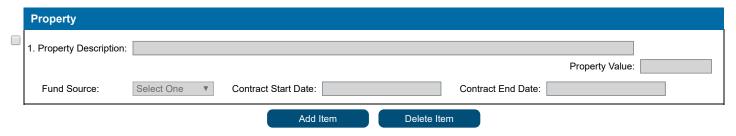
