# Stipend Recipient Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs)

McAllen ISD will establish two different MOUs for the GYO Cycle 6 program: LEA v Candidate and LEA v EPP. Both MOU's will be in place on or before May 31, 2023. Each recipient will receive a stipend and/or scholarship in the amount of \$7,500 paid out in two installments August 2023 and February 2024. Each recipient will supply McAllen ISD's Accounting department with original receipts for said educational expenses prior to receiving their reimbursement.

McAllen ISD MOU v Candidate:

Each recipient will fulfill the following requirements:

Fulfill all requirements of the TEA Cycle 6 GYO grant

Accept all interview requests in said certification area up to an offer of employment

Agree not to enter into a contract with another Texas or out of state ISD

Teach full time in the area of their certification for three consecutive years after completion of their EPP program starting with the 2025-2026 school year

As of the grant start date (February 9, 2023) candidates must have been employed as a instructional aide within the eligible LEA during the 2022-2023 school year, candidates may not be new employees of the district in the 2023-2024 school year Receive Board approval for employment as a teacher

McAllen ISD ' s MOU v EPP will contain the following:

School District agrees to:

Recruit and select at least one and no more than 6 instructional aides who will earn a teacher certification within the grant period;

Will provide the appropriate stipend to participating instructional aides;

Will secure an MOU in which the candidate commits to remain in the LEA for an agreed upon length of time as a condition of receiving the stipend;

Will provide job-embedded training, flexibility of training locations and schedules, a cohort approach, and consistent supports the encourage persistence and sustainability;

Attend all Program related trainings and/or meetings, including those required by TEA;

Gather, compile, and report data as outlined in the TEA Program Guidelines, as well as any other TEA fiscal or data requirements; and

Work closely with EPP to build a long and sustainable partnership that continues after the Program ends.
