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1. Describe how the LEA will support campus(es) in carrying out school improvement activities, including how the LEA will help develop a Targeted Improvement Plan for the eligible campus(es) selected for this grant.

Laredo ISD will continue to provide extensive instructional leadership to eligible middle school campus in carrying out support and improvement activities that close achievement gaps and foster student learning. The district will aim to strengthen campus systems, build campus staff capacity, improve school outcomes, and continue implementation and support of the campus improvement efforts. The district has assisted the campus in conducting a self-assessment that included evaluating the implementation of the five essential actions included in the Effective School Framework: Strong School Leadership and Planning, Effective, Well-Supported Teachers, Positive School Culture, Quality Instruction and Effective Instruction to identify focus areas. Cigarroa Middle continues to need improvement in the area of effective instruction, specifically on objective-driven daily lesson plans with formative assessments and building strong school leadership and planning. Our goal is to increase classroom rigor by planning and executing quality instruction that includes differentiated and scaffolded supports for students with disabilities and English Learners. By providing support and establishing a culture of data-driven instruction, campuses will develop a systemic approach to lesson planning that will focus on rigor and differentiation of instruction to meet the needs of all student populations. In addition, we will build strong school leadership by providing ongoing coaching on conducting observations and providing meaningful timely feedback to our teachers. Our district has opted to select Pathway 2-External Vetted Improvement Program that will provide high-quality contracted services aligned with foundational essential actions within the Effective Schools Framework. Currently, Plan4learning, a web-based improvement plan application allows the district and campuses to develop their goals and performance objectives providing opportunities to define strategies, establish essential actions and measurable milestones. The essential action structures include: data-driven instruction, classroom rigor, planning and demonstration, and observation and feedback. These components addressed in the effective schools framework will identify gaps in implementation and sustainability to drive student academic success. Laredo ISD will be working closely with Cigarroa Middle to establish unique individualized performance measures that will be monitored and reported through the web-based improvement plan submission and address potential barriers. The campus will be provided operational flexibility and leveraged funding options that ensures a total support system that builds instructional and leadership capacity.

2. Describe how the LEA will monitor schools receiving the ESF-Focused Support Grant, including how the LEA will: (a) Monitor Targeted Improvement Plans upon submission and during implementation, and (b) Implement additional actions as needed to meet barriers and challenges, after the first year of the grant cycle.

If Cigarroa Middle is granted the funds, Laredo ISD will monitor the campus by continuously evaluating their campus web-based improvement plan upon submission and during the implementation period through scheduled progress monitoring. The district will assist in the development of calendars that outline specific action steps or activities to be completed during the school year. In addition, the school improvement team will develop rubrics with specific metrics when collecting artifacts to measure progress and fidelity of implementation of activities included in the web-based improvement plan. On-going monitoring will include: review of lesson plans, direct coaching activities, PLC meeting agendas and minutes, student performance reports, and calibration of walk through data and feedback. Program funding will be monitored to ensure adequate vetted improvement costs such as: instructional materials, professional development sessions, and other support costs are aligned to the intent and fidelity towards the implementation of the grant. After the first year of the grant cycle, Laredo ISD will evaluate the web-based improvement plans using the developed rubric to identify areas of non-improvement. The District School Improvement Team will meet with campus leadership teams to assist in conducting a self assessment and developing a redesigned plan that focuses on activities that address areas of need identified and establish measurable outcomes for the upcoming year. Laredo ISD will modify instructional practices as needed to ensure full and effective implementation of the web-based improvement plans accordingly. Laredo ISD will ensure that campus-wide integrated data systems will facilitate communication and support intervention strategies focused to increase engagement and academic improvement. Simultaneously, Laredo ISD will provide significant levels of empowerment to the campus in deciding the daily operations and the implementation of success-driven research-based initiatives following the Effective Schools Framework.

The proposed budget will be expended on supporting program strategies directly aligned to essential actions identified in the web-based improvement plans. The budgeted program costs will be reflective of campus needs identified in the needs assessment. The goal is to assist our campus leaders in establishing and using consistent protocols and processes to improve the planning and execution of rigorous instruction. We also want to provide professional development and coaching sessions on using and modeling best practices when conducting observations and providing feedback. Additionally, the proposed budget will be expended on supporting the improvement and campus operational flexibility based on need, planning of anticipated risks and necessary adjustments over the course of the program funding period that will be evaluated consistently. The budgeted program funds will supplement and not supplant state mandates, rules or activities previously conducted or funded through other local or state funds. The budget is reflective of all necessary funding needed to ensure each eligible campus has sufficient resources to ensure program completion, success and growth. The budget will be evaluated and adjusted on an as need basis depending on program progress, success, and program outcomes to strengthen campus systems, build campus staff capacity, improve school outcomes and continue implementation and support of the campus improvement efforts. Program funding will be monitored to ensure adequate vetted improvement program costs, technical assistance, instructional materials, professional development programs, program monitoring, extra-duty and other support costs that are focused on program fidelity and measurable outcomes identified in each web-based improvement plan. Laredo ISD currently expends Title I, Part A, Title II, and other federal, state, and local resources to support our school improvement programs and build capacity of teachers and campus and district leaders in areas such as content knowledge, instructional practices, differentiation of instruction, classroom rigor and technology integration. In addition, Title II funds are used to provide additional teachers to reduce class size along with Title IV funds to implement the positive behavior intervention system at all our schools. Lastly, these additional funds will allow us to continue to address focus areas and ensure that all student groups meet the performance targets and academic growth expected in state and federal accountability.

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2. Describe how the LEA will ensure campus leaders have direct access to grant funding to ensure alignment to the Targeted Improvement Plan.

Laredo ISD will align federal, state, and local resources necessary to carry out program objectives identified in our comprehensive needs assessment/web-based improvement plans. In addition to the Title | ESF Support Grant, Laredo ISD will leverage additional funding from other local, state and federal resources to close program gaps and ensure adequate funding to carry out program activities supporting the program intent. Other funding sources will be used to allow for teacher supplemental planning time, extended learning time for our students through prescriptive small group instruction and instructional materials to ensure high quality instruction for our students. The program funding will enhance the campuses operational flexibility and ability to focus on rigorous learning experiences through objective driven daily lessons, routines, assessments, building leadership capacity, creating stronger educator supports, creating a positive school culture and providing a pathway to better planning and leadership. These additional funds will allow us to continue to address focus areas and ensure that all student groups meet the performance targets and academic growth expected in state and federal accountability. The goal is to provide the necessary resources to ensure continuous improvement and exit the identification of a Targeted Support Campus.
