Services for Families	The school will develop or purchase a case management system to list available serivces, provide referrals, and track progress, The school will provide training to staff and parents to inform them of service available and hire a staff person to oversee this service.
Training for Staff	The school will provide extensive training to ALL staff members regarding the program, services available, & need for a positive school environment. Training will include lessons regarding the impact of a positive school environment on academic acheivement, attendance, student, family, & staff satisfaction
