Trauma-Informed Practices: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 85% of educators and staff at identified campuses will receive Mental Health First Aid training through Region 10 ESC leading to a reduction in discipline referrals (the trauma-informed practices will be delivered to all levels).

Telehealth (Medical): By the end of the 2024-2025 academic year, there will be a 25% increase in the number of campuses that have access to school health services through telehealth. All campus levels will be considered. Physical Safety: To improve school culture and reduce incidents of student fights, insubordination, and cyberbullying. By end of the 2024-2025 school year, all schools participating in the Physical Cellphone program will reduce discipline referrals related to cell phones by 7%. The selected schools will include middle and high school.
