Leadership & Instructional Foundations for Texas (LIFT)



Grant Overview

(LIFT merges programs formerly known as Strong Foundations SF, Texas Instructional Leadership TIL, and Texas Lesson Study TXLS)

The LIFT grant provides a three-year program to strengthen instructional systems across school systems and campuses, building instructional capacity around Bluebonnet, in the following key areas:

- Curriculum Adoption Support: Needs assessment of current instructional materials to guide Bluebonnet curriculum adoption (Planning Phase).
- Training & Skill-Building: Professional development to build staff understanding of the curriculum, strengthen skills, and set up schoolwide systems (Planning Phase).
- Observation and Feedback Cycle Development: Support to launch and refine observation and feedback systems that improve instructional quality (Planning and Implementation Phase).
- Implementation Training: Ongoing training to ensure effective use of Bluebonnet curriculum (Implementation Phase).
- Instructional Leadership Coaching: Coaching and feedback for leaders to strengthen instructional leadership and schoolwide routines (Implementation Phase).

Evaluation Criteria

Approved Providers (APs) have been vetted for their ability to provide professional development to school system leaders, campus leaders, and teachers in the following areas:

- Establishing a clear school system-wide vision for math and RLA instruction
- Supporting the adoption and roll-out of instructional materials for both RLA and math
- Establishing school-wide culture routines as well as teacher observation and feedback systems
- Establishing instructional materials internalization and student work analysis protocols and meeting structures
- Supporting school system-wide communication and change management
- Developing school system leader and campus leader capacity to monitor data and trends and respond to manage towards strong student outcomes
- Develop school system ownership and sustainability of these systems over the course of the three years

Additional Information

School systems are required to use a minimum of **70%** of grant funds to contract with a single LIFT Approved Provider to support grant activities and may use up to **30%** of grant funds for other allowable expenses.

If also awarded a LIFT SI A grant, the school system must select the same Approved Provider for both LIFT and the SI A grants.

LIFT Add-On: School Improvement Accelerator (LIFT SI A)



Grant Overview

The LIFT Add on: School Improvement PLC Support grant supports Title I, School Improvement LIFT campuses to enhance implementation support for campuses participating in the Leadership and Instructional Foundations for Texas (LIFT) program, in the following key areas:

- Additional Funding & Support: Extra funding and targeted assistance for Title I campuses in school improvement (CSI, TSI, ATSI).
- Enhanced PLC Support: Expanded PLC facilitation, coaching, and observation feedback to strengthen collaboration.
- Implementation Monitoring: Ongoing monitoring of instructional material implementation to ensure fidelity.

Evaluation Criteria

Approved Providers (APs) have been vetted for their ability to provide professional development to school system leaders, campus leaders, and teachers in the following areas:

- Establishing a clear school system-wide vision for math and RLA instruction
- Supporting the adoption and roll-out of instructional materials for both RLA and math
- Establishing school-wide culture routines as well as teacher observation and feedback systems
- Establishing instructional materials internalization and student work analysis protocols and meeting structures
- Supporting school system-wide communication and change management
- Developing school system leader and campus leader capacity to monitor data and trends and respond to manage towards strong student outcomes
- Develop school system ownership and sustainability of these systems over the course of the three years

Additional Information

School systems are required to use:

- **50%** of grant funds to contract with a single Approved Provider per instructional material from the LASO Cycle 5 Approved Provider List to support grant activities
- **50%** of grant funds for additional support from the Approved Provider and/or salaries, partial salaries, or stipends for instructional coaches or other positions directly supporting PLC facilitation and implementation of the instructional materials

The school system must select the same Approved Provider for both LIFT and the LIFT SI PLC Support grant.

School Improvement Curriculum and Instruction Support Grant (SI CISG)



Grant Overview

The School Improvement Curriculum and Instruction Support Grant (SI CISG) supports Title 1 school improvement and CSI, TSI, ATSI Designated campuses on strengthening curriculum and instruction by implementing non-Bluebonnet, high-quality instructional materials (HQIM), in the following key areas:

- SBOE HQIM Support: Technical assistance for adopting a State Board of Education (SBOE)-approved high-quality instructional material (HQIM) in eligible grade levels.
- Curriculum & Instruction Support: Technical assistance to strengthen curriculum and instruction in grade levels where an SBOE-approved HQIM list does not exist.

Evaluation Criteria

Approved Providers (APs) have been vetted for their ability to provide professional development to school system leaders, campus leaders, and teachers in the following areas:

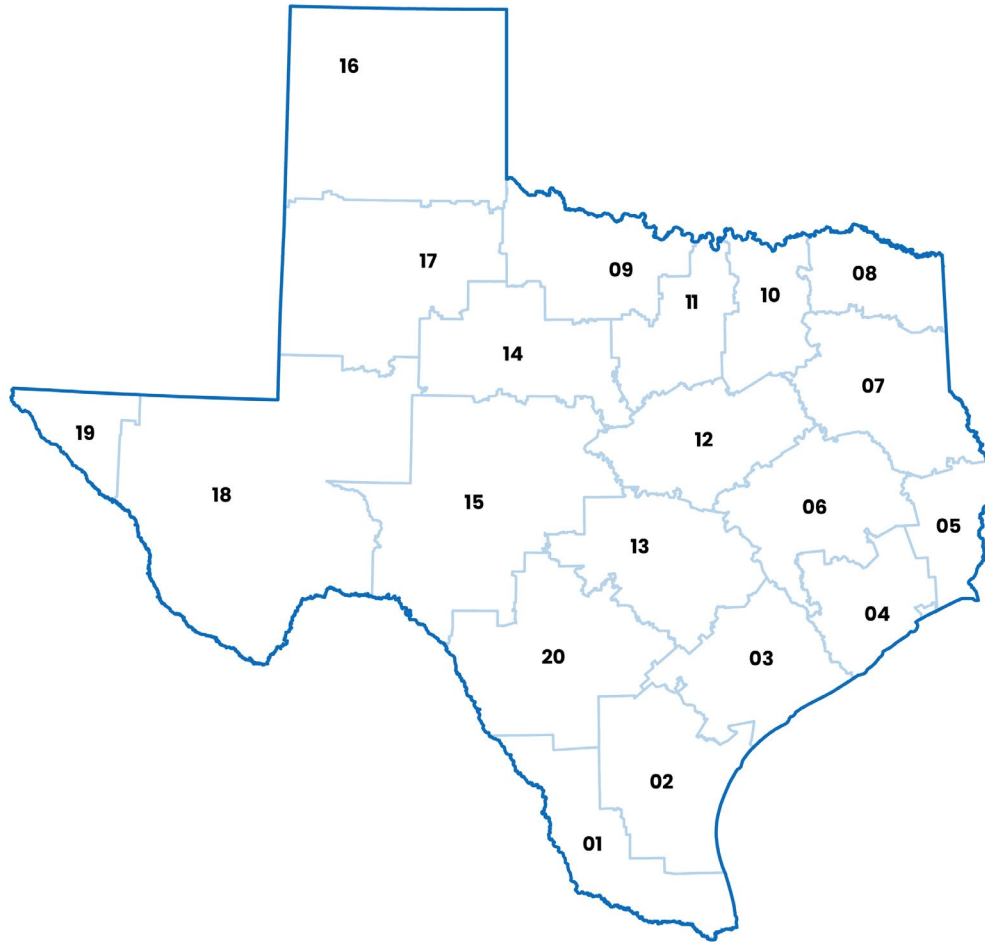

Grant Overview

School Actions are whole-school strategies used to increase access to high-quality schools, meet community needs, and address chronic underperformance. By providing grant funds and technical assistance to support school actions for individual campuses, TEA also supports school systems to take strategic actions that both improve schools and provide parents and families with the schools and programs they want, need, and deserve. In Cycle 10 (LASO 4), the School Action Fund program supports the following bold school actions:

The Preparing and Retaining Educators through Partnership (PREP) Program Allotment aims to strengthen the quality of teacher recruitment, preparation, and mentorship, leading to increased educator effectiveness and retention. The Preparing and Retaining Educators Through Partnership (PREP) Mentorship Program provides school systems interested in implementing high-quality new teacher mentorship programs with funding to:

- Provide, at minimum, a \$1,000 stipend to the mentor teacher (per beginning teacher),
- Train all required school system mentorship staff via the Texas Mentorship Training
- Provide release time for mentor teacher and beginning teacher mentoring activities.

Through PREP Mentorship Program, school systems will engage in the Texas Mentorship Training via an approved Texas Mentorship Training provider, who provides high-quality, research-based training to mentor teachers and any appropriate school system and campus employees who work with or supervise classroom teachers who have less than two years of teaching experience. 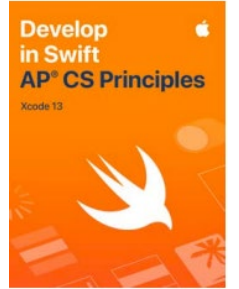

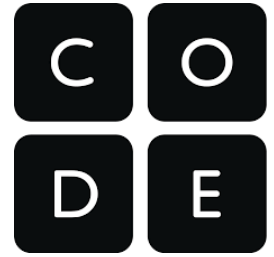

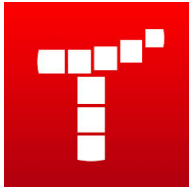

The grant provides:

Approved Providers (APs) will be selected to participate in this particular program based on the following criteria:

- Evidence indicating that the product is effective at improving student learning outcomes in math
- TEKS-aligned products grounded in Research-Based Instructional Strategies (RBIS), designed to support math achievement in both English and Spanish
- Ability to provide training, onboarding, personalized implementation support, and technical assistance
- Ability to provide real-time instructional mastery dashboards, student progress data, and reports
- Products that support diverse learners, include accessibility features, and accommodate students with disabilities

The Virtual and Hybrid Program Accelerator (VHPA) supports the development and refinement of high-quality virtual and hybrid programs, in the following key areas:

- Technical Assistance: Customized coaching to design, launch, and improve high-quality virtual or hybrid programs.
- Program Design: Guidance on creating strong student learning experiences, staffing models, and operational systems.
- Academic Strategy: Support for developing rigorous curriculum and personalized learning for virtual/hybrid settings.
- Teacher Development: Training on effective virtual instruction and technology integration.

Evaluation Criteria

Provider will be selected based on the following criteria:

1. Experience with supporting school systems in launching virtual and hybrid programs or campuses
2. Capacity of project leads to complete required support activities and deliverables for the program
3. Track record of success in terms of operational and academic outcomes in other initiatives similar to VHPA

VHPA is currently procuring Technical Assistance Providers, tentatively scheduled to announce in March 2027. School systems will be partnered with a provider through the VHPA program.
