
## Snapshot: TEA Charter School Program Grantees Cohorts 1 & 2

In 2020, the Texas Education Agency (TEA) was awarded a five-year, \$100 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education under the Expanding Opportunity Through Quality Charter Schools Program (CSP). With this grant, TEA offers competitive subgrants to provide financial assistance for the planning, program design, and initial implementation of charter schools that support the growth of high-quality charter schools in Texas, especially those focused on improving academic outcomes for educationally disadvantaged students. These subgrants assist eligible applicants in opening and preparing for the operation of newly authorized charter schools and replicated high-quality schools. The information in this datasheet provides a picture of the second cohort of grantees in the first year of their grant period and an update on the first cohort of grantees in the second year of the grant period.\* Note that percentages displayed are an average across campuses. This approach was adopted to uphold the integrity of school-level treatment within the analysis. Averaging student demographics across campuses allows for a more nuanced understanding of the overall student body composition within each school, thereby ensuring that variations across individual campuses are appropriately reflected.



- # "Nearby" campuses are those among the 29 closest regular instructional, non-charter campuses to each designated CSP campus and have either an exact or partial grade-span match. A total of 145 nearby campuses were identified, some of which are nearby more than one CSP campus. Nearby distance ranges from 0.12 to 27.89 miles with an average of 4.75 miles.

# Cohort 2 Demographics and Baseline Indicators (Prior Year 2021–22) of CSP and Nearby Campuses









#### Cohort 2 Other Demographics 2022–23<sup>1</sup>




#### Cohort 2 Prior Year STAAR Performance<sup>2</sup>





#### Cohort 1 Other Demographics in 2022–23<sup>1</sup>






Cohort I Attrition Rate 2021–22 6,\*\*\*




Statewide Attrition Rate 2021–226
