The plan will serve as support for the improvement of instructional and learning processes for campus administrators, school counselors, teachers and students. Plan will be monitored quarterly with appropriate adjustments as needed by the results of each quarter.

Dealing with students socio-emotional needs is crucial to them being in a state of mind conducive to learning. Capturing Kids Hearts will be used as a catalyst to meet students socio-emotional needs and PBIS will be used as the framework. Technology will be utilized to engage students in the core content areas while ensuring differentiated and small group instruction, Costa's Academic Vocabulary and Marzano's High Yield Strategies are an on-going part of instruction.

Instructional support for students through a Summer Bridge Program emphasizing literacy and math for students in Grade 5 from elementary feeder schools as they transition to Grade 6. An enrichment program for Grades 6 and 7 would also be occurring in the summer. During the school year, block scheduling will be used in Grades 7 and 8 for identified at-risk students in the areas of math and reading. A class for the sixty-two ELL students will be created and a parent liaison will support students by focusing on attendance problems.
