At Least 80% of CPE activities shall be directly related to the certificate(s) being renewed and focus in the standards required for the initial issuance of the certificate(s), including:

- content and area knowledge and skills;
- professional ethics and standards of conduct;
- professional development, which should encompass topics such as the following:
  - o district and campus priorities and objectives;
  - o child development, including research on how children learn;
  - o classroom management;
  - o applicable federal and state laws;
  - o diversity and special needs of student populations;
  - o increasing and maintaining parental involvement;
  - o integration of technology into educational practices;
  - o insuring that students read on or above grade level;
  - o diagnosing and removing obstacles to student achievement; and
  - o instructional practices.

An individual who holds a classroom teacher certificate that is renewed on or after June 1, 2019, must complete CPE activities directly related to each of the topics below.

Not more than 25% of the CPE activities for a classroom teacher shall include instruction in the following topics:

- collecting and analyzing information that will improve effectiveness in the classroom;
- recognizing early waring indicators that a student may be at risk of dropping out of school;
- digital learning, digital teaching, and integrating technology into classroom instruction;
- educating students with disabilities, including mental health disorders;
- educating students who are educationally disadvantaged;
- educating English language learners;
- educating students at risk of dropping out of school; and
- understanding appropriate relationships, boundaries, and communications between educator and students.

## Additional CPE requirements that may apply:

- educators are encouraged to identify CPE activities based on results of his/her annual appraisal
- educators who teach students with dyslexia must include training regarding new research and practices in educating students with dyslexia
- the following type of trainings may be counted toward certificate renewal:
  - o mental health and first aid training up to 12 hours
  - o training on the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED)
  - suicide prevention training
  - may include instruction regarding how grief and trauma affect student learning and behavior and how evidence-based, grief-informed, and traumainformed strategies support the academic success of students affected by grief and trauma

## **Texas Administrative Code -** Chapter 232.11 and 232.15 – CPE content & types of activities **Required number of CPE hours for teachers: 150 hours**

 may receive credit toward CPE requirements for education courses that use technology to increase the educator's digital literacy; and assist the educator in the use of digital technology in learning activities that improve teaching.

## **Types of Acceptable Continuing Professional Education Activities:**

Participating in institutes, workshops, seminars, conferences, interactive distance learning, video conferencing, online activities, and in -service or staff development activities given by an approved provider or sponsor.

Completing courses through an accredited institution of higher education – 1 semester credit hour equals 15 clock-hours.

Independent study in content area knowledge and skills related to the certificate(s) being renewed, not to exceed 20% of the required clock hours (up to 30 hours), which may include:

- relevant professional materials (e.g., books, journals, periodicals, video and audio tapes, computer software, interactive distance learning, video conferencing, or online activities;
- developing curriculum; or
- authoring a published work.

Developing, teaching or presenting a CPE activity, not to exceed 10% of the required clock hours (up to 15 hours).

Providing professional guidance as a mentor to another educator, not to exceed 30% of the required clock hours (up to 45 hours).
