



Changing School Start Dates for 2020-2021

School Districts may start school prior to the fourth Monday in August (TEC Sec. 25.0811) through a District of Innovation plan or a Year-Round System designation. TEA has outlined the following options for districts interested in changing school start dates for the 2020-2021 school year.

District of Innovation (DOI) Plan:

Districts may change their start date by using the District of Innovation plan (TEC Chapter 12A) in the scenarios below.

Year-Round Designation:

Districts may move up the school start date with Year-Round System designation (TEC Sec. 25.084) in the scenarios below and must operate during a portion of, at a minimum, 11 to 12 months (per SAAH).

Is District Designated as Year Round?	Action Required	Estimated Timeline
Yes	1. Obtain board approval of calendar with new start date	Short
No	1. Obtain board approval for designation as Year-Round System 2. Obtain board approval of academic calendar with new start date 3. Notify TEA of intent to become Year-Round System	Medium

Note: Charter schools may change school start dates by submitting a copy of school calendar to the TEA Charter School Division prior to August.
