The ADSY Summer Program at Bartlett ISD would serve students who meet one or more of these criteria: --Students who do not require credit recovery ("summer school") but who have been identified for interventions and other supports

--Students with identified skill gaps

--English learners

--Students receiving Special Education/504 services

--Students seeking accelerated learning

--Students seeking additional Career and Technical Education (CTE) programming

Bartlett ISD would create an instructional platform (approach) that allows teachers to generate creative lessons and activities that specifically target student needs and are informed by learning standards. Instruction would be a blend of student independent work, online learning platforms, group projects, service-based learning, and other experiential activities that differ in scope and feel from the regular school year.

Operations would be coordinated by the Federal Programs Director, who is also the Director of Curriculum & Instruction. Operational planning and execution would include:

--Strategic plan, needs assessment, goals and objectives, curriculum and lesson supervision, observation and feedback procedures, improvement plan, evaluation platform, and reporting methods

--Staffing and personnel (recruit, train, retain, evaluate)

--Progress monitoring (students, staff, and funding efficacy)

--Continuous improvement plan

--Secondary program evaluation (external, stakeholder feedback, superintendent feedback)

3. ADSY Program Design: Describe any prior experience with summer learning programs, extended learning time, or large change management initiatives within the district and include any relevant takeaways from implementing those programs that will be helpful in the implementation of ADSY.

Bartlett ISD has implemented 21st Century Learning funding for over 15 years; these funds have been used in part to build summer programming for students that allows educators to provide targeted academic support and enrichment activities. Bartlett ISD has also offered traditional "summer school" to students in need of credit recovery. Historically, the majority of the 21st Century program attendees were students in pre-Kindergarten through Grade 5, and those attending "summer school" were secondary students. However, the combination of these activities has not yielded the growth current leadership envisions for its students. Additionally, neither of these programs has been able to address high-performing students who wish to accelerate their learning path. Lastly, neither program has provided a cohesive, enriching academic experience for all students in all grades.

Use of ADSY funds in Bartlett ISD would allow the district to transform the entire summer program into a multi-approach solution for nearly all students, providing flexibility and breadth in the types of summer learning the district could offer for every grade, pre-Kindergarten through recent graduates. The ADSY program as envisioned would offer a completely different learning experience for participating students, from what is offered during the regular school year.

Successful components from the 21st Century program and "summer school" that would continue through the ADSY Summer program include (but are not limited to):

--Retention of current certified staff to lead summer learning activities

--Full-time staffing in school library

--Enrollment open to all students

- --Access to technology and scientific equipment and materials
- --Access to kitchens and agricultural materials

All stakeholders are committed to the ADSY program because the school is the heart of the community in Bartlett. Many community members are alumnae of the school and have elected to remain in the area in order to send their own children to BISD. The school is host to a number of community and family events, including holiday meals, a Veteran's Day ceremony and meal, athletic pep rallies, athletic events, UIL events, and more - and families are always invited to join in these events. The Board of Trustees is united in seeking every opportunity for students to achieve and grow, and have made agile and innovative decisions to support the superintendent and other campus leaders in providing these opportunities to all BISD students. (Evidence: board meeting minutes) Teachers, too, are committed to the community, the school, and the students: over ten teachers currently provide services to students during 21st Century programming, many teachers are BISD alumnae, most secondary teachers are also class sponsors, etc. (Evidence: personnel records) The entire community is united in their support of students, their hope for student achievement, and their belief that all students will succeed. The ADSY program would help further those aims to help BISD improve student experiences and outcomes.

5. Commitment and Intent from Leadership: What components of the Planning and Execution requirements does the district believe will be most helpful in leading to a successful program and why?

4.1 Project Manager and 4.2 Steering Committee: the foundation of any successful program is to have effective, engaged, knowledgeable, committed leadership. Bartlett ISD feels the current leadership team and its choice of project manager capture the necessary experience and passion required to build and maintain a strong summer program.

4.3 Kickoff and Training and 4.4 Strategic Planning and Review: implementing a program with fidelity requires introduction and induction to that program, and a documented and published plan.

While the remainder of the planning components are indeed important, leadership feels these first four are the most important. Without detailed and well-thoughts plans and effective leadership, program execution will falter even with strong technical support.

Problem: student growth and outcomes are not rising at a rate appropriate to student potential. Root Cause: student learning gaps persist year over year

ADSY helps solve this root cause by providing structured, planned, strategic learning opportunities that are different from the regular school year and spread over a longer time. This allows the district target specific gaps across grade and subject levels, supplement extended/accelerated learning, prevent "summer slide," and help students develop strong habits of thinking to build a foundation of success over multiple years of learning.

The person identified as the ADSY Project Manager is the current Director of Federal Programs and Curriculum & Instruction. Her experience in implementing the 21st Century Learning program, developing curriculum and providing instructional support, managing and providing technical assistance for grants implementation, consulting district leaders in school improvement, and her connection to and knowledge of Bartlett make her the best candidate for this position. She has experience in project management and a wide network of peers across the state, which strengthens coordination of the program and collaboration in the cohort.
