### **Summary of Program**

1. Describe how the LEA will support campus(es) in carrying out school support and improvement activities, including how the LEA will develop a web-based improvement plan for the eligible campuses selected for this grant.

Monte Alto ISD continues to support all campuses in the district in all ways including but not limited to academic, social, emotional, extra activities, parental and any other opportunities or other function that is needed by the campuses. Even though the district does completely support all campuses in their endeavors, the two campuses with the most academic need at this time are the middle school campus and the high school campus. Therefore, the intention of this grant is to bring extra assistance to those two campuses in order to bring them to where they should be academically. The district must provide extra support and continue to support their endeavors in every way possible.

The district will support the campuses by assisting in school support and activities by including the following activities:

Allowing the flexibility of operation of the campuses by assuring that resources are made available to these campuses.

Reviewing the **practices and processes use**d at each campus and assure that the critical needs of each campus are identified and strategically assist in accomplishing what is needed for the procesesses and practices to be carried out with fidelity.

Review barriers that might hinder the campus from carrying out the acitvities and processes needed and eliminate the barriers so that improvement can take place and give the staff the latitude that they need to carry out the needed functions and assure that staff is responsive to the school leadership by providing any type of assistance that may be needed to the staff.

Utilize internal and external human capital such as resources that are necessary to meet all needs for a successful and safe learning environment for all partieies involved.

Systemic protocols need to be in place and these will be prioritized through teaching and learning processes and training.

The district will communicate to the campuses a very clear and focused vision and mission for continued improvement that is aligned to the effective school framework and will work collaboratively with the efforts for student success.

The district will offer support by leading the needs as outlined in the Targeted Improvement Plan of the campuses.

The district will convene a diverse, representative team that will have definite assigned roles and responsibilities. This will include representatives of the campus staff as well as leadership and other stakeholders.

Pertinent and targeted training will be made avaiable to assist the campuses in the identified prioritizedareas through teaching and learning processes of instruction. The district will communicate to the campuses a very clear and focused vision and mission for continued improvement that is aligned to the effective school framework and will work collaborative with the efforts for student success. The district will offer support by leading the needs as outlined in the Targeted Improvement Plan of the campuses and to assure that the Effective Schools Framework is carried out with fidelity.

2. Describe how the LEA will monitor schools receiving the ESF-Focused Support Grant, including how the LEA will: (a) Monitor a web-based improvement plans upon submission and during implementation, and (b) Implement additional action following unsuccessful implementation of such plan after the first year of the grant cycle.

The district will continuously monitor schools schools in the following ways in otder to ensure compliance with the web based improvement plan:

- 1. Quarterly review of the plan to have a formative review of the plan
- 2. The principal will be provided the supervision and coaching needed for success of the plan
- 3. Training and professional development will be provided continuously throughout the enitre process of the development of the plan
  - 4. There will be continuous campus visits to observe the participation of all staff in implementing of the plan.
  - 5. Coaching for the principal and teachers will be provided on an as needed basis.
- 6. Feedback will be be provided in written as well as post conference reviews and the progress of the plan (calendars, agendas, written feedback, minutes)
  - 7. Artifacts and data will be reviwed as evidence that the plan is being followed and monitored
- 8. Compliance will be measured by reviewing articifacts such as benchmarks, grades, discipline, teacher records or anecdotes or through meetings with teachers
  - 9. Direct teaching will be monitored and modeled if necessary
  - 10. There will be a root cause analysis completed to assist in understanding the factors in contributing to lack of academic success.

If a campus is **not experiencing success in th**e implementation of the plan in the first year of the grant cycle the district will review all sources of data, develop a strategic of action for corrective implementation and monitor the implementation of a corrective action plan and project strategies.

It will be up to the district to continuously monitor the progress of each campus and adjust strategies as required and make the approriate adjustments if targets and goals are not being met at either campus.

# Goals, Objectives, and Strategies, Performance and Evaluation

1. Describe how the LEA will modify, as appropriate, practices and policies to provide operational flexibility to the awarded campus, that enables full and effective implementation of the Effective Schools Framework Essential Actions aligned webbased Improvement Plan.

The district will modify, as appropriate and as needed, the different practices and policies that are in place in order to provide the flexibility of the operations at the campuses level that is awarded the grant. This will enable the campuses to be assured of having full and effective implementation of the Effective Schools Framework Essential Actions that are aligned with the web based implmenentation Plan.

The campuses will be able to prioritize the changes at the campusees that are not effective practices and processes and are hindering substantial academic student success as recorded by state assessments.

Explicit and rigorous standards with be put in place so that it becomes the common method of practice for teaching and learning.

The campus leadership team at each campus will be well versed in curriculum alignment in order to take the campus to a higher standard of learning and teaching. This will in turn be brought to the teaching levels so that teachers truly understand the curriculum and the rigor that must be used to assure that students are way beyone success that is to the highest level.

The district will remove barriers that keep the campus from accomplishing any of the success standards needed. This must occur so that there is effectiveness at each campus.

The campuses with the guidance of the district will identify and use the tools and metrics for evaluatinvg the effective of the web-based improvement plan.

The goals and **objectives of this plan will co**nstantly be monitored to ensure that they are met in a timely manner. Time is of the essence as st**udents cannot waste a day** without having a sound standard of teaching and learning environment. All stakeholders will be involved through interaction to plan and to implement the improvement initiatives that will be outlined in the goals and objectives.

The district will **reach out to all stakeholde**rs through meetings, surveys, campus visits, parent meetings and parent feedback, and include students in understanding the goals and objectives that are to be accomplished.

Human resources as well as any other resources such as monetary and flexible time resources to accomplish the effective of the improvement at each campus.

The campuses will be given wide latitude to address and modify the support areas needed including personnel changes or added personnel if needed.

The district will be the supporting partner in all endeavors of the campus meeting standard on all academic fronts. The value and effectiveness of the goals and objectives will be evaluated on a constant basis by the district along with the campuses. The district will take the lead in the educational process at each campus so that each milestone is monitored for progress and that interventions are taking place for all student groups. The district will make sure that campus leadership in well versed in planning and implementing PLCs and then in turn, teachers will understand the concept of the PLC and the advantages of carrying out an efficient and effective PLC. The district will constantly monitor classrooms to assure that the students are receiving the types of instruction necessary to lead to student success. The district will set measurable and reasonable goals for each campus and will assist them in reaching these goals.

### **Budget Narrative**

1. Describe how the proposed budget will meet the needs and goals of the program, including for staffing, supplies and materials, contracts, travel, etc. If applicable, include a high-level snapshot of funds currently allocated to similar programs. Include a short narrative describing how adjustments will be made in the future to meet needs.

The budget that is being submitted is based on the needs of each campus. The proposed budget was collectively and collaboratively developed by the instructional leaders at the district and campus levels. The budget is specific to meet the prioritized needs of the students and staff that were identified during a comprehensive needs assessment process for the district and specifically at each of the two campuses that are failing to meet academic standards. In order to achieve the goals necessary for success and the increase the effectiveness of each program, the district will coordinate these supplemental funds with federal, state and local funds to provide appropriate programs, instruction and services to all studetns while maximizing the impact of the available resources of the district.

The most substantial expenditure for the proposed budget will be within the 6200 object code for contracted services. This will be for the work that will be provided with the district's strategic partnership with E3 Alliance RAISE -up Texas towards improvement in the focus areas of leadership, culture and effective instruction in guiding the campuses to realize their academic success for students. District leaders, principals, campus leaders and instructional staff will partner with E3 Alliance RAISE up Texas facilitators, in activities such as but not limited to coaching sessions, professional learning, transformative work, connecting to the Effective Schools Framework, enhancing strategic plans, instructional models, the utilization of data to lead in the utilization of data that shows best practices for success, the use of a multi-tiered system of support for student attendance, student engagement, and leads to academic performance. They will provide personalized pathways for supporting the campus and district instructional staff by providing coaching, feedback from observations and evaluation and provide feedback which will all lead to continuous improvement.

To build capacity and be able to provide for a deeper implementation and improvement, personnel costs (6100) will be budgeted for teacher leaders be compensated for supplementary stipends and for teachers to be provided extra duty pay s as possibly Lead Teachers or Master teachers and for additional days or hours for additional training and professional development. There will also be a stipend for the supervision of the grant in the form of a small stipend to assist in assuring that logistical matters are carried out throughout the grant cycle. This person will answer to the principal and district leaders and will supervise all aspects of the grant and monitor the grant program.

The two year gant will allow the district to plan for budgeting for the awarded schools and other district schools to receive similar supports and provide stipends to receive similar supports for leading the work on their campuses. The district's goal with this grant is to improve the selected campuses but also ensure consistency across all of the campuses for continuous improvement and leadership development. The budget also includes substitue costs to cover classroom instruction as teachers attend profession learning opportunities with E3 Alliance RAISEup Texas.

Supplies/materials (6300) will include instructional materials, instructional manipulatives, technology as well as hardware and software, supplemental materials, books for professional development, tudent texts, and supplies to enhance culture and climate. Travel costs (6400) will be at a minimum but will be bugeted for attendance to certain training and possiblly consultant training. Under 6400, allowable educational field trips can be taken by students.

2. Describe how the LEA will align other Federal, State, and local resources to carry out the activities supported with funds received under this grant.

The district will align other Federal, State and local resources to carry out the activities that are supported from the funding received from this grant. The district will use the new funding to supplement what is received from other sources in order to provide and enhance the instructional needs of the campuses while maintaining all campuses within the district to the high standards expected by the district.

All funding as proposed in the application will be used to provide a comprehensive instructional program. Many of the costs of the district are provided by federal, state and local funding. The funding that is currently in place supports the major initiatives of the district and will continue to do so. No funding from this grant will be used in place of what is presently allocated at this time. The district will use the new grant money to assist students, teachers and leaders to make each program and service more resourcesful and helpful to the campuses. The district uses every resource that is presently available to provide the highest level of academic support and safety for all. There will be intentional efforts to maximize all funding streams to support all programs in the district.

All activities proposed will be coordinated across multiple fnding sources to ensure supplementing of services and not supplanting any portion of the new funding. This new source of funding assists the campuses in alleviating any barriers that may exist because of a lack of funding. The district federal programs' director will assure that all grant funding from the ESF Target Support grant is carried out as intended by law and that the district will comply with the funding by assuring that allowable activities and use of funds for this grant are as presented in program guidelines.
