Now, all campus principals attend focus meetings, and this time has evolved into a professional learning community. During focus meetings, administrators are taught how to dig deeper into data and deepen their understanding of instructional practices. While we have started laying the groundwork, we are excited to gain invaluable support in the ESF grant. District leadership will consult with principals to identify areas that may need to be adjusted based on the recommendations of TIL consultants. Focus meetings will be aligned with the practices of the ESF to provide another layer of support for administrators.

Region 10 will bring other recipients of the grant together for professional learning. This will create and foster a community of campus lead learners for collegial support. The grant funds will enable this to happen.

Additionally, grant funds will be used to provide release time for campus teacher leaders to engage in professional learning and work with the R10 consultant, and provide stipends for teachers to attend professional learning during non-duty times. This is a barrier that funding will help overcome. If additional professional learning needs are identified, grant funds will be used to bring in additional expertise.
