

METHODOLOGY FOR IDENTIFYING CAMPUSES ON THE 2022–23 PEG LIST

The Public Education Grant (PEG) program criteria require campuses that receive an *F* rating in both the Student Achievement and the School Progress domains in 2021 accountability be included on the 2022–23 PEG List. However, because all campuses received a label of *Not Rated: Declared State of Disaster* in 2020 and 2021, 2019 ratings are used to determine the 2022–23 PEG List. The following campuses are excluded from PEG identification:

- Alternative education campuses that are rated under alternative education accountability procedures/provisions
- Campuses identified as alternative instructional
- Disciplinary Alternative Education Programs (DAEPs)
- Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Programs (JJAEPs)
- Open-enrollment charter schools
- Campuses with fewer than five students administered STAAR
- Paired campuses

The PEG List is organized alphabetically by district name then campus name.
