The mission of this project is to prepare our campuses to meet state online testing requirements by school year 2022–2023. The district needs to upgrade the access point equipment at two of our campuses in order to increase speeds to our student's devices. By upgrading these access points the increased end user bandwidth availability will allow the district to achieve the requirements for 100% online testing.

The goal of the project is to prepare our campuses to meet state online testing requirements by school year 2022–2023. The minimum recommended bandwidth for online testing is 500 Kbps (kilobits per second) per concurrent tester. The district needs to upgrade the access point equipment at two of our campuses in order to increase speeds to our student's devices. Upgrading these access points will allow for our internet access to avoid bottleneck going through one central controller district wide. This will in turn increase bandwidth availability at each campus.

## **Performance and Evaluation Measures**

We used the Cambium Network Diagnostics tool to evaluate and report campus eligibility for the funds. This tool allows us to predict the ability of student connectivity during online state testing sessions. Students have increased success if they are not having to worry or stress if the test connects properly or kicks them out numerous times. In the previous E-Rate funding year we upgraded the High School campus' access points and saw a significant increase in speed at that campus using this diagnostic tool.
