# Discussion of Educator Preparation Advisory Committee (EPAC)

### **DISCUSSION**

**SUMMARY:** This item provides the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) the opportunity to discuss the membership and process of forming the Educator Preparation Advisory Committee.

**STATUTORY AUTHORITY:** The statutory authority for the appointment of advisory committee members is Texas Education Code, §21.040(1).

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND JUSTIFICATION:** The SBEC is statutorily authorized to approve members of advisory committees. The Educator Preparation Advisory Committee (EPAC) meets to provide input on issues related to educator preparation programs (EPPs) in Texas.

### **Educator Preparation Advisory Committee**

The EPAC was initially approved at the March 2006 SBEC meeting and is codified in the SBEC Board Operating Policies and Procedures (BOPP), as the only standing advisory committee to the Board. The BOPP specifies the following:

Educator Preparation Advisory Committee. The purpose of this committee is to advise
the agency and the Board on matters relating to the educator preparation programs in
Texas. The committee shall reflect the proportionate representation of the various types
of programs that have been approved by the Board and reflect the diverse population of
Texas.

Past EPAC memberships have included professional organizations, school district representatives, teachers, and counselors to provide various perspectives on policies relating to educator preparation. At the December 2017 SBEC meeting, the Board was provided with a recommendation to solely appoint educator preparation program representatives to EPAC, citing the difficulty of school-based members to consistently participate in committee meetings. Since that time, the membership of the EPAC has been comprised solely of EPP representatives.

Given the broad impact of the content reviewed by this committee and the fact that this is the only standing advisory committee specified in the Board Operating Policies and Procedures, TEA staff would like to explore updating the number of members, the roles represented, and the process through which membership is determined. Staff recommends seeking representatives of organizations that represent educator preparation stakeholders to serve as EPAC members. A committee constituted along these lines could serve as foundation for specialized subcommittees of stakeholders and advise in implementation, along with discussion, proposal, and adoption of SBEC rulemaking. This would benefit the Board and staff by enlarging and diversifying the perspectives represented, enabling greater engagement by members and the

groups they represent, and facilitating committee members in serving as a liaison between their peers and the Board.

Staff recommends seeking a representative from each of the following professional organizations, to be identified by the organization:

- The Texas Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (TACTE)
- Texas Alternative Certification Association (TACA)
- Texas Consortium of Educator Preparation Programs for ESCs (TCEPPE)
- Education Deans of Independent Colleges and Universities of Texas (EDICUT)
- Texas Association of Community College Teacher Education Programs (TACCTEP)
- Associate and Assistant Deans and Directors of Texas (ADoT)
- The Texas Association of Certification Officers (TACO)
- Texas Coordinators for Teacher Certification Testing (TCTCT)
- Texas Directors of Field Experiences (TDFE)
- Texas Association of Teacher Educators (TxATE)
- Texas Association of School Administrators (TASA)
- Texas Association of School Boards (TASB)
- Texas Association of Secondary School Principals (TASSP)
- Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association (TEPSA)
- Texas Association of School Personnel Administrators (TASPA)
- Texas School Counseling Association (TSCA)
- Texas Classroom Teachers Association (TCTA)
- Texas State Teachers Association (TSTA)
- Association of Texas Professional Educations (ATPE)
- Texas American Federation of Teachers (Texas AFT)
- Teach Plus

In addition, TEA staff recommends 5 additional at-large members from EPPs, who would be sourced from nominations and approved for membership by the SBEC, and 5 additional at-large members who are not directly associated with an EPP, who would also be sourced from nominations and approved for membership by the SBEC. Of the 5 additional at-large members, at least 2 would be practicing teachers. Staff will seek diverse geographical representations as well as differing EPP types.

The current membership for EPAC was approved at the October 2018 meeting and can be found in Attachment II. As proposed, the new EPAC would consist of up to 31 members. This is an increase from the 26 members currently on the EPAC. The utilization of virtual meetings allows for easier coordination of larger groups, reducing the need for travel and increasing the possibility for intermediate meetings and the creation of targeted, issue-specific subcommittees.

Staff is seeking input from the Board to move forward in seeking a more representative membership for the EPAC. Staff will use a nomination process and bring proposed members for SBEC approval at the February 2021 meeting. Attachment III contains the draft components of the nomination form.

**PUBLIC AND STUDENT BENEFIT:** The public and student benefit anticipated as a result of the Educator Preparation Advisory Committee would be to strengthen educator preparation in the state to ensure that students have highly effective educators.

The educator preparation program background section will allow staff and the Board to understand the individual's experience with and perspective on high standards and continuous improvement for certification programs. Finally, the additional information section will allow staff and the Board to identify individuals with unique or underrepresented perspectives.
