Is our district (including charters and districts of innovation) required to provide an ESL program?



We have one or more identified English learners (ELs) district-wide.

No. Therefore, our district is not required to offer an ESL program.

Yes. Therefore, per TAC 89.1205 (c), our district is required to offer an ESL program, regardless of students' grade levels and primary language, and regardless of the number of such students.

If our district has 20 or more identified English learners (ELs) with the same language background and in the same grade level district-wide, a bilingual education program is required at the elementary grade levels per TAC 89.1205 (a). See the Bilingual Education Exception Scenario Chain.
