<p>School Action-Restart: District Managed</p>	<p>Restart a school by implementing the Accelerating Campus Excellence model or ACE like-model (including Accelerating Campus Excellence (ACE) turnaround plans). In order to restart a district-managed school, you need the following elements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A community or neighborhood whose students would benefit from a model with new leadership and teachers and a reinvigorated mission and vision • A commitment to identify a new academic model, new leadership, and new instructional staff • A commitment to follow the five core pillars of the ACE model: (1) strategic staffing, (2) instructional excellence, (3) extended day, (4) social and emotional learning, and (5) community and parent partnerships <p>For more information: https://www.centerforschoolactions.org/restart-a-school.html</p>
<p>School Action-Restart: Partner Managed</p>	<p>Restart a school with a Texas Partnership. School Action-New School: District Managed	<p>Create or phase in a new school at a new or existing facility managed by the district. In order to launch a district-managed new school, you need the following elements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A commitment to identify a new academic model, new leadership, and new instructional staff • A leader that has successfully completed a new school design program • All new schools must apply for and receive a new county district campus number (CDCN) • In order to be eligible to access the School Action Fund, enrollment policies must prioritize and guarantee enrollment for students attending or zoned to a 2019-2020 Comprehensive or Targeted Campus

School Action-New School: Partner Managed	<p>Create or phase in a new school at a new or existing facility managed by a partner organization. In order to launch a new school with a partnership, you need the following elements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A commitment to identify a new academic model, new leadership, new instructional staff, and the willingness to partner with a high-quality operator • An approval process that assesses the operator’s ability to launch a new school • All new schools must apply for and receive a new county district campus number (CDCN) • In order to be eligible to access the School Action Fund, enrollment policies must prioritize and guarantee enrollment for students attending or zoned to a 2019-2020 Comprehensive or Targeted Campus

School Action-Reassign	<p>Close the low-performing campus and reassign students to higher performing (A or B rated) campuses or new campuses. In order to reassign students, you need the following elements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identification of a low-performing campus • A community or neighborhood whose students have an alternative option they can transition to with relative ease • High-performing or new options for students at a district-managed or partner managed school and transportation to these campuses
